This document contains guidance on the identification and placement process for newly arrived English language learners in your state. WIDA and your state education agency have worked together to provide this outline of policies, procedures, assessment options, test administrator training requirements, and criteria for placement in ELL services. This document is updated each spring and throughout the year per SEA request.

Questions/Topic	State-specific Guidance
Process Overview	 A Home Language Survey (HLS) must be completed for each student registering for enrollment. If any language other than English is listed on the student's HLS, they are a potential candidate for EL services. Local Education Agencies (LEA) may use the WIDA Screener for Kindergarten for kindergarten students and the WIDA Screener Online for students in grades 1-12. The proficiency level for WIDA Screener for Kindergarten is 4.5. The proficiency level for students taking the WIDA Screener Online is 5.0.

Initial Assessment and Identification

Timelines	Initial assessment of English language proficiency must be conducted within 30 days of enrollment for any student identified in the HLS who registers before or at the beginning of the school year and within 10 days for students who register after the beginning of the school year.
Home Language Survey	HLSs are administered once, at the time of student's enrollment. There is not a state mandated HLS. LEAs may use a HLS from Transact or they can create their own, but must include the following 5 questions: 1. Is a language other than English spoken at home? 2. Is your child's first language other than English? 3. What language did your child learn when he/she first began to speak? 4. What language does your child most frequently speak at home? 5. What is your child's country of origin? Any language other than English listed on the HLS results in administration of an English proficiency screener.
State Approved Assessments	LEAs may use the following: • WIDA Screener for Kindergarten • WIDA Screener Online for Grades 1-12 • WIDA Screener Paper for Grades 1-12 with ALSDE approval only, contact Susan Beard at sbeard@alsde.edu
Paper Based Screener Costs	WIDA Screener for Kindergarten test materials may be downloaded, free of charge, from the WIDA Secure Portal. Districts may also choose to purchase a professionally designed kit from the WIDA Store for a reasonable price. The WIDA Screener Online is free and can be accessed through the WIDA Assessment Management System (WIDA AMS). Log in credentials are required. Contact your System Test Coordinator to gain access to the WIDA Screener Online. The WIDA Screener Paper must be purchased from the WIDA store and the cost will be incurred by the LEA. LEAs are encouraged to use the WIDA Screener Online at no cost.

Identification/Placement Criteria

Identification Criteria:

The following factors should be considered:

- Scores from the screener
- Scores from classroom assignments/tests and content assessments (if applicable)
- Teacherjudgment
- Extenuating circumstances (student's age and quantity and quality of former schooling)

The following guidelines determine eligibility for placement in the English language instruction educational program:

- WIDA Screener Online: WIDA Screener Online is administered to students in second semester of Grade 1 Grade 12. Proficiency is a 5.0 composite score on all four domains. A score of 4.5 or below qualifies a student for language support services
- WIDA Screener for Kindergarten: Alabama uses the WIDA Screener for Kindergarten for students who are registering for kindergarten for the first time through the first semester of Grade 1. Only the Oral Language domains of Listening and Speaking will be administered. The proficiency score is 4.5 on these two domains. A score below 4.5 qualifies a student for language support services.

Students with disabilities will use the *Alabama State Department of Education Alternate Screening Checklist* until WIDA develops an Alternate Screener.

Exit Criteria:

Composite PL > 4.8 on ACCESS for ELLs.

State allows differentiated exiting for ELs with *significant cognitive disabilities* who participate on Alternate ACCESS for ELLs in the following cases:

- If an EL achieves a composite score of P1 or P2 on two consecutive administrations of the Alternate ACCESS for ELLs test, OR achieves the same proficiency level of A1, A2 or A3 for three consecutive administrations of the test, AND
- 2. The ESL committee and IEP committee both recommend reclassification and exiting from ESL services.

Other Useful Resources or Information

Parents should be notified no later than 30 days after the beginning of the school year of results of the screening and qualification of EL services.

Placement scores are not added into a state database, however, new ELs are reported as EL-1 or NOMPHLOTE in INOW/Chalkable.

There are no requirements to monitor students who do not qualify or just barely score above the minimum.

The WIDA Screener Online (Grades 1-12) may be used to rescreen former EL students to determine if language is a barrier to instruction. If language has been determined to be a barrier to instruction then the student may be placed back into the Language Instruction Educational Program.

ELL Services or Program	ALSDE does not prescribe the type of Language Instruction Educational Program model for LEAs to implement. ALSDE
Requirements	encourages LEAs to select a program after conducting a Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA) and set data-driven
	goals and strategies from the CNA. Each program must be based on sound educational theory.
	No parent/guardian approval is needed for EL services to begin, but notification must be provided to parents with information detailing the right of the parent to have their child immediately removed from supplemental Title III programs upon request.
	LEAs have the option to purchase WIDA MODEL to use an interim assessment. It is not required.
Declining Services	Notification information pertaining to parents' rights that includes written guidance detailing the right of the parent to have their child immediately removed from supplemental Title III programs upon request must be given. Refer to TransAct for Program Waiverforms . Log in credentials required.
	Parents may reject Title III supplemental services, but the students must participate in <i>ACCESS for ELLs</i> or <i>Alternate ACCESS for</i> ELLs, if applicable. Parents should be informed that their children will continue to receive appropriate classroom instruction that will bolster understanding of English and the curriculum.
	Scores from ACCESS for ELLs will be used to monitor students' progress.
