



Durham Arts Council's Artists-in-Schools (CAPS) Program serves students virtually

Before the pandemic, Durham Arts Council teaching artists serving in the CAPS Artists-in-schools program, went directly into schools and classrooms across the Triangle to support student learning through interactive arts programs. We are excited to share that the pandemic created an opportunity for resilience. Teaching artists developed a variety of virtual programs so that they could continue to reach students online. The CAPS program reached over 15,000 students this year!

Durham Arts Council would like to thank our partners whose support and

collaboration allowed artists to bring virtual programming to schools and the community in 2020/2021: Durham Public Schools, Arts Access, American Dance Festival, Carolina Theatre of Durham, Chapel-Hill Carborro Schools, Dementia Inclusive Durham, Durham Center for Senior Life, Durham County Library, Granville County Schools, Granville Education Foundation, Sandy Ridge Visual & Performing Arts School.

Although many amazing programs happened during the year, we wish to highlight several in this space.

Willa Brigham shared 'StoryTelling Fun,' with K-2 students all across Granville County in May. Her live Zoom presentation was viewed by over 800 students and featured a mix of interactive songs and stories. Students mirrored movements and sang along.

Ramya Kapadia facilitated movement and story workshops with EC classrooms at Burton Elementary and Durham County Library through the Durham Arts Inclusion Project, a partnership with Arts Access, Durham Arts Council, Durham Public Schools and Durham County Library.

Marcos Napa shared Afro-Peruvian Music and Dance in live Zoom

performances with Durham elementary schools - R.N. Harris, Holt, CC Spaulding, and George Watts Elementary schools. Students experienced the sound of the Cajon, a box-shaped percussion instrument originally from Peru, played by slapping the front or rear faces with the hands, fingers, or sometimes implements such as brushes, mallets, or sticks.

The feedback for CAPS virtual offerings has been positive. Most schools and organizations welcomed the opportunity to explore and host artist programs online.

"We adapted together, we learned a lot together - and I think the most important thing is how we worked together to serve our community during this time. We had challenges but our wins outnumbered them," says Shana Adams, Director, Creative Arts in Public & Private Schools (CAPS).



Learn the fundamentals of Encaustic, one of the world's oldest art forms. During this workshop, we will learn a brief history of encaustic art, set up and safety tips and various encaustic tools, materials and basic encaustic techniques. After the demo, students will have time to make 2 practice panel before working on their final piece. Students will have plenty of time to create their own personal encaustic artwork by applying mixed media collage to the wax surface. No painting experience necessary. This is a great class for beginners and artists looking to explore this exciting medium. A \$50 materials fee is due at the beginning of the workshop (check or cash) for materials with an option to purchase additional panels. Students are encouraged (but not required) to bring papers, fabric and others collage materials to use in their original artwork. 





Confirmations: We do **NOT** send confirmations for these courses. Unless notified by the Education Office, students who have registered should assume that their course will meet as scheduled.

Virtual Class Information Virtual online classes through the Durham Arts Council will take place on Zoom. There is no cost to download and utilize the Zoom software. Class registration fees vary by class and continue to be accepted via our ProClass online registration. Virtual class enrollment will follow the same refund/withdrawal policies as regular classes. Refund/withdrawal policies can be found on the Durham Arts Council website. Links to attend virtual classes will be provided to registered students/ families before the first class meeting.

Curriculum Teaching artists are professionals in their subject area and course curriculum is developed individually by each teaching artist. Some beginner level courses offered may be taught by more than one instructor with each instructor providing their own unique interpretation of the curriculum.

Payment Plans

Installment Plans for Classes — Automatic installments of two equal credit card payments are available on the registration form. Installments are not available for I-day workshops or courses costing less than \$100. The first payment is due upon registration and the second payment is charged to your account 5 days prior to the first class meeting. A credit card must be used for multiple payments.

Installment Plans for Camps — Automatic installments of two equal credit card payments are available for camps. The first payment is due upon registration & the second is due two weeks before your child's first camp session. A credit card must be used for multiple payments. We will automatically charge your second payment two weeks before the first session.

Payment Plans for Individual Music:

- Payment Plan A: Semester Tuition may be paid in full at the time of registration, prior to the first lesson. DAC can accept payment by cash, check, money order or credit card (Visa or Mastercard). Students who prepay tuition in full will receive a \$12.00 discount on each semester's tuition.
- Payment Plan B: This plan requires a 50% first installment of the full tuition for the semester prior to the first lesson, and then the tuition balance is automatically charged at the half way mark of your lessons to your credit or debit card. There is no fee for this service and you must have a credit card on file with DAC.

MAKE UP CLASSES AND CANCELLATIONS - Students are expected to attend all lessons. Only one make up lesson per term is allowed for an individual lesson excused by the instructor due to illness or emergency. This lesson may be rescheduled with the instructor for the makeup week following the semester. The instructor may elect to schedule this make up lesson at another time during the current term, if there is space available. There are no refunds or credits given for any other missed lessons. Notification of inability

to attend a lesson may enable the instructor to use the time productively, but does not excuse payment for the contracted lessons. If a student must cancel a lesson he/she should call DAC at least 24 hours in advance. If an instructor is absent for any reason, the instructor will schedule a makeup time for the missed lesson either during the term if possible, or during the makeup days at the end of the term. If an instructor is unable to make up your excused lesson or missed lesson due to instructor absence, then DAC will carry forward a credit on the student's account that may be applied toward the next semester's tuition. If DAC cancels classes due to inclement weather or other emergency, instructors will arrange make up lessons or the student's account will carry forward a credit to next semester.

HOLIDAYS, EMERGENCY CLOSINGS AND INSTRUCTOR ABSENCE - Classes and music lessons are not held on major holidays when the Durham Arts Council is closed. Please see calendar for closure dates. Instructors will reschedule lesson times with you as needed.

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS - If a student elects to discontinue lessons during a term, the semester tuition is nonrefundable and nontransferable to a subsequent term, and tuition may not be transferred to another family member's account. A new DAC music student may withdraw only after the first lesson.
