Non-coffee drinkers can enjoy other local drinks like *teh tarik*, which refers to milk tea that is "pulled" from cup to cup to achieve a frothy head. You can also try *bandung*, which is condensed or evaporated milk added to rose syrup, or Milo dinosaur—iced Milo (chocolate malt beverage) topped with a heap of Milo powder.

Take your pick from different types of bak kwa (barbequed meat slices) from Lim Chee Guan (203 New Bridge Road) and nonya (Peranakan*) cakes from Bengawan Solo (ION Orchard #B4-38). Cookie lovers should check out The Cookie Museum (Marina Square Shopping Mall #02-280) with their Singaporean-flavoured confections, while home cooks will love Batu Lesung (COMO Market Place, Block 17 Dempsey Road), which offers local spices and pastes in travel-friendly sachets.

* The term is an Indonesian/Malay word that means "local born", which generally refers to people of Chinese and Malay/ Indonesian heritage.





Check out hip boutiques on Singapore's most colourful street

Situated in the heritage district of Kampong Glam, Haji Lane houses an eclectic mix of boutiques within its colourful shophouses. Singapore's narrowest street offers everything from eclectic handcrafted homeware to vintage fashion accessories, which will delight even the most discerning shopper. If you fancy traditional made-to-order garments and decorations, head over to neighbouring Arab Street to discover more unique finds.

Enjoy 24-hour shopping

Hardcore shoppers will be delighted to know that retail therapy is available in Singapore 24/7! Take your pick from a variety of Japanese products at Don Don Donki (Orchard Centreal Level B1 & B2) and explore the many aisles of Mustafa Centre (145 Syed Alwi Road), which span across three buildings.






Be inspired by Singaporean designers who are chasing their passions

Take a stroll around Singapore's first and only UNESCO World Heritage Site

Singapore's first UNESCO World Heritage Site is a stimulating recreational venue that can be enjoyed by both young and old. Admire over 60,000 orchids and other plants in The National Orchid Garden and let your kids learn through play at Jacob Ballas Children's Garden. Be sure to visit the SBG Heritage Museum too, which features interactive and multimedia exhibits that will bring visitors through the Gardens' rich heritage.






A Noodle Story 🞯
