August Community Service Report

The guild celebrated Community Service at the August general meeting by hosting guests from two of its community partners; enjoying a parade of donated quilts; and recognizing guild members who have donated quilts, placemats, and pillowcases so far this year.

Barbara Means, Georgia Coordinator for Ryan's Case for Smiles, discussed the history and goals of the organization and how the pillowcases we make contribute to the healing of the children who receive them. She reported that Ryan's Case for Smiles could not accomplish its mission without groups like East Cobb Quilters' Guild and expressed appreciation for its members' generosity.

Visiting the guild meeting from Cobb County Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) were Sharenda Robinson, Social Services Administrator, and Danielle Farley, RD Supervisor. They spoke about the comfort and joy that the donated quilts bring the children who receive them and explained that children entering foster care usually do not have any personal possessions until they pick out their own quilt. Sharenda and Danielle added that the program serves children from newborns to teenagers as well as young adults between 18 and 21 years of age. They thanked the guild members for their generosity in making the quilts that make a difference in children's lives.

East Cobb Quilters' Guild General Meeting Minutes

The Catholic Church of St. Ann's, Marietta, GA - August 25, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 9:32 AM by President Judy Alexander with a warm welcome and reminder to turn off cell phones. Judy read a thank you card from Janice Vaine, last month's speaker.

Minutes - Judy asked for approval of the July 28, 2017 minutes as published in the August newsletter. Danielle Morgan made the motion which was seconded by Melinda Rushing. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Bylaws – First Vice President Christie Stevens said she and her committee have consulted an attorney and reviewed documents from other quilt guilds to redo the bylaws and to put them more in line with those of other civic organizations and guilds of our size. They are pulling out things not related to governing of the Guild and putting them into a separate procedures document. The Bylaws will need to be approved by the membership and the Procedures will be approved by the Executive Committee which consists of Board members and committee chairs.

Programs Update – Jan Cunningham read a thank you card from Bill Kerr. She reported as follows:

- August Today's program will be about Community Service.
- September Jane Sassaman, quilt artist and fabric designer, will offer our last national teacher workshops in 2017. Thursday's workshop will be Leaf Sampler (there are still a few openings) and Saturday's Pattern Play class is full. A second Pattern Play class has been scheduled for Sunday since there was a large waiting list.
- October Elizabeth Frolet, Best of Show winner at our quilt show, will be our guest speaker.

Treasurer's Report – Robin said account balances for the period ending July 31, 2017 were as follows: \$16,037.48 in the Guild Account, \$16,688.49 in the Quilt Show Account, and \$30,569.98 in the Guild CD for a total balance of \$63,295.95.

Hospitality – Doreen Clink introduced one guest in attendance.

New Bees – Kim Ayers said anyone wishing to join a bee should contact Kim at motherboom@aol.com. Several members are looking for a bee in the In-Town area and another in the Alpharetta area.

2018 Challenge— Fran Fister still has some packets available for the Mission Possible challenge. See our website for details.

Golden Scissors – Judy reported on behalf of Vickie Lord that there was one golden scissor award.

Sunshine – Michele Bautsch asked people to contact her at sunshine@ecqg.com if they know of anyone who needs a card from the Guild.

Membership – Carolyn Powers said 65 people were in attendance and that membership stood at 312.

Door Prizes – Alycia Davis awarded door prizes.

Show & Tell – Kay Harper assisted members in showing their quilts and making announcements.

Following a short **break**, Judy invited Danielle Morgan to present a check from the sale of 400 post cards to Julie Binney, Board President of Family Promise of Cobb County. Julie gave a summary of their organization and the work they do in partnering with local congregations to feed and provide housing for homeless children and their families.


Community Service Program – Stella Lang said 67 quilts were donated today. Members participated in a quilt parade and Stella read off the names of all the members who donated quilts, pillowcases and/or placemats. Stella reported that based on goals of 300 each, we have received 195 quilts (65% of our goal); 220 placemats (73% of our goal) and 190 pillowcases (63% of our goal).

Stella introduced Barbara Means from Ryan's Case for Smiles who shared with us the good things their organization does to help children feel and heal better.

Stella Lang then introduced Danelle Farrelly and Sharenda Robinson from the Division of Family and Children Services. They told us how our donated guilts improve the lives of the children who receive them.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:55 AM.



To Accomplish "Mission Possible - 3 colors in a "1 patch" quilt:"

Recently asked questions and answers about 2018 ECQG challenge:

Important: Please save your envelope with number, crayons in baggy and muslin fabric used to check colors. You will need them when the mission is complete.

- 1. Can I use as many fabrics as I desire provided they contain the colors of my 3 crayons? YES
- Can I use shades of the color (light, medium or dark)? YES color your 4 x 4" swatch lightly, a little darker and outline.
- Can I use an inner and outer border that is not a crayon color? Borders are typically not used in a "one
 patch" quilt, however, if you wish please add after the 24 x 24" minimum is met.
- 4. Can I use one shape but different sizes of the shape? YES if you choose to use a square, different sizes of that shape may be used to add more interest. All the others shape with multiple sizes are discouraged so it will be a true "one patch". All other shapes with multiple sizes are discouraged so it will be a true "one patch", however, it will be allowed if you must.
- 5. If you have to color your own fabric how is that done? You can draw on your chosen shape with crayon color a black and white fabric (example shown), use your imagination. Remember to heat set crayon colored fabric between two paper towels to protect iron and board cover!
- Is a half/square triangle a one patch? YES any shape that you can repeat over and over is a one patch.
 To square up the one patch quilt you may have to use a half and/or a quarter of one patch shape.
- 7. Can we have other colors in the quilt after we use a predominant amount of crayon color? YES the three crayon colors must be prominently shown other fabrics and colors may be a "must" to show off the colors.
- Can embroidery be added to the quilt as an embellishment? Embellishment is not a requirement –
 embroidery might be a nice way of showing off your crayon colors.
