GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

FOR TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENT ACT OF 1972 SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

TITLE II OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF

Any person believing that the Davison Community School District or any part of the school organization has inadequately applied the principles and/or regulations of (1) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, (2) Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, (3) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or (4) Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 may bring forward a

complaint, which shall be referred to as a grievance to: Civil Rights Coordinator Matthew Lobban, Assistant Superintendent **Davison Community Schools** 1490 N Oak Rd Davison, MI 48423 (810) 591-0808

Section II

The person who believes a valid basis for grievance exists shall discuss the grievance informally and on a verbal basis with the Civil Rights Coordinator, who shall in turn investigate the complaint and reply with an answer within five (5) business days. If the complainant feels the grievance is not satisfactorily resolved, they may initiate formal procedures according to the following steps.

Step 1

A written statement of the grievance signed by the complainant shall be submitted to the Civil Rights Coordinator within five (5) business days of receipt of answers to the informal complaint. The Coordinator shall further investigate the matters of grievance and reply in writing to the complainant within five (5) business days.

Step 2

A complainant wishing to appeal the written (or Step 1) decision of the local Civil Rights Coordinator may submit a signed statement of appeal to the Superintendent of Schools within five (5) business days after receipt of the Coordinator's response. The Superintendent shall meet with all parties involved, formulate a conclusion, and respond in writing to the complainant within ten (10) business days.

Step 3

If still unsatisfied, the complainant may appeal through a signed, written statement to the Board of Education within five (5) business days of receiving the Superintendent's response in Step 2. In an attempt to resolve the grievance, the Board of Education shall meet with the concerned parties and their representative within forty (40) days of the receipt of such an appeal. A copy of the Board's disposition of the appeal shall be sent to each concerned party within ten (10) days of this meeting. The decision of the Board of Education shall be final.



Challenging yet successful year in the books

We made it! We successfully completed a school year that was fraught with challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite those challenges - in-



cluding the very difficult decision to delay our start date, a preholiday "pause," contact tracing and quarantining, and staff shortages, we

were able to offer a full school year of face-to-face and online instruction and help get our students back on track.

As I reflect over the last year and its challenges, I can't help but feel tremendously proud of our students and staff. They really rose to the challenge and persevered. We were one of only a handful of school districts in our county to offer a full year of full time face-to-face instruction five days a week. While 70% of our parents opted to send their children to school for face-to-face instruction we also provided about 30% of our students the opportunity to complete their instruction online.

There were also a lot of positives that came from this school year and I think it's important to reflect on those. They include:

- Davison High School earned high National and metro-area rankings in the 2021 Best High Schools by U.S. News. Davison High School ranked #134 in the state and #3,631 in the nation. When you consider there are over 1,700 public high schools in the state of Michigan that puts Davison High School in the top eight percent. And, with 13,394 schools ranked nationally we rank in the top 27% in the country.
- Much work is being done on the 2020 Bond. We held a small groundbreaking ceremony for our new auditorium/performing arts center prior to our June 14 Board of Education meeting. Work on the Thomson Elementary two-classroom addition is moving forward and the turf and extra restrooms have been completed at Cardinal Stadium. Work also continues at the new Cardinal Station, the property on Lapeer Road where our Transportation, Food Services and DCER offices will be relocated in July. Other work that will take place this summer is the installation of new boilers at Davison High School, Davi-

son Alternative Education, Davison Middle School and Hahn Intermediate, a complete utility relocation (sanitary sewer, water, electrical, storm sewer, gas) at DAE/DHS in order to accommodate the new performing arts center and connector between the alternative education and high school buildings, asbestos abatement on the first floor of the high school, new installation of ceilings and 3-D lighting in the cafeteria, kitchen, varsity locker rooms and boiler room (where the abatement is taking place), improvements to the high school kitchen, cafeteria and serving lanes, new bleachers in the high school gymnasium and the installation of a new chiller at the high school to provide air conditioning to the entire high school and new performing arts center.

- We were able to hold graduation ceremonies for about 350 Davison High School seniors and nearly 40 Davison Alternative Education students. I know this is just a "normal" rite of passage, but not being able to hold a traditional graduation last year because of COVID restrictions hurt deeply and still does.
- Our staff has become much more proficient with the use of technology for instruction.
- Our Wrestling team won the Class A Division 1 State Championship. We also had five individual state champs (a school record) and set a state record by qualifying wrestlers from all 14 weight classes as All-State.
- Our football team made their second straight appearance at Ford Field to play for the Class A Division 1 State Championship.
- Our Boys' Bowling Team was also runner up for the state title.

As you can see, we have so much to be proud of. Thank you for hanging in with us this past year and a half. As with most trials, we know we will emerge stronger. That is why our 2021-22 school year will focus on Social Emotional Learning, or SEL. People with strong social-emotional skills are better able to cope with everyday challenges and benefit academically, professionally and socially. From effective problem-solving to self-discipline, from impulse control to emotion management and more, SEL provides a foundation for positive, long-term effects on students, adults and communities. If ever there was a time for this to be a focus, it is now.
