



Helpful Hints for picking your IB MYP 10th grade Science Course:

If you choose Chemistry or Chemistry Honors for your 10th grade science, you may take Biology SL or Biology HL during Junior and/or Senior years.

If you choose Biology or Biology Honors for your 10th grade science, you will may Chemistry SL or Chemistry HL during Junior and/or Senior years.



If you are planning to take SL Chemistry, Chemistry 1 is a prerequisite.
