Doug's Discoveries—

I've discovered that 2,000 clergy and lay members of The Michigan Annual Conference will meet June 1-4, 2022 in Traverse City. Milford UMC is sending three clergy; two Lay Members: Ann Koss & Debbie Bonnewell; and two members representing The Heritage District: Nancy Weeks & Bette Knedgen. We'll worship with 2,000 other disciples, receive

excellent training for ministry, enjoy fellowship meals, ordain new clergy, celebrate retirements, and grieve the members that we've lost in the past year.

We'll consider resolutions (proposals from individuals or groups): #1-3, 14, and 15 address clergy compensation; #4- "Readers to Leaders," a conference wide fundraising campaign for literacy programs in Liberia and Detroit; #5- to advocate for student debt cancellation; #6- to recognize the Wesleyan Covenant Association as a source of information about the protocol for reconciliation and grace through separation and about The Global Methodist Church; #7- Reduce the number of Districts in Michigan from 9 to 7; #8ask our people to advocate on U.S. budget priorities that improve the general welfare of Americans instead of overspending on military budgets; #9- Affirming three statements for the Future of The United Methodist Church: A) Covenant to Build Beloved Community (from The North Central Jurisdiction); B) A Call to Grace (from the coalition of General/Jurisdictional Conference and other leaders: C) A Narrative for the Continuing United Methodist Church (from the Council of Bishops); #10- support for immigrant driver's licenses and State I.D.'s in Michigan; #11- advocate for the "Good Time" Ballot initiative on our November ballots. from www.LibertyAndJusticeForAllCoalition.org; #12- recognize the unborn baby as a full human person from the moment of conception; #13- clarify procedures to elect officers in our various conference committees.

Africa University Celebrates 30th Anniversary

United Methodists started a wonderful university in 1992 in Old Mutare, Zimbabwe. The anniversary will be celebrated in October, 2022. We contribute through "Ministry Shares," our fair share of all United Methodist connectional mission and ministry everywhere. Some U.M. churches and conferences give extra gifts to AU. East Ohio just raised \$1.5 million to build a new residence hall for 90 female students. This will improve the education and wellness of gifted young women who will be key leaders in Africa in their various fields.

AU is doing crucial research on Malaria, supported by major grants from USAID and from our U.S. National Institutes of Health (NIH). Young leaders from many African nations are getting an education together at AU. They learn the perspectives of other African nations, and they learn to collaborate for the future of all nations. These graduates are making a difference in many fields, helping to improve life across Africa. They lead their nations to more clean water, literacy, sustainable agriculture, better health care, healthy churches, etc. United Methodists invest in long-term solutions to global problems. Thank you for your support of the good work that we do together!

Mission Giving through MUMC

Last year, our congregation not only gave enough to pay our Michigan Conference Ministry Shares (\$34,301), we also gave extra for a ministry in Michigan. Required Minimum Distributions

Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) are withdrawals from tax-deferred investment accounts such as an IRA. If you reach the age of 70 ½ in 2020 or later, you must take your first RMD by April 1st of the year after you reach the age of 72. Many people with RMD requirements can reduce their tax expenses by donating assets from their retirement accounts directly to the church. Ask your tax advisor if you are required to make Required Minimum Distributions each year and if you could lower your taxes by giving directly from that retirement account to the church. Never make a withdrawal from these type of investment accounts without first consulting your tax advisor.

Heritage Sunday Celebration

Editor's note: Heritage Sunday was celebrated at MUMC on May 15. Nancy Ebert, Church Historian, shared the following information at that time:

For the Heritage Sunday Celebration, I will talk briefly about three crosses that are important to our church. The first is on the side of the church facing Atlantic Street. The cross and flame, whose construction was conceived and led by Al Worrell, is in memory of Al's father, Albert Worrell, Sr., and his crew, whose plane went down on July 23, 1945 on Ni'ihau Island, Hawaii. There was one survivor. The cross and flame was dedicated in July, 2008.





The second cross is hanging here and was given in memory of Grace Moffat by her husband John. This cross was made by Juanita Roger's brother-in-law, Howard Armstrong, in 1966, the year Grace died. That was also the year that the church moved into the newly constructed building on Atlantic Street. After Grace's death, John traveled the world as a cruise dance host and wrote and directed plays here at the church.

The third cross has been on the altar since the early 1950's. It was given in memory of Gail Bourns' grandmother Grace Forshee, who died in 1952, by Gail's mother Bernice Baur and her friend Sue McFarland. Grace played the saxophone and sang in a church quartet. Norm and Gail were married in front of this cross, their three children were baptized and married in front of the cross, and all 4 grand-children and one great grandchild were baptized in front of the cross.
