Memorial Day Address

An excerpt from Mr. Romo's speech follows: "Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. We acknowledge our heroes on Memorial Day who paid the ultimate price to assure the survival and success of our liberty. I am highly honored to be here today, to participate in this extraordinary ceremony, and to witness your heartfelt recall of the ultimate sacrifice paid by past warriors from the Edgewood Community. They may be gone but you are making sure they are not forgotten. It is our human need to recall the names and deeds of our heroes. This is why we have a Roy Cisneros Elementary School and the names inscribed on the Edgewood Vietnam Memorial to make sure that we will not forget sacrifices made by the Edgewood family, a cherished component of the 58,272 total U.S. killed during the Vietnam War. Also, we all can be very proud that the Edgewood community's focus is not exclusively looking backwards. You are continuing your legacy of support - here and now --for our military and veterans, together with the numerous individuals enlisting at a high rate for military service. May you be especially blessed for your demonstrated commitment and dedication to our military heroes."



In Memoriam Mississippi State Director General Steven L. Melançon (U.S. Army, Ret.)

The State Director for Mississippi, Steven L. Melançon, passed away peacefully in his home on August 2, 2013 at the age of 68.

Brigadier General Melançon (U.S. Army, Ret.) was a Selective Service Reserve Force Officer for eight years, the Director for Operations at National Headquarters two years and State Director the past 12 years. He served two tours in Vietnam, was an attorney, and a state legislator. His military awards included the Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster, Air Medal with "V" Valor, Selective Service System Meritorious, Exceptional, and Distinguished Service Awards.

He is survived by his wife of 48 years, Jan; daughter, Jena; son, Louis and four grandchildren.



Thomas G. White Region I Director



Tom White enlisted in the United States Air Force in June of 1970 and served as a Ground Communication Equipment Repairman at Key West, NAS Florida, before being accepted into the Airman Education Commissioning and Program. He completed degree requirements at Georgia Tech and was commissioned through Officer Training School in San Antonio, Texas, in December of 1974.

He was assigned to the 91st Strategic Missile Wing at Minot AFB North Dakota where, in addition to his Deputy Launch Control Officer duties, he also worked in the Instructor Shop and Standard Evaluations area. From Minot, he went to Keesler AFB, MS, where, after attending the Electronic Communications Officer schools, he was assigned to the 2052nd Communication Squadron as a Special Assistant to the Commander and Administrative Officer. In June of 1977, he was assigned to the 1915th Communication Squadron at Grissom AFB, IN, where he worked with the Strategic Air Command Aircrews as Chief of the Combat Crew Communications Branch. In 1978, he took over the Operations Officer duties in the 1915th and also completed Masters Degree requirements through Ball State University. From September 1979 until September 1981, he was the Operations Officer of the Communications Detachment of the 2006th Communications Group in Ankara, Turkey.

Prior to joining the Selective Service System as an active duty officer in 1989, he was the Commander of the 186th Communication Flight and Detachment Commander for the 238th Combat Communications Squadron, both units of the Mississippi Air National Guard, in Meridian, Mississippi.

Tom was the Operations Officer in the old Region I Headquarters in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from 1989 until its closure in 1994. When the Agency downsized to three Regions in 1994, he was the last person out the door and turned off the lights for the last time at the old Philadelphia Navy Base. He joined the new Region I Staff at Great Lakes as the Senior Operations Officer at that time and served until his retirement from the Air Force in 2000. He was selected to be the first civilian Operations Manager for Region I in July of 2000. He served in that position until he was selected to be the Region Deputy Director in December 2002, He was appointed as Region Director in January of 2004. Tom has been awarded the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Force Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal, the Joint Service Commendation Medal (1 OLC), the Selective Service System Meritorious Service Award with Bronze Medal, and the Selective Service System Exceptional Service Award with Silver medal.

Tom grew up in Elizabeth City, North Carolina, and is married to the former Martha McCallum of New Hebron, Mississippi.

He says that he has thoroughly enjoyed his time with Selective Service and has had the privilege to meet and work with some of the finest, most talented, and dedicated people in the country. He firmly believes that the Agency provides one of the, if not the best, bargains for the American taxpayer in that most of our State Directors give much more than they get paid for as do our Reserve Force Officers. And the Board Member network covers the country and they get no compensation and only limited mileage or meal reimbursements which many of them decline. Tom also is a firm believer in the mission and the necessity of being prepared in this uncertain world where our military is stretched paper thin to cover their responsibilities and the Reserves and National Guard are being taxed beyond the missions they were originally designed to handle.

He credits the outstanding Region Headquarters staff for the successes they have enjoyed in meeting and going beyond their mission tasking. He also states that some of his proudest moments have been in working with his counterparts, both past and present, in the other two Regions and the NHQ team. "I simply can't say enough about the tremendous difference that Mr. Mario Campos, the Associate Director of Operations, has made and is making daily at NHQ" Tom says. "His leadership and drive will ensure that we will be ready and able if this country ever needs us" ...

Tom will be retiring on August 24, 2013 after 24 years with the Agency. We will miss him and wish him much health and happiness in his future endeavors.


