Introduction

Sponsored Programs is pleased to present the Annual Report for fiscal year 2013. New funding for externallysponsored projects at EKU totaled \$45,050,206¹ for the recently ended fiscal year. We extend our congratulations to those individuals whose hard work and dedicated are represented by the awards in this report. The achievement of securing externally-funded awards is one of which to be proud and represents a strong faculty and staff commitment to the University's three-pronged teaching, research, and service mission.

Sponsored Programs Mission

The mission of the Division of Sponsored Programs is to provide support for faculty and staff in the pursuit of external funding while assuring compliance with applicable regulations. Sponsored Programs provides assistance in the following areas: identifying potential funding sources; developing proposal narratives and budgets; facilitating compliance with federal, state, sponsoring agency, and University regulations; completing electronic applications; submitting proposals to sponsoring agencies; negotiating contracts and other award agreements; accepting award documents; administering post-award non-accounting functions, including subawards, vendor agreements, no-cost extensions, and budget revisions; administering the Institutional Review Board for the protection of human research subjects; and administering the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee.




2012-2013 Funding Highlights

Funding History by College




Project Directors on Active and New Awards

Seventy-eight (78) faculty and 40 staff served as project directors or co-project directors on awards that were active during the 2013 fiscal year. Forty-three (43) faculty and 36 staff served as project directors on 109 separate new awards that began during the 2013 fiscal year. Fourteen (14) faculty and 3 staff served as first-time project directors on new awards in FY 2013.

Faculty and Staff Submitting Grant Proposals


Sixty-six (66) faculty and 29 staff submitted grant proposals during the 2013 fiscal year. Twenty-two (22) faculty and five staff submitted proposals for the first time in 2013. Faculty and Staff Submitting Proposals


College Funding by Department




College of Arts and Sciences



Funding by Function


The majority of funding (93%; \$41,755,675) for fiscal year 2013 was secured for "other sponsored activities," including service projects. A total of \$2,393,251 (5%) was secured for instruction projects, and \$901,280 (2%) was secured for organized research projects. The following graph depicts the dollar value of funding approved for organized research, instruction, and other sponsored activities.



Funding by Source of Funds

Awards from federal funds totaled \$27,662,219 which represents 61.40% of the total amount awarded to EKU during the 2013 fiscal year. The federal funding total includes funding awarded directly to the University from federal agencies as well as federal funding passed through the State of Kentucky, awarded through subawards from collaborating universities, and granted through other federal pass-through agencies. Notable federal agencies include the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the United States Department of Education, the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, and the Health Resources and Services Administration. State-funded awards represent 38.17% of total funding for fiscal year 2013 at \$17,195,911. Notable state agencies include the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Council on Postsecondary Education, Department of Justice, Department of Education, Department of Corrections, and Transportation Cabinet. The remaining 0.43% (\$192,136) of funding for fiscal year 2013 was awarded by local or

private sponsoring agencies, including associations and companies. The following graph illustrates the breakdown of federal, state, local, and private sponsoring agencies for fiscal year 2013.



The Year in Review . . . Looking Forward

Customer Service

Sponsored Programs seeks to enhance and facilitate the ability of faculty and staff to achieve their goals in supporting the University's multi-faceted goals by successfully competing for funding from external sponsoring agencies. To accomplish this goal, Sponsored Programs is responsible for a dual role focused on customer service and compliance. Our objective is to assist faculty and staff in developing quality proposals that will be competitive with applications submitted by other organizations to external grant programs while also ensuring that federal, state, sponsor, and University compliance regulations are followed.

In FY 2013, Sponsored Programs implemented simplified and more user-friendly forms for the internal review of grant proposals and budget revisions. New versions of the Internal Review and Approval Form (IRAF) and Budget Revision Request Form were developed with the goal of improving efficiency for project directors. The new forms require less information and include on-screen instructions for individual items that are sometimes confusing to project directors.

During the 2013 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs continued to update our website to include additional resources for faculty and staff interested in pursuing external funding. A new page with answers to Frequently Asked Questions was developed and will continue to be expanded during the 2014 fiscal year. Another resource improvement planned for FY 2014 is the development of budget worksheets to assist applicants in building budgets for specific federal sponsors.

Faculty Development

In the fall of 2008, Sponsored Programs began offering a professional development course on developing competitive grant proposals. The course is open to full-time EKU faculty and staff who plan to submit grant proposals to support projects to be conducted as part of EKU's mission. The goal is to provide technical assistance and access to resources in support of future grant proposal submissions, and additional one-on-one assistance is available from Sponsored Programs staff throughout and subsequent to the semester of participation. During the 2013 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs developed a new course resource webpage to provide convenient access to proposal development resources and sample documents. The course meeting schedule was also changed to incorporate weekly sessions for the first eight weeks of each semester rather than bi-weekly sessions for a 16-week period. The change has made a positive impact on participant attendance and engagement.

Sponsored Programs tracks grant activity for all participants beginning with the semester of participation in the course and going through a period of five years. The following table reflects the participation level since 2008 and results from subsequent grant proposal submissions through the end of the 2013 fiscal year.

Subawards/Vendor Agreements

A total of 165 subawards and vendor agreements with a value of \$7,331,007 were processed during the 2013 fiscal year for a variety of projects and tasks on externally-sponsored projects. Subawards totaled \$5,890,618, and vendor agreements totaled \$1,440,389. Early in the 2014 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs will implement a new web-based form for subaward and vendor agreement requests. The goal of the web-based form will be to improve efficiency for project directors and facilitate more complete submissions.

University Research Committee Grants

University Funded Scholarship (UFS) grants are competitively awarded based on the review and recommendations of the University Research Committee (URC) and provide support for faculty to engage in research, scholarship, and creative activities. Faculty may apply for up to \$3,000 for faculty mini-grants to support activities where resource needs are modest and in areas where opportunities for external funding are extremely limited. Faculty may apply for up to \$8,000 for major project awards as seed grants for the purpose of obtaining significant external funding. During the 2013 fiscal year, the URC awarded a total of \$48,133 to 10 faculty for a variety of projects. Funding was provided for 4 major project awards and 6 mini-grants.

Human Subjects Research Compliance

The Institutional Review Board (IRB) for the protection of human research subjects is responsible for reviewing all research activities involving human subjects conducted by EKU faculty, staff, or students or conducted by representatives from other organizations on EKU's campus. The mission of the IRB is to promote and safeguard research activity that involves human subjects within the academic community. During the 2013 fiscal year, 226 research protocols were submitted to the IRB. Of these protocols, 126 were classified as exempt from further review under the federal Office of Human Research Protections (OHRP) regulations. Seventy-five (75) were processed through expedited review, and 11 were approved after full convened meetings of the IRB. Eight (8) protocols were approved through authorization agreements with other university IRBs, and 13 protocols were withdrawn by the investigators at some point during the review process.

A total of 197 individuals served as principal investigators on IRB-approved projects, and 65 faculty served as primary research advisors on student projects. The average turn-around time for the review of new applications during FY 2013 was 11.57 calendar days from the date of Sponsored Programs' receipt of the application to the date on which the committee issued approval.

Early in the 2013 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs released new application forms as a way to streamline the application process by making requirements clearer for applicants. The forms have resulted in the need for fewer follow-up questions from reviewers and a more efficient review process. During the 2014 fiscal year, Sponsored Programs will work with a group of student programmers in the Computer Science department, who will seek to create a web-based program to handle the submission, review, approval, and reporting functions of the IRB.

Animal Care and Use Compliance

The mission of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is to promote and safeguard activities that involve animals within the academic community. Fourteen (14) protocols were approved by the IACUC during the 2013 fiscal year. These projects represent various types of research and instruction involving animal subjects undertaken by EKU faculty, staff, and students. A total of 13 individuals (6 faculty and 7 students) served as principal investigators on IACUC-approved projects, and 5 faculty served as primary research advisors on student projects. The average turn-around time for the review of new applications during FY 2013 was 35.57 calendar days from the date of Sponsored Programs' receipt of the application to the date on which the committee issued approval.
