Modernism, liberation and a new way of seeing

Lecture summary:

Modernism seeped slowly and belatedly into Australian art. The final lecture last year suggested that whereas in Europe the First World War actually galvanised a new generation of contemporary artists towards more radical vernaculars and a spirit of experimentation, in Australia a buffer of time and distance saw the period 1900-20 tend to rather extend the last phase of an impressionist-style descriptiveness. There was not even in Australia the kind of deep post-war disillusion that led to the emergence of Surrealism in France and England in the 1920s. However, modernism was certainly seeded in Sydney during 1913-19. We shall cherry-pick a few ideas from the European avant-garde of this period and consider them in parallel with the more conservative progress of modern Australian art, preparing us for the rest of this year's course.




4. Picasso, 1881-1973, *Les demoiselles d'Avignon*, 1907, oil on canvas. Museum of Modern Art, NY



16. Eric Wilson, 1911-46, Abstract-the kitchen stove, 1943, mixed media on plywood. AGNSW




