

#### From the Editor..... September 2019



#### Daily Devotions 1000<sup>th</sup> Edition

Welcome back to the Bulletin. Your editor hopes you are all feeling refreshed and renewed after the summer break! (Though said editor is about to go off for a week to enjoy sun and sea on the Greek island of Lesbos. The joy of not being tied to school terms!)

On 23<sup>rd</sup> August the Daily Devotions, the United Reformed Church's (URC) series of digital daily Bible readings, reflections and prayers, reached its1000th edition.

The devotions are written by more than 100 people from across the denomination. More than 3,000 subscribers receive the inspirational readings in their inboxes at 6am each day, and hundreds more follow online at <a href="https://devotions.urc.org.uk/">https://devotions.urc.org.uk/</a>

Rev Andy Braunston, Minister of Barrhead, Priesthill, Shawlands and Stewarton URCs in the Synod of Scotland's Southside Cluster, created the project when ministering at Wilbraham St Ninians in 2016. He sent out his own reflections on the weekly lectionary readings to members of the congregation. This then evolved into the Devotions we know today.

He said: "I am so pleased that so many people both read the Devotions and have volunteered to write for them. Many people have commented that the devotions are a way in which the URC expresses a form of unity, each day, normally first thing in the morning, so many of us are reading, reflecting and praying about the same passage."

Because the devotions are written by a number of people across the URC, the divergent interpretations of scripture can be startling and refreshing, whether we agree with them or not.

More than 50% of subscribers recently took part in a survey which showed long-term engagement with the devotions, and a substantial number of new readers.

Almost 70% of readers were involved in a local URC and another 12% in an ecumenical church that included the URC. Roman Catholics, members of the Church of Scotland, Scottish Episcopal Church and the Church of England also read the devotions.

Around 45% of respondents felt the devotions were relevant almost every day to their own faith journeys and another 53% said they were often relevant.

"Given the diverse nature of our writers and our readers this is quite an achievement; especially as everyone involved is a volunteer," continued Andy.

"One of the most moving aspects of the feedback is that some people use the devotions as they can no longer get to church. This is sometimes due to illness or the fact their church has closed. In this small way the devotions allow people to keep contact with the spiritual tradition which has nurtured them for years."

The Daily Devotions are a great tool for local churches for use in small groups, Elders' meetings or even as sermon starters. They are also available in an A5 book for people to print off for those in their congregations who don't have access to the internet. Please let one of the Elders know if you feel you would like us to print the booklets for personal or church use.

The latest set of Devotions focus on Paul's Letter to the Romans, the longest and most influential of Paul's letters. It was a major influence on the Reformation, especially because of its teaching on 'justification by faith'. Although it was written for Christians in Rome many years ago, Paul's letter still helps us to deepen our understanding of the significance of the work of Christ in bringing the love and mercy of God to the whole of humanity.

It was with deep sadness that the death of **Rev Graham Cook** (1939 – 2019) was announced by the URC in August. Graham was the founding Director of the URC training centre at Windermere, then spent a decade as Moderator of Mersey Synod, retiring from that post in 2004. Graham was elected as Moderator of the URC General Assembly and served in that role from 1990-91. The family are holding a private cremation for Graham on 4<sup>th</sup> September in the morning, and a thanksgiving service will be held on the same day at 1.30pm at St John's URC, Wilderspool Causeway, Warrington, Cheshire WA4 6QE, to which all are welcome. ## Songs of Praise

In July 2016, the URC became the largest UK denomination to freely permit the celebration and registration of marriages of same-sex couples in its churches. Our friend, Rev Andy Braunston, made his second appearance on the *BBC Songs of Praise* episode broadcast on 18 August to tell Rev Kate Bottley how and why that vote allows individual congregations the choice to hold same-sex weddings. Rev Andy said that we in the URC believe that God has led us to a place where we can live together with disagreement and grace, saying that "if the church can model how to disagree well, we could teach the politicians a thing or two" (hear hear)! The episode focused on faith and marriage and featured the joyful wedding of two men who are members at Rutherglen URC.
