Opening lead: Four of $\vee$
Two balanced hands are often unable to diagnose an unstopped suit. South, who had seen this all before, took a look at the lead and dummy's hearts, and thought, "Oh well, here we go again."

East won the opening heart lead with the ace and continued with the queen, then shifted to the queen of spades. South was delighted to win his ace, knowing that East would
have continued hearts if he could West was marked with six hearts.

A 3-2 split in either minor would give South his contract. He started by cashing the king and queen of clubs, East discarding a spade. West was now also marked with four clubs. South did a little sleuthing by cashing the king of diamonds followed by the king of spades. South had a perfect count! West was known to have started with 2-6-1-4 distribution.

With that knowledge, the solution was simple. South cashed the queen of diamonds and crossed to dummy with the ace of clubs, East shedding another spade. South exited dummy with a spade, end-playing East. The defender could cash another spade, but then had to lead a diamond into dummy's ace10 to give declarer nine tricks.

Bob Hamman, one of the all-time great players, once said: "Most of the miracles that happen in bridge happen in three no trump." This hand hardly qualifies as a miracle, but you get the idea.
