ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION

We are one third into the New Year and have almost reached the GER's ENF goal or \$4.65 per member. We are currently at \$4.18 per capita, that's a fantastic start. I would also like to thank Ed + Mary Ann Quintal and Charles Villa for their automatic donations throughout the year. If you would like to know more about setting up automatic donations please let me know and I will forward you the information or go too https://enf.elks. org/donate.

In 2016-2017, the Elks National Foundation will distribute \$27.3 million to help Elks build stronger communities by investing \$9.8 million in Community Investment Program grants for Elks Lodges to invest directly in their local communities. The ENF will allocate \$9.1 million to help State Associations accomplish their charitable objectives.

The ENF will continue to further the education of our country's future leaders by allocating \$4.2 million in scholarship assistance. The ENF designated \$729,330 to fund Drug Awareness and \$952,760 to run the Elks National Hoop Shoot Free Throw Program, encouraging youth to lead healthy and active lives. In addition, the Elks National Foundation designated \$1.464 million to fund the Order's Veterans Service Program.

Keep up the great support that you all have been providing.

NATIONAL CONVENTION HI-LITES

The Convention in Houston had many exciting moments. Meeting the National Hoop Shoot Champions Camden Cowgill from San Antonia, Texas and Reagan Ponzer from Atchison, Kansas started off the Convention as they



spoke of their journey to the National Finals held in Chicago. Then I met the Most Valuable Student winners, Nadya Okamoto of Oregon, and Jay Little of Mississippi. Nadya will be attending Harvard, and Jay will be attending the University of Alabama. Their own words sum up why they received the awards: "Becoming and Elks scholar means that I have an opportunity to give back to others and touch the lives of so many people, exemplifying service before self." Their speeches drew a standing applause from the over 7000 who were in attendance.

At the Legislative meeting there were 12 articles discussed. All passed but a few are subject to Lodge Ratification and will be posted in next month's bulletin. A few that did pass suggested that a Lodge, by By-Law, may set the reinstatement fee to any amount it wants or eliminate it altogether; a Lodge, by By-Law, may set the initiation fee to any amount it wants or eliminate it altogether; to clarify that a widow or widower of a deceased Member, who subsequently remarries, is not eligible for an identification card.

All proposals and their results are posted on the Lodge bulletin board.

One of the key events of the convention was the election of Mike Zellen of the Saugus Everett Lodge as our Grand Exalted Ruler or National President. The ceremonial parade was one of the best I've witnessed, perhaps since our own Ed Mahan was elected GER in 1995. He and Dona will represent our Commonwealth very well as the journey throughout the country. We wish them great success and they have our support.

After GER Mike's Installation came the Installation of the District Deputies. We wish Paul McClellan and his Esquire Mark Ellis the best of luck n the year ahead.
