When I went inside the bookstore, I saw that they sell many things there. Students can buy textbooks for their classes, and they can also buy supplies like notebooks, calculators, and pencils. Some teachers want students to use blue books or DataLink forms for assignments and for tests. Students can buy them at the bookstore, too. Something interesting or unusual about the bookstore is that it also sells food. There are drinks and small snacks for students to buy. They also sell clothes that say "Grossmont College." Students can get so many things they need there!

Every student should know where the bookstore is because they will need to go there sooner or later.

3. Location on campus (you can show it on the map) and when it opens and closes if you have that information.
4. Describe the place and talk about things that students can do there.
5. Make sure you end by saying why you think students should know about this place and thank your audience before ending.

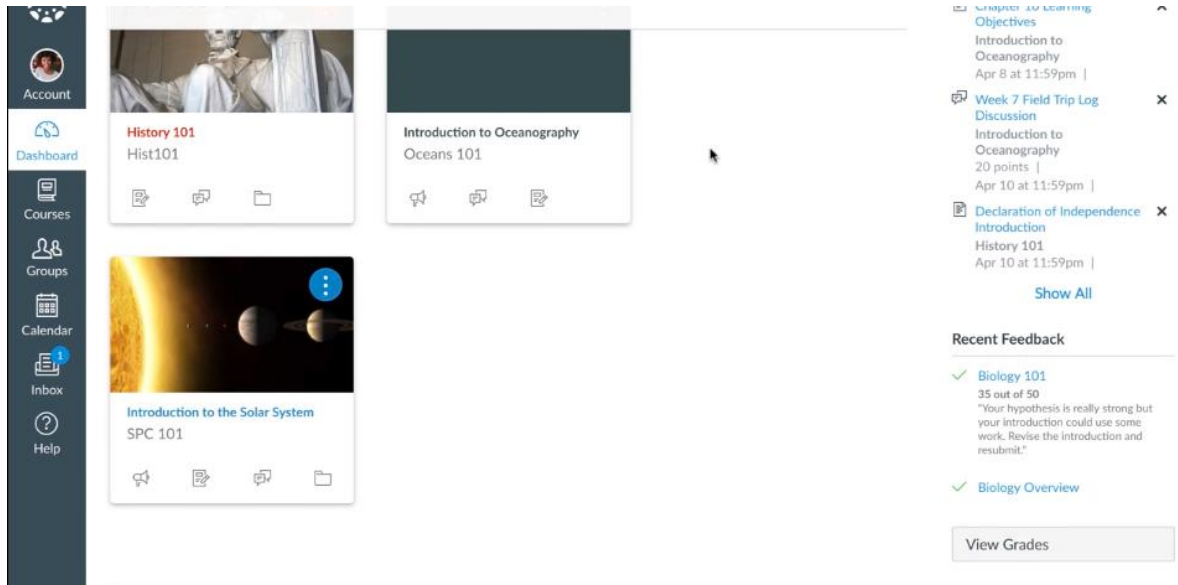
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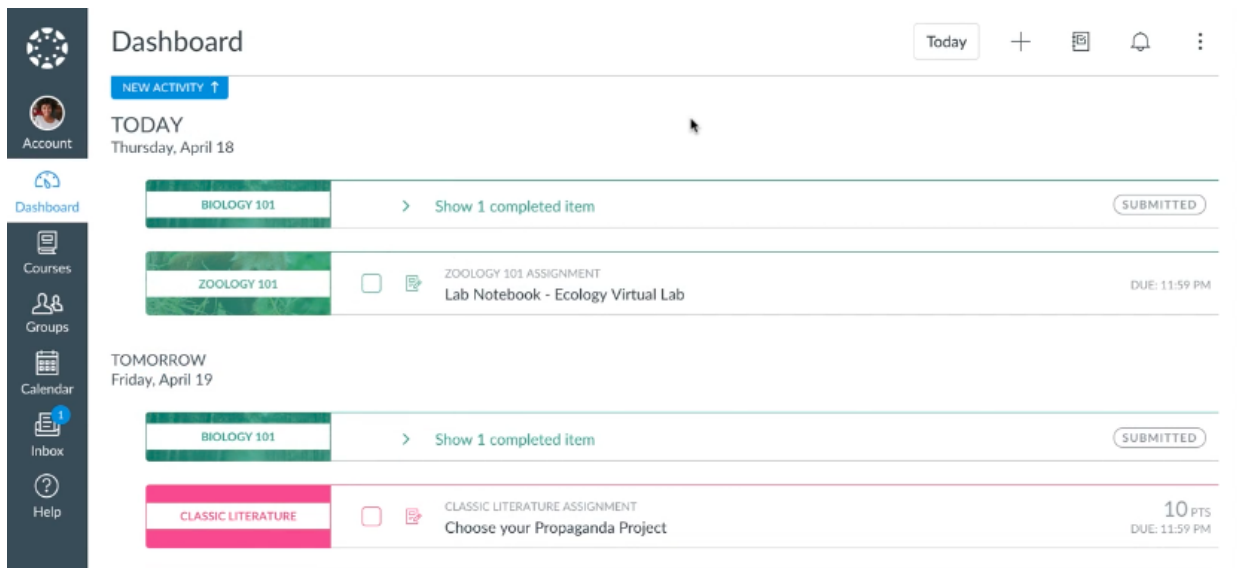
