Pre-recorded home videocassettes or DVDs, those commonly available in retail or rental stores and those offered from the conference resource center, are intended for personal home use <u>only</u>. These videos and DVDs generally do not carry licenses for non-home showings and viewing outside of the home, such as in church sanctuaries, meeting rooms, classrooms, fellowship halls, etc. requires a license which specially authorizes the video to be shown regardless of there being no admission fee charged or the video having been purchased.

Volunteers needed for the Texas Ramp Project

The Texas Ramp Project provides free wheelchair ramps widely across Texas and seeks volunteers to help serve their many clients more quickly. The all-volunteer organization serves those disabled Texans who cannot afford the cost of construction of a ramp. For a number of clients, this ministry provides the only way for them to leave their homes and be part of their communities.

Volunteers construct modular ramps stored in warehouses across the state, after which volunteer teams install the ramps at designated homes. Because of this unique model, teams of 4 to 6 volunteers can install a ramp in about half a day with the help of a team leader specially trained by the organization. No tools are needed, though financial contributions for the materials are appreciated and matched by a foundation. The Texas Ramp Project works with churches of all denominations in the communities it serves, and has collaborated with many UM churches, some in the CTC area, in order to implement this important ministry. Update on Year-End Gifts to Glen Lake Camp

As of yesterday Glen Lake Camp & Retreat Center has received \$22,779.40 in year-end gifts to help cover the seasonal and economic downturn in business. Cancellations for this past year, he reports, totaled over \$85,000, most of these due to the economy. Update on the Student Day Offering

Before Christmas only 98 of our congregations had participated in the Student Day Offering, a prerequisite for their students receiving UMC-related scholarships. We're happy to report that number has changed to 147 as of checkout on Tuesday (yesterday). Next spring when our students will be looking for scholarships from the UM Board of Higher Education & Ministry and the conference Higher Education Task Force, some will be very disappointed. That means students from 75 of our churches will be ineligible. In 2009, the Higher Education Task Force was forced to turn down two highly qualified students because their congregations DID NOT participate in the Student Day Offering. Please don't let this happen to the students at your church for the 2011 scholarship application period. In 2009 the UMC's Office of Loans & Scholarships had far more qualified students apply and far fewer funds available.

A Door to Zimbabwe

Through multiple partnerships, UMCOR gains a stable presence in Zimbabwe, opening a door of hope for ongoing humanitarian relief to a nation in conflict. UMCOR Health and UMCOR International Disaster Response worked closely with annual conference partners including Baltimore-Washington, Western Pennsylvania, North Carolina, **Central Texas** and the UMC in Zimbabwe to provide food, clean water, medicine, school kits, and long-lasting insecticide-treated mosquito nets to communities in need.

UMCOR, through Zoe Ministry, a program North Carolina Annual Conference, Nyadire Connection, a ministry of Western Pennsylvania Annual Conference, and First UMC in Mansfield, Texas, helped UM hospitals continue operations when many hospitals were forced to close and cholera outbreaks were widespread. Cholera kits provided by IDA Netherlands were sent to Nyadire and Mutambara Hospitals to treat 2,600 people. UMCOR worked with Nyadire Connection to rehabilitate water systems which brought access to clean water. Through the Baltimore-Washington Conference, 10,000 mosquito nets were distributed to at-risk communities. CTC Director of Humanitarian Services Director Jennifer Bellamy says, "I believe First Mansfield's mention is for the money they raised for the cholera epidemic and Julie Warren going with ZOE to check on distribution of supplies."

UMCOR's non-governmental organization, with Zoe Ministry and the UMC in Zimbabwe, delivered a total of 500 metric tons of grain throughout 12 UMC districts in Zimbabwe, as part of a broader distribution facilitated in 2008. The relief supplies benefited more than 16,000 vulnerable families. Through Africa University, UMCOR provided additional food relief to vulnerable families for six months.

Through partners Muslim Aid, GlobalMedic, Foundations for Hospices in Sub-Saharan Africa, IDA Netherlands, and IMA World health, additional medicines, medical supplies, and water filters were provided to hospitals and communities in need.
