ABSTRACT

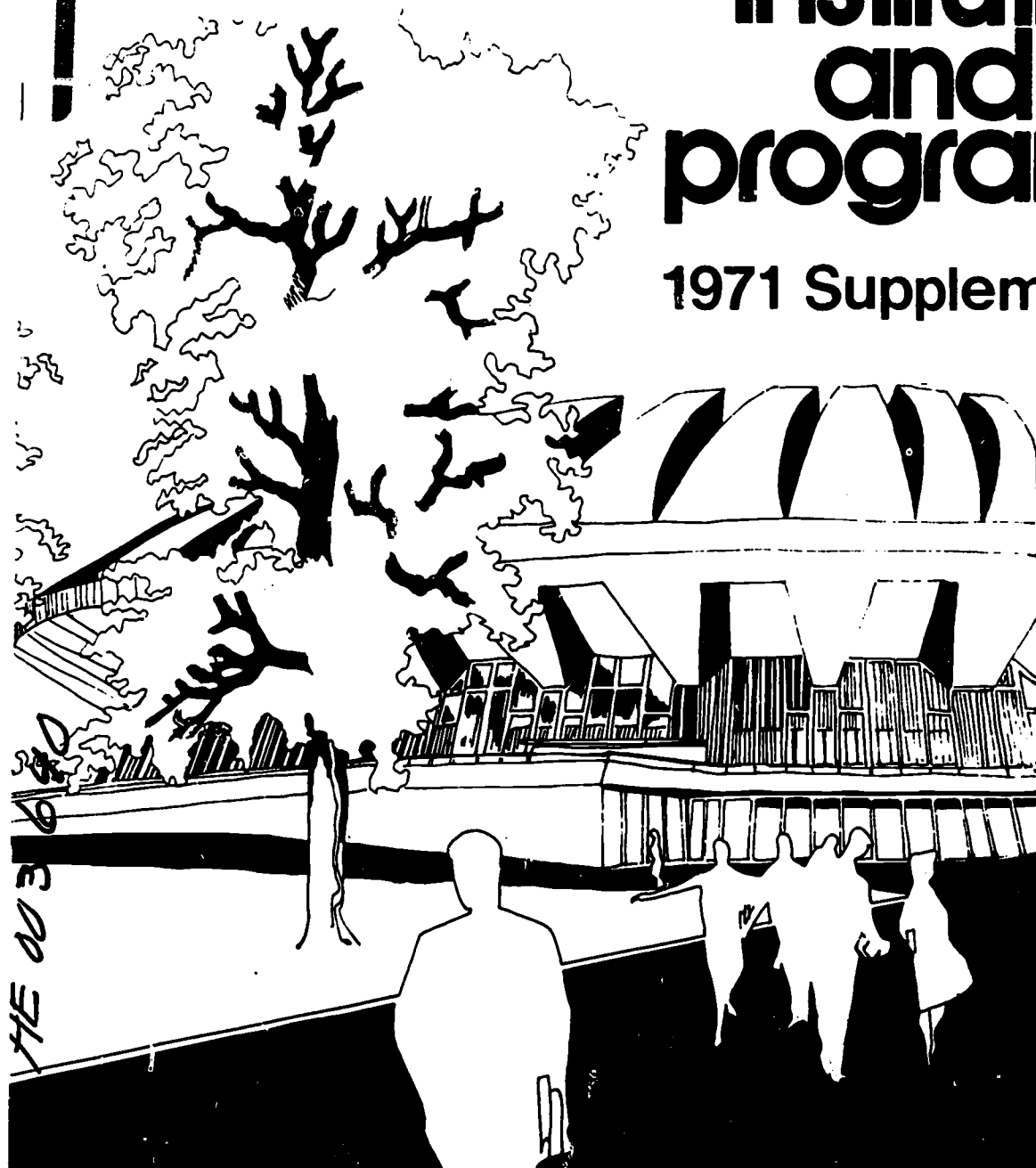

FOREWORD

This publication is a supplement to, and has been prepared for use with, the 1971 edition of Accredited Postsecondary Institutions and Programs, a directory of postsecondary institutions and programs, which are accredited or preaccredited as of 1970 by the regional and national accrediting agencies recognized by the U.S. Commissioner of Education. Future editions of this directory will not be supplemental; rather, a complete revised compilation of all recognized accredited and pre-accredited institutions and programs will be available annually.

This publication includes the list of postsecondary specialized and vocational institutions and programs as well as institutions of higher education which have attained accredited status as of September 1971, together with institutions or programs which have attained a preaccredited status with those nationally recognized accrediting agencies having recognized procedures for assigning such status as of September 1971. This supplement also includes a list of schools which have closed, lost accreditation, changed names, or moved since the publication of the last edition. Not included in this directory are lists of institutions having approval, recognition, classification, or licensing by State agencies having authority to perform those functions.

Accredited Postsecondary Institutions and Programs will provide information to officers of postsecondary educational institutions, guidance counselors and students at the secondary and postsecondary level. Also, it may be of interest to Federal and State agencies as well as to nongovernmental agencies and persons in the United States and abroad who are interested in education. The 1971 edition may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C. 20402 at \$1.25 per copy. Title and catalog number OE - 50066 should be given when ordering.

INTRODUCTION

Unlike most other countries of the world, the United States has no ministry of education or other centralized authority which exercises national control over educational institutions. The States assume varying degrees of control but permit institutions of higher education to operate with considerable autonomy. As a consequence, institutions vary widely in the character and quality of their programs. In this country, private educational associations of regional or national scope have established criteria and procedures to evaluate institutions or programs to determine whether or not they are operating at basic levels of quality. This voluntary, nongovernmental, peer evaluation in education is known as accreditation.

The best available method of ascertaining the general standing or quality of a postsecondary educational institution in the United States is to examine its accredited status. In general, there are two kinds of accreditation, institutional and specialized. Institutional accreditation at the higher education level is a function of the six regional accrediting associations which together cover the United States, the Canal Zone, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Institutional accreditation applies to the total educational institution and, for the most part, includes only those institutions offering a core of liberal arts and/or general education. This kind of accreditation signifies that the institution as a whole is achieving its objectives satisfactorily.

While the accrediting procedures of the several regional associations differ somewhat in detail, their rules of eligibility, basic policies and standards are similar.

Specialized accreditation is conducted by a number of national organizations, each representing a professional, technical, occupational, or specialized area such as architecture, cosmetology, home study education, pharmacy, or social work. Specialized accreditation, which applies to professional and vocational schools or programs, is aimed at protecting the public against educational incompetence. Unlike the regional associations, the specialized accrediting associations demonstrate variations among their criteria for accreditation, definitions of eligibility, and operating procedures.

In view of the differing emphases of the two kinds of agencies, accreditation of an institution as a whole should not be interpreted as being equivalent to specialized accreditation of each of the several parts or programs of an institution. Institutional accreditation does not validate a specialized program in the same manner and to the same extent as does specialized accreditation.

The accrediting procedure for both institutional and specialized agencies usually follows a pattern of five basic steps:

1. The accrediting agency, in collaboration with educational institutions, establishes standards;
2. The institution or program seeking accreditation prepares

a self-evaluation study that measures its performance against the standards established by the accrediting agency.

3. A team selected by the accrediting agency visits the institution or program to determine firsthand if the applicant meets the established standards.
4. On the basis of evidence that the applicant meets its standards, the accrediting agency lists the institution or program in an official publication with other similarly accredited institutions or programs.
5. The accrediting agency periodically reevaluates the institutions or programs that it lists to ascertain that continuation of the accredited status is warranted.

While accreditation indicates that an institution meets certain established qualifications and educational standards, accreditation does not mean that a school is equally competent in every respect, nor does it imply automatic acceptance of an institution's graduates or course of study. Acceptance of students or graduates is always the prerogative of the receiving institution or employing organization, which sets its own admission or employment standards.

NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACCREDITING
AGENCIES AND ASSOCIATIONS

The U. S. Commissioner of Education is required, under the provisions of P. L. 82-550 and subsequent legislation, to publish a list of nationally recognized accrediting agencies and associations which he determines to be reliable authority as to the quality of education or training offered by educational institutions or programs. The following criteria for determining nationally recognized

accrediting agencies and associations were evolved and published in the January 16, 1969, Federal Register, replacing the original statement published in 1952:

CRITERIA

The agency or associations:

1. Is regional or national in the scope of its operation
(Regional as used here means several states);
2. Serves a definite need for accreditation in the field in which it operates;
3. Performs no function that would be inconsistent with the formation of an independent judgment of the quality of an educational program or institution;
4. Makes publicly available (a) current information concerning its criteria or standards for accreditation, (b) reports of its operations, (c) lists of institutions or educational programs which it has accredited;
5. Encourages and gives staff guidance for institutional or program self-study prior to accreditation;
6. Secures sufficient and pertinent data concerning the qualitative aspects of an institution or educational program, and accredits only those institutions or programs which after on-site examination are found to meet the published criteria for accreditation;
7. Has an adequate organization and effective procedures to maintain its operation on a professional basis. Among the factors to be considered in this connection are that the agency or

association:

- (a) Clearly sets forth the scope of its accrediting activities both as to geographical area and nature and type of institution or program fields covered;
- (b) Has financial resources, as shown by its audited financial statements, necessary to maintain accrediting operations in accordance with published policies and procedures;
- (c) Has clear, written definitions of and procedures for (1) the accrediting of institutions or programs, (2) placing them on a probationary status, (3) revoking accredited status; and (4) reinstating the accredited status of an institution or program;
- (d) Charges only reasonable fees;
- (e) Uses experienced and qualified examiners to visit institutions, to examine educational objectives, to inspect courses, programs, administrative practices, services, and facilities, and to prepare written reports and recommendations for evaluation by the agency or association, and causes such examination to be conducted under conditions that assure an impartial and objective judgment;
- (f) Evaluates an institution or program only with the specific authorization of the chief executive officer of the institution;
- (g) Provides for adequate consultation during the visit between the team of visitors and the faculty, administrative staff, and students;
- (h) As a result of the accreditation visit, furnishes a written report to the chief executive officer of the institution with comments on the institution's areas of strength, on the areas needing improvement, and on suggested means of improvement;

- (i) Provides the chief executive officer with an opportunity to comment upon the factual elements of the report of the visiting team before the agency or association takes action on it;
 - (j) Evaluates the report of the team in the presence of a member of the team, preferably the chairman;
 - (k) Provides a regular means whereby the institution may appeal to the final authority in the agency or association;
 - (l) Reevaluates at reasonable intervals its accredited institutions and educational programs.
8. If an agency has developed a preaccreditation status, it shall have adequate procedures and requirements for the award of such status, comparable to those employed for the award of accredited status;
 9. Reviews at regular intervals the criteria by which it evaluates institutions or educational programs, in order that the criteria shall both support constructive analysis and emphasize factors of critical importance;
 10. Has demonstrated not less than 2 years experience as an accrediting agency;
 11. Has gained acceptance of its criteria, methods of evaluation, and decisions, by educational institutions, practitioners, licensing bodies and employers throughout the United States;
 12. Has demonstrated its capability and willingness to enforce ethical practices among the institutions and educational programs accredited by it.

In view of the criteria set forth above, it is unlikely that more than one association or agency will qualify for recognition (a) in a defined geographical area of jurisdiction or (b) in a defined field of program.

specialization within postsecondary or collegiate education.

The Commissioner's list of nationally recognized accrediting agencies and associations includes the commissions on institutions of higher education of the six regional associations and 38 specialized agencies having responsibility for accrediting postsecondary institutions. The nationally recognized accrediting agencies and associations have no legal control over institutions of higher education. They merely promulgate standards of quality or criteria of institutional excellence and approve or admit to membership the institutions that meet those standards or criteria. The only power the accrediting agencies have is that of giving publicity to the list of institutions they have accredited. A list of accrediting agencies and associations recognized by the U. S. Commissioner of Education as of September 1971 is included in this publication in Appendix A. Institutions accredited or preaccredited by these agencies may be eligible for participation in certain programs of Federal aid to education.

PREACCREDITATION

Under the terms of the education legislation listed below, an institution is eligible for participation in certain Federal programs if, among other restrictions and requirements, it is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency or association or if the U. S. Commissioner of Education has determined that there is satisfactory assurance the institution will meet the accreditation standards of such an agency or association within a reasonable time.

The Commissioner receives applications from accrediting agencies and associations seeking recognition for preaccreditation activities. To justify recognition by the Commissioner, an agency shall have established procedures and requirements for such activities comparable to those established for accreditation. The Commissioner shall find an institution having a preaccredited status as meeting requirements of academic eligibility so long as the accrediting agency certifies it to making progress towards achieving accredited status.

THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ACCREDITATION
AND INSTITUTIONAL ELIGIBILITY

This committee, comprised of 12 educators, assists the Commissioner of Education in fulfilling his obligations for eligibility determination under several laws, and advises him on broad policy matters and specific issues relating to accreditation and institutional eligibility for Federal funding. Specifically, the committee functions to consider all current and future policy relating to the responsibility of the Commissioner for the recognition and designation of accrediting agencies and associations, and to advise him concerning the relations of the Office of Education with accrediting agencies and associations, or other approval bodies which the Commissioner may request.

PART I

INSTITUTIONS ACCREDITED AND PREACCREDITED BY THE NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION COMMISSIONS OF THE REGIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Following the listing of each institution by State, dates of initial accreditation and of latest renewal or reaffirmation of accreditation are given. The dates given do not reflect changes in the accredited status of an institution. The initial date of accrediting, whether as a 2-year or 4-year college, is reported. Also listed are all institutions holding recognized preaccredited status with the various nationally recognized accrediting agencies. The information is current as of Summer, 1971.

For the most part, the information for this listing appears as provided by the accrediting associations, with only those editorial changes necessary for consistency of format. Official recognition for establishing satisfactory assurance was granted the regional accrediting associations during the period 1963-1964. Each of the above associations currently awards the preaccreditation classification of Correspondent and Candidate.

The classifications are defined as follows:

Candidate - "The classification given to a fully operative collegiate institution which, as attested to

by a higher education commission of a regional accrediting agency, appears to be offering students on at least a minimally satisfactory level, the educational opportunities implied by its objectives [Candidacy] indicates that an institution is progressing steadily and properly toward accreditation, but does not assure or even imply accreditation."¹

Correspondent - "The classification given to a collegiate institution not necessarily yet in operation, which has indicated its intent to work toward accreditation and which, having provided evidence of sound planning and the resources to implement these plans, appears to have the potential for attaining this goal within a reasonable time. Correspondent status is not accreditation nor does it assure or even imply accreditation."²

National Specialized Accrediting Associations

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF THEOLOGICAL SCHOOLS

The AATS preaccreditation classification, "Authorizing the Sending of Schedules," is assigned to theological schools which will be able to move on to accreditation within one or two years. Recognition of this status was accorded by the Commissioner in May 1969.

AMERICAN DENTAL ASSOCIATION

The ADA preaccreditation classification, "Accreditation Eligible," is assigned to developing dental schools and developing dental hygiene education programs. Recognition of this status was accorded by the Commissioner in September 1969. The preaccred-

ited classification "Reasonable Assurance" is assigned to institutions in the process of developing plans for dental schools.

The status was recognized in August 1971.

AMERICAN OPTOMETRIC ASSOCIATION

The AOA preaccreditation classification, "Accreditation Eligible," is applicable to optometry schools which have yet to enroll their first class. The classification "Preliminary Approval" applies to the developing schools which have students enrolled but are not fully operational. Both categories were recognized by the Commissioner in August 1971.

AMERICAN OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION

The AOA preaccreditation classification, "Reasonable Assurance of Approval," is assigned to osteopathic colleges in their first 3 years of operation. Recognition of this status was accorded by the Commissioner in May 1969.

AMERICAN VETERINARY MEDICAL ASSOCIATION

The AVMA preaccreditation classification, "Reasonable Assurance of Accreditation," is assigned to those developing veterinary medical schools which the Association determines likely to become accredited once their programs are functioning. Recognition of this status was accorded by the Commissioner in September 1969.

COMMISSION ON OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION OF THE SOUTHERN ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGES AND SCHOOLS

In June 1969, the Commission on Occupational Education was recognized by the Commissioner for the assignment of "Affiliate" status to non-degree granting Vocational-Technical Institutions which

have clear emphasis on occupational education. Affiliation is the first stage of development for institutions seeking to improve their programs and gain accreditation.

ENGINEERS' COUNCIL FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The ECPD preaccreditation classifications of "Reasonable Assurance of Accreditation" and "Candidate" were officially recognized in the spring of 1965 for engineering technology programs. Reasonable Assurance of Accreditation status is awarded by ECPD to engineering technology programs existing as a plan. Candidate status is awarded to those programs which are operating but which have yet to graduate their first class. (It is the policy of the Council not to publish a list or release information on programs holding preaccredited status.)

LIAISON COMMITTEE ON MEDICAL EDUCATION (Representing the Council on Medical Education of the American Medical Association and the Executive Council of the Association of American Medical Colleges)

The Committee's preaccreditation classification "Reasonable Assurance of Accreditation," is assigned to developing medical schools. Recognition of this status was awarded by the Commissioner in 1964.

NATIONAL LEAGUE FOR NURSING

The NLN preaccreditation classification, "Reasonable Assurance of Accreditation," is assigned to developing programs in nursing education. Recognition of this status was awarded by the Commissioner in 1964 for diploma, associate degree, baccalaureate and master's degree programs in nursing education.

Special Notice

IN THE UNITED STATES no reputable institution of higher education confers degrees solely on the basis of correspondence study. The lax chartering laws in some States permit the existence of correspondence schools whose practices amount virtually to the sale of degrees. Such organizations are commonly referred to as degree mills. The Office of Education defines a degree mill as "an organization that awards degrees without requiring courses of instruction that all reputable educational institutions require before conferring degrees." Most of these degree mills operate solely by mail. In many cases staffs and plants do not even exist.

Degree mills are a serious threat to American educational standards in several ways. First they damage, by misleading the public, the legitimate and reputable correspondence schools which are filling an important and necessary role by providing correspondence study in the areas of vocational and adult education. Correspondence courses are also offered by some colleges and universities. But legitimate correspondence schools do not award degrees, and colleges and universities do not award degrees on the basis of correspondence courses alone. Second, degree mills defraud those who honestly believe that they have received recognition from a legitimate institution of higher education. Third, they lower American prestige abroad by deceiving foreign students. They cause legitimate American educational degrees to be under-valued because of the confusion overseas between bona fide institutions of higher education in the United States and the degree mills.

In view of the inadequacy and utter worthlessness of degree mills and their disservice to American higher education, the U.S. Office of Education strongly urges the public to be on guard against organizations advertising degrees based solely on correspondence study. Caution should also be exercised in evaluating degrees and other credentials, to ascertain whether or not they have been obtained from degree mills.
