International Prospectus

Admission Requirements

- Completed International Application Form
- Certified bank letter showing sufficient funds for the first year
- Official academic records of all secondary and postsecondary work taken, including examination results
- For students not from Muskingum's affiliated partner
 institutions abroad, official results from an accepted
 test of English proficiency (TOEFL iBT of at least 46,
 IELTS of at least 5.5, CEFR of at least B2); students
 from established partner institutions abroad must provide a formal written assessment from their school
 affirming English language proficiency at the appropriate level for degree study at Muskingum University
- A hand-written essay, at least 500 words long
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers or school administrators
- Additional documentation may be required depending on the applicant's country of origin.

Support Programs

- International Programs Office
- Language assistance for non-native English-speaking students
- Permission to request extra time on tests for students whose first language is not English; available only for first-year students taking ESL courses
- Mentoring by upper-class students
- Faculty academic advisor after the first semester
- Free tutoring available from most academic departments
- Internship opportunities for 3rd and 4th year students
- Career Field experience opportunities for 2nd year students
- Wellness Center (health services)
- Counseling Center (emotional support services)

Financial Aid

There is no financial aid form required; all international applications are automatically reviewed for available scholarships and grants.

International students are eligible for financial aid at Muskingum University, with grants and scholarships ranging from \$5,000 to \$17,000 per year. These grants & scholarships are limited, so students hoping for financial aid should apply as early as possible. The decision to award a grant/scholarship is based primarily on two factors: grades and exam scores from high school (and university transcripts if applying as a transfer student); and scores from standardized tests (TOEFL, IELTS or SAT). The application essay is also reviewed and personal interviews are helpful when possible.

Muskingum University offers several scholarships to students interested in participating or majoring in the following areas. Award amounts begin at \$500 per year.

- Digital Media Design
- Ar
- Forensics (speech/debate)
- Journalism
- Theatre
- Science Division Majors

Performance/Departmental awards are determined by the respective academic departments.

All awards are renewable dependent upon maintenance of a specified grade-point average and participation in departmental activities. Students who do not receive financial aid upon entering the University are eligible for scholarships based on work done at Muskingum.

Limited financial aid is also available in the form of part time, on-campus employment. International students can work up to 20 hours per week in on-campus employment.

Services Provided

Transportation

- Airport greeting and transportation directly to campus upon arrival (from John Glenn Columbus International Airport in Columbus, Ohio) on designated dates
- Transportation to and from John Glenn Columbus International Airport (CMH) on designated dates or transportation to or from the Greyhound bus station (Cambridge, Ohio) when leaving or arriving from semester breaks

Housing

- Shared housing in on-campus residence halls or houses assured upon receipt of tuition deposit. Oncampus housing is required for students in their first three years at Muskingum University.
- Emergency housing provided free for early arrival and late departure before and after each academic semester if deemed necessary by University personnel

Counseling Services

- Immigration advising and assistance with legal documents pertaining to immigration issues
- Individual academic and career counseling
- Personal counseling

Miscellaneous Activities and Services

- Orientation program introducing students to Muskingum University and the surrounding community before the academic semester begins
- Activities such as trips to shopping malls, movies, art galleries, museums, parks, and nearby attractions
- Participation in Muskingum's exchange programs with overseas universities
