


Target Audience

This course is designed for gastroenterologists, gastroenterology fellows, gastroenterology nurses and health technicians.

Objectives

At the completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Implement methods that improve adenoma detection.
- Manage large and difficult polyps and understand the optimal methods for detecting and managing dysplasia in IBD.
- Incorporate techniques for selective bile duct and pancreatic duct cannulation in practice.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the different options to manage common bile duct stones and hilar strictures.
- Apply different ablation techniques for dysplastic Barrett's esophagus and stenting options for esophageal strictures.
- Understand the advancements in diagnosis and management of Achalasia.
- Discuss the various diagnostic tools and management algorithms for pancreatic cysts.
- Recognize key elements of diagnosing, staging and managing pancreatic cancer.



Lodging


