

Meeting World War 2 Veterans The Best Part of a Re-enactment By Heinz Thiel

Hopefully you will have noticed the World War 2 Veterans on the cover of this issue.



Ed Strelow served with the 6th Army 469th Anti-Aircraft unit in the Pacific Theater form 1943 to 1946. This was the second time I was lucky enough to video him talking about his experiences during WW2.





Frank A. Johnson (from Chicago) served with the 8th Air Force 454th Bomber Squadron as a B-26 Marauder Pilot. He flew 26 combat missions over France from 1942 to 1945.



Their stories are fascinating, riveting at times. At the time of this printing I have not yet released their video, but plan on doing so soon.







U.S. Navy Veteran Master Chief Robert Reeners was a coxswain on a Higgins boat at Utah Beach on D-Day. He never imagine that more than seven decades later, and at the age of 90, he would be back at the controls of a Higgins boat.

On a rainy Saturday (30 May 2015) Honor Flight volunteer David Gee drove Master Chief Robert's down from Oshkosh Wisconsin to Roberts Armory in Rochelle, Illinois.

I meet the Master Chief with video camera rolling inside the Armory where he was talking about Top-Secret missions leading up to the D-Day Invasion. The now 90 year old Chief was acting like he was 20 years old again reliving events that took place 70 years ago.

Master Chief Reeners admits World War 2 was Hell and he struggles with memory's that never go away. The anniversary of D-Day is only a few days away, the day he transported troops to shore (Utah Beach) on a Higgins Boat just like the one at Roberts Armory.

Master Chief Reeners explains he ate, slept, and lived on the boat. No luxury, everything about it was uncomfortable. It is just a boat with an engine and four-man crew. But the first words from the Master Chief as he came aboard the LCVP boat at Roberts Armory; "We kept the beer in the bilge."

On Saturday 30 May 2015 Master Chief Reeners explains he went back in time; "When Chuck kicked over the engine and I heard the familiar roar of that boat's diesel, I was back aboard 70 years ago."

As a coxswain Master Chief Reeners navigated the landing craft long enough to have traveled around the world in it.




Robert Reeners surprised Chuck Roberts when he took the helm of his Higgins boat like it was 1944 again. The Master Chief knew everything about the boat. He opened the throttle fully, spun the boat about, and was looking for the beach. The entire time he was teaching Chuck the proper way to make a landing.




David Gee met Master Chief Reeners on an Old Glory Honor Flight and they became friends. D-Day, he was there. When Gee discovered Chuck Roberts had restored a Higgins boat, one of only 11 still in existence, he arraigned to bring the Chief down to see it. When David got back to Oshkosh he got his video of the Master Chief at the helm again on the local news.

D-Day was arguably the most important date of the 20th century, certainly the most important date of World War 2, the Master Chief was there; to be able to watch him operate the Higgins boat, ride on it with him, and video him was priceless.







German WWII Reenacting: The Wehrmacht in Living History,

By Scott Lee Thompson, Atglen, PA: Schiffer Military History, 2015. 200 pages. \$34.95.

Of course any book on WWII reenacting should be of interest to a WWII reenactor since there are so few books on this topic. After reading a recent Schiffer Military History flyer on upcoming books I saw a new listing on WWII reenacting featuring images from around the world. Of course I my interest was piqued since I follow WWII reenacting the way some follow baseball. Further the way our activities are perceived through the camera lens can either help or hinder our efforts in the recreation of history. Scott Thompson's book helps to fill this gap on WWII living history through excellent photography to tell the story of WWII German reenacting covering the entire repertoire of WWII living history from the lowly rifleman to recreated or restored armor and everything in between. Through his camera lens and a number of others the story of German WWII reenacting is told. For those not familiar with Scott Thompson he has been an HRS member with 2nd Panzer for a number of years and also spearheads the Peoria WWII event held each June, that has become one of the largest gatherings of WWII armor in the country. With this background Scott is well placed to describe the efforts of the Wehrmacht reenactor.

is much more to reenacting than simply dressing up. No matter what unit or what country a reenactor hails from their goal is to help remember the typical soldier who lived and bled during WWII. Events from across the United States to England, the Czech Republic, and Russia all have reenactors doing their utmost to keep the memory of these soldiers alive are depicted here. Panthers, Opel Blitzes, k98 rifles, horses, HQ, field kitchens, and even chaplains are all shown noting the utmost details. Some of the best pictures show a convoy of German trucks and halftracks filled with troops, a tired soldat at his Flak 37, and one of my favorites showing a long line of troops waiting for the order to fill their mess kits from the steaming field kitchens. On a critical note, not every reenactor shown has a perfect impression nor does every back ground have perfect European features which Scott does note in his introduction. I think this shows that in spite of some historical setting imperfections at events we all can strive to do our best presentation with the uniform we wear or display we setup or knowledge we pass onto an interested person at a public event. Another point is that if your impression has a significant defect it will be noticed especially at a public event through the many pictures generated and seen possibly worldwide. One caution I find in the book is the overuse of Third Reich flags by some reenactors in a few images. In my opinion this type of display will only create controversy by distracting from the overall goal: the experience, presentation, and transmission of historical knowledge.

As an introduction to German WWII reenacting this book is ideal. A person unfamiliar with reenacting will get an idea of what this endeavor is all about and likely strike an interesting conversation. For a personal evaluation of a historical impression this book is again ideal. What can be done to delve further into living history with one's own impression? Lastly, an interesting effect is that each time I go through the book more familiar faces come into focus. If you have been involved in WWII reenacting on the German side within the last 10 years your likeness is probably found in this book and maybe on more than one page.

As an introduction and catalogue to WWII living history of the Wehrmacht this is the book to own. What? You say I can find all this electronically? Possibly so, however the information is contained in one place that will be there with your WWII books the next time you need it, requires no batteries, and you can hold it in your hands.

Scott has also written <u>The Gulaschkanone: The German Field Kitchen in WWII and Reenacting</u> and he is President of the nonprofit Central Illinois WWII Reenactors. You should be able to find him behind a steaming pot armed with a large ladle in the 2nd Panzer camp. At the next WWII reenactment you can have him autograph your copy of his book after your mess tin is being filled.


