
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EVACUATION ROUTES

First Floor



Second Floor



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EMERGENCY REPORTING AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

Types of emergencies to be reported immediately by Kalitta Charters personnel are:

- EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC)
- MEDICAL
- FIRE
- SEVERE WEATHER
- BOMB THREAT
- CHEMICAL SPILL
- EXTENDED POWER LOSS
- VIOLENT/CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR
- BARRICADED SUSPECT
- STALKER/CRIMINAL/ ASSAULT/RAPE

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ACTIVATING THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC)


Location: Kalitta Air Simulator, Classroom 1

In the event the Communications Center must be evacuated, the shift supervisor will implement the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) plan. The shift supervisor will ensure that all on duty communications personnel evacuate the premises and report to the EOC. The shift supervisor will also ensure that phone calls are transferred to the EOC by selecting: call FWD, enter extension 7355, and select call FWD once again. This will allow for a continuous line of communication. Once the team is established in the EOC, the Director of Sales and Marketing Operations must be contacted at cell phone number 734-417-9004. The Director of Sales and Marketing Operations will initiate contacts per the Emergency Notification Chart.

It is the responsibility of the Director of Operations, in conjunction with the Director of Safety and Director of Sales and Marketing Operations, to assign and brief all required EOC personnel as soon as possible. When the EOC is active, the Director of Safety, a Communications Representative (typically the Shift Supervisor, and a Public Relations Representative will be available to each other at all times. In addition, the Director of Safety will ensure all personnel assigned to the EOC have a current copy of this manual and are following the procedures contained herein. The Director of Operations will ensure all personnel assigned to the EOC have the support and resources necessary to carry out their duties effectively.

If an off-site emergency exists and it is determined by the Director of Operations that the EOC should be partially or fully activated, the Director of Operations will notify the Director of Maintenance, Director of Safety, Director of Sales and Marketing Operations, and Director of Quality Control that he has activated the EOC. The EOC may be physically located in the

Communications Center or in the Kalitta Air Simulator building (shown above), as determined by the Director of Operations.

If an event is of such magnitude that the Kalitta Air Simulator building is not able to be utilized, the communications center will be transferred to the Kalitta Turbine facility (Tyler road). The turbine facility will be staffed by communications personnel at all times which will allow for a continuous line of communication within the organization.

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FIRE EMERGENCY

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- Activate the nearest Air horn.
- Notify the local Airport Emergency by calling 734.483.6700
- If the fire alarm or Air horn is not available, notify the site personnel about the fire emergency by the following means:

Voice	Radio
Communication	Other (specify)
Phone Paging	

Fight the fire ONLY if:

- The Fire Department has been notified.
- The fire is small and is not spreading to other areas.
- Escaping the area is possible by backing up to the nearest exit.
- The fire extinguisher is in working condition and personnel are trained to use it.

Upon being notified about the fire emergency, occupants must:

- Leave the building using the designated escape routes. (See Emergency Egress maps)
- Assemble in the designated area: (outside S.W. side of building)
- Remain outside until the Fire department authority announces that it is safe to reenter.

Emergency Coordinators:

- Coordinate an orderly evacuation of personnel.
- Perform an accurate head count of personnel reported to the designated area.
- Provide Emergency Rescue services with number of missing personnel and their last known whereabouts (i.e. stockroom).
- Provide the Fire Department personnel with the necessary information about the facility.

Emergency coordinators must:

- Ensure that all employees have evacuated the area/floor.
- Report any problems to the Safety Officials at the assembly area.

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EXTENDED POWER LOSS

In the event of extended power loss to the Kalitta Charters offices and hangar, the facility standby generator will power the flight following center. Emergency lighting will illuminates all passage ways and exits. Certain precautionary measures should be taken depending on the season and the environmental conditions:

- Unnecessary electrical equipment and appliances should be turned off in the event that power restoration would surge causing damage to electronics and effecting sensitive equipment.
- Facilities with freezing temperatures should turn off and drain the following lines in the event of a long term power loss.
 - Fire sprinkler system
 - Standpipes
 - Potable water lines
 - Toilets
- Add propylene-glycol to drains to prevent traps from freezing
- Equipment that contain fluids that may freeze due to long term exposure to freezing temperatures should be moved to heated areas, drained of liquids, or provided with auxiliary heat sources.

Upon Restoration of heat and power:

- Electronic equipment should be brought up to ambient temperatures before energizing to prevent condensate from forming on circuitry.
- Fire and potable water piping should be checked for leaks from freeze damage after the heat has been restored to the facility and water turned back on.

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CHEMICAL SPILL

The following are the locations of:

Spill Containment and Equipment: Located in Ground Power

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

MSDS: Located in the maintenance office

When a Large Chemical Spill has occurred:

- Immediately notify the Safety Department (734)502-6842 or Ext 7016.
- Do not attempt to clean the spill unless trained to do so.
- Secure the area and alert other site personnel.
- Attend to injured personnel and call the medical emergency number, if required.
- Contain the spill with available equipment if possible (spill kit e.g., pads, booms, absorbent powder, etc.).
- Call a local spill cleanup company or the Fire Department (if arrangement has been made) to perform a large chemical (e.g., mercury) spill cleanup.

Evacuate building as necessary

When a Small Chemical Spill has occurred:

- Notify the Safety Department.
- If toxic fumes are present, secure the area (with caution tapes or cones) to prevent other personnel from entering.
- Small spills must be handled in a safe manner, while wearing the proper PPE.
- Review spill cleanup procedures in Kalitta Charters Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures Plan and related MSDS found in the maintenance office.

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SEVERE WEATHER AND NATURAL DISASTERS

Tornado: Local township/city tornado sirens will sound

 When a warning is issued by sirens or other means for example contact made by the Willow Run control tower, seek inside shelter, away from windows. (see Emergency Egress Maps).

If unable consider the following:

- Small interior rooms on the lowest floor and without windows,
- Hallways on the lowest floor away from doors and windows, and
- Rooms constructed with reinforced concrete, brick, or block with no windows.
- Stay away from outside walls and windows.
- Use arms to protect head and neck.
- Remain sheltered until the tornado threat is announced to be over.
 - Small interior rooms on the lowest floor and without windows,
 - Hallways on the lowest floor away from doors and windows, and
 - Rooms constructed with reinforced concrete, brick, or block with no windows.

Blizzard:

If indoors:

- Stay calm and await instructions from the Emergency Coordinator or the Safety Department Official.
- Stay indoors!
- If there is no heat:
 - Close off unneeded rooms or areas.
 - Stuff towels or rags in cracks under doors.
 - Cover windows at night.
- Eat and drink. Food provides the body with energy and heat. Fluids prevent dehydration.
- Wear layers of loose-fitting, light-weight, warm clothing, if available.

If stranded in a car or truck:

- Stay in the vehicle!
- Run the motor about ten minutes each hour. Open the windows a little for fresh air to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Make sure the exhaust pipe is not blocked.
- Make yourself visible to rescuers.
 - Turn on the dome light at night when running the engine.
 - Tie a colored cloth to your antenna or door.
 - Raise the hood after the snow stops falling.
- Exercise to keep blood circulating and to keep warm.

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VIOLENT/CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR

Violent/criminal behavior, such as sniper, shooting, stalking, criminal assault, and rape are beyond the capabilities Kalitta Charters staff.

I. Guidelines in the Event of an Active Shooter

If Possible:

EXIT the building or area immediately NOTIFY others you may encounter of the danger CALL for help by dialing (734) 483-6700 from land line or 911 from cell phone INFORM the emergency services dispatcher of the following:

- Tell them there is an "Emergency"
- The location of the incident
- What is happening
- How many people are involved (shooters and victims) Your name, location, and phone number

The dispatcher may ask you to remain on the line until officers are on the scene

If you cannot safely exit the building:

GET to a room or office as far away from the incident as possible and lock the door COVER any door windows or windows facing the hallway KEEP QUIET and DO NOT answer the door

Call 9+911 and let the emergency services dispatcher know what is happening:

- Tell them there is an "Emergency"
- The location of the incident
- What is happening
- How many people are involved (shooters and victims)
- Your name, location, and phone number

STAY PUT until police can get to you, unless level of danger is increasing LOOK for means of escape (e.g., via a ground floor window) or self defense STAY OFF the phone so the dispatcher can contact you with information

Please be aware that if you are safely locked in an office, closet or classroom, police officers may take quite some time to get to you. This is because they will be trying to stop the threat. The fact that you do not hear or see officers right away may mean you are away from the immediate danger. Once rescued, follow the instructions of the police officer as they guide you to safety.



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GUIDELINES IN THE EVENT OF A BARRICADED SUSPECT

A. Immediately contact the Police YIP - (734) 483-6700 and Safety/Security at (734) 502-6842.

Give suspect's location

- If any hostages, how many?
- If any injuries.
- Description of suspect
- Type of weapon
- B. If there are any injured individuals, keep them calm and obtain the proper first aid assistance.
- C. Notify other employees of danger and to stay out of area.
- D. Do not reenter an evacuated building until the "all-clear" is given by Police.

Guidelines in the event of a Stalker/Criminal Assault/Rape

- A. Immediately contact the Police YIP (734)483.6700 and Safety/Security at (734) 502-6842.
- B. If there are any injured individuals, keep them calm and obtain the proper first aid assistance.
- C. Get an accurate description of the assailant (use the following worksheet):
 - Approximate Height
 - Approximate Weight
 - Hair Color
 - Facial Features
 - Clothes Description
 - Identify marks or accessories: tattoos. scars, glasses, etc.
- D. All incidents and/or injury must be documented. All information must be forwarded to the Safety/Security Department.
