


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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Mauritius perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- General Issues Facing Mauritius
- Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group
- World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results
- The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities
- Working with the World Bank Group
- The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Mauritius
- Communication and Information Sharing
- Background Information

II. Methodology

From March to May 2015, 250 stakeholders of the WBG in Mauritius were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a country opinion survey. Participants were drawn from the office of the President/Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; PMUs; local governments; bilateral/multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs/community based organizations (CBO); the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations. A total of 130 stakeholders participated in the survey (52% response rate).

Some respondents filled out the questionnaire with a representative of the fielding agency in person or on the phone, and others received and returned the questionnaires via post or email. Respondents were asked about: general issues facing Mauritius; their overall attitudes toward the WBG; the WBG's effectiveness and results; the WBG's knowledge work and activities; working with the WBG; the WBG's future role in Mauritius; and the WBG's communication and information sharing.


Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'12 (response rate is 50%, N=153). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, means of the FY' 15 data and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in appendices A, B, C, D, E, G, and H. For the weighted stakeholder breakdown and year comparison results, please see appendix F (page 130).

III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

For further analyses, respondents from ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies, PMUs, and consultants working on WBG projects were combined; respondents from the financial sector/private banks were combined with those from private sector organizations; respondents from NGOs/CBOs, private foundations, and trade unions were combined in the "CSO" category. Few respondents from the office of the President, Prime Minister, office of parliamentarian, and the judiciary branch were included in the "Other" category. Note that there were no respondents from office of minister, faithbased groups, and youth groups.




Percentage of Respondents (N=124)

Area of Primary Specialization





Geographic Location



Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group



Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- Year comparison: Respondents in this year's country survey had significantly lower ratings of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents from the FY '12 country survey (weighted mean in FY'15 = 4.7; weighted mean in FY'12 = 5.8)¹.
- Respondents' levels of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their perceptions of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Mauritius.




"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank Group in Mauritius?" (1 - "Not familiar at all", 10 - "Extremely familiar")



• Year comparison: Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in Mauritius were "economic growth" (45%) and "education" (42%).




Percentage of Respondents (N=126)

What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty






Assessing the Gap between the Rich and the Poor in Mauritius




"In your view, is global climate change a very serious problem, somewhat serious, not too serious, or not a problem?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

V. Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group

Attributing Failed/Slow Reform Efforts

- Year comparison: Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey indicated that they most often attributed failed or slow World Bank assisted reform efforts to "*political pressures and obstacles*" (37%) and "*lack of/inadequate levels of capacity in Government*" (34%).
- **Stakeholder groups**: Among this year's respondents, respondents from CSOs and the private sector were significantly more likely to attribute failed or slow WBG assisted reform efforts to that "*there is not an adequate level of citizen/civil society participation*" compared to respondents from other stakeholder groups.




Percentage of Respondents (N=115)



The World Bank Group's Overall Effectiveness³ (Indicator Question)




"Overall, please rate your impression of the World Bank Group's effectiveness in Mauritius." (1 - "Not effective at all", 10 - "Very effective")

"To what extent does the World Bank Group's work help to achieve development results in Mauritius?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")








Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10




Most Effective Instruments in Reducing Poverty





Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Collaboration⁵



Drivers of Effectiveness

To determine the key drivers of respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness and ratings of its ability to help achieve development results in Mauritius, bivariate correlational analyses were conducted using respondents' ratings of the nineteen specific areas of effectiveness.


Correlational analyses, however, are not able to tell us exactly what is causing respondents' ratings of the World Bank Group's overall effectiveness or ratings of its ability to help achieve development results. Rather, these analyses tell us that as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, respondents' ratings of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness increase, or as ratings of effectiveness in one area increase, ratings of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results increase. Thus, it can be inferred that respondents' perceptions of effectiveness in one specific area are related to, or drive, respondents' perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness or perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results.

- <u>Overall Effectiveness</u>: Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the Bank Group's overall effectiveness in Mauritius. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at transport;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at water and sanitation; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at education.
- <u>Achieving Development Results:</u> Those specific areas with the highest Pearson Product-Moment correlations were determined to be the most closely related to perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results in Mauritius, suggesting that ratings of effectiveness in those specific areas are drivers of perceptions of the WBG's ability to help achieve development results. The areas determined to be key drivers from these analyses were:
 - The WBG's effectiveness at public sector governance/reform;
 - The WBG's effectiveness at disaster management; and
 - The WBG's effectiveness at social protection.





The World Bank Group's Work in Mauritius: Collaboration




Overall Perceptions: Collaboration






"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group measures and corrects its work in real time in Mauritius?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")




Percentage of Respondents (FY 2015 N=112; FY 2012 N=144)

"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)



Meeting Mauritius's Knowledge Needs¹⁰ (Indicator Question)


Contribution of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (Indicator Question)

Technical Quality of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (Indicator Question)










The World Bank Group's Local Presence in Mauritius

"To be a more effective development partner in Mauritius, do you believe that the World Bank Group should have...?" (Respondents chose from a list.)


Selectivity of the World Bank Group's Support

Making the World Bank Group of Greater Value

- **Year comparison**: Respondents in the FY'12 Country Survey indicated that the World Bank should "*improve the quality of its experts as related to Mauritius's specific challenges*" (36%) to make itself of greater value in Mauritius.
- **Collaboration**: This year's respondents who currently collaborate with the WBG were significantly more likely to indicate that the WBG should "*increase the level of capacity development in the country*" compared to those respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG.
- **Stakeholder groups**: It is worth mentioning that respondents from CSOs and the private sector were significantly more likely to indicate that the WBG should "*reach out more to groups outside of Government*" than respondents from other stakeholder groups.





Percentage of Respondents (N=120)








Percentage of Respondents (N=124)

"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Mauritius? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)




"How would you prefer to obtain information from the World Bank Group? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)















"Which Internet connection do you use primarily when visiting a World Bank Group website?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

WBG Website Usage¹⁵





Use of the WBG's Social Media Channels




"Do you currently consult the World Bank Group social media sites (e.g., blogs, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Flickr)?"
