FAQS

What are your COVID-19 policies and precautions?

In keeping with local guidelines, masks are not required at Powell Gardens. Visitors are encouraged to take personal safety precautions. Visit powellgardens.org/visit/plan-your-visit for more information.

Where do I catch the tram?

The tram stops between the Missouri Barn and Children's Garden and drops off in front of the Visitor Center. (Please note: The tram does not travel on the path through the Visitor Center landscape. The whole path is ADA compliant.)

A child was separated from the group! Where should I go for help?

Locate the nearest Powell Gardens staff member. Staff members will notify the whole team in order to implement safety measures quickly and find the missing child.

Can I take food and drinks on the outdoor path?

Absolutely! You're welcome and encouraged to enjoy your favorite festival treats outdoors. To keep our botanical garden healthy, please throw away all trash in designated trash cans.

What are the best spots to take photos?

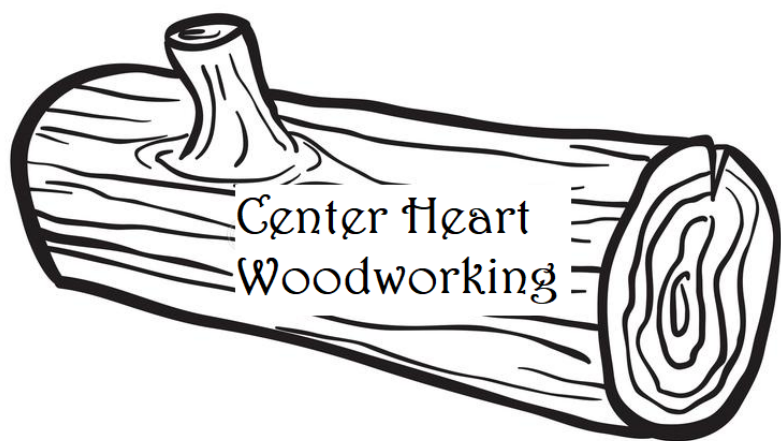
