Program: Lee Harris - The Walk



Lee Harris, a new member of the Mighty Rotary Club of West Sacramento, gave a wonderful talk about her experience completing “The Walk”. The Walk is a three week, 263 mile, religious pilgrimage through Portugal and Spain. The Pilgrimage makes it’s way through Portugal and into Spain where the adventure ends at the burial site of St. James at Santiago de Compostela

cathedral in Galicia , Spain. Lee recalled some of her favorite sections of the Pilgrimage as the walks through the forests and the beautiful sight of the lush vineyards. Other sites to remember included the Spanish men whom Lee eloquently described as “hot”. At night some would stay at hostiles, hotels that would charge as little as \$7 per night. Walkers that brave the journey are given a certificate upon completion and rewarded with the great memories built. During the holy week, approximately 120,000 people gather at the burial site in Galicia. Lees descriptions of the travels and experiences were well spoken and took the audience to a different place. 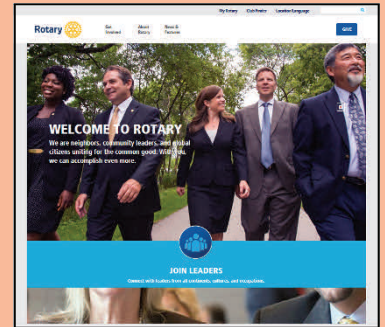

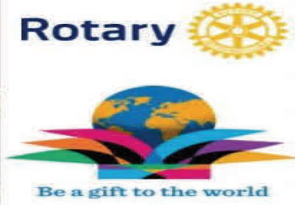
