





Dinosaur feelings!

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Included Journal cover page • Included dinosaur journal page • Pencil/pen/marker/crayon/colored pencil • Included Dinosaur Word Chart 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Locate the attached paper titled “Journal” 2. Read the journal prompt at the top of the page to your child. 3. Have your child draw a picture in response to the prompt. 4. Using the blank lines at the bottom of the page, the student may write a description of what they drew OR an adult may write in that space for them. 5. Take a look at the Dinosaur Word Chart page and see if your child can copy some of the words onto their journal page to go with their picture. 6. When you are finished, add the dinosaur journal page to the included journal cover page. Your child can write their name and color/decorate the cover

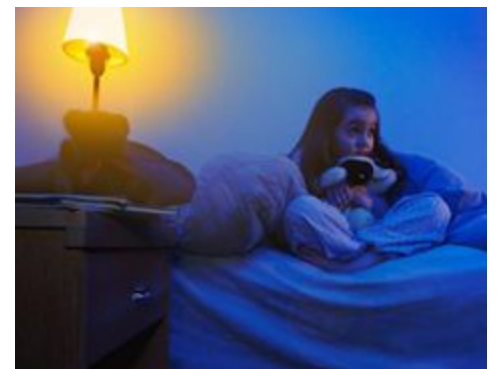
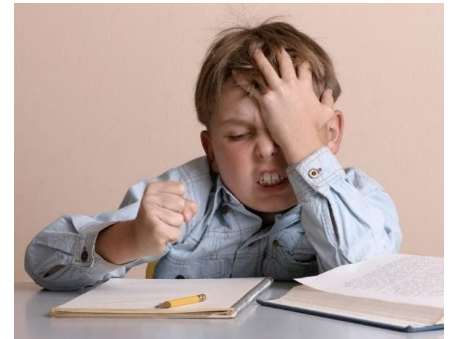

It's a volcano! Art



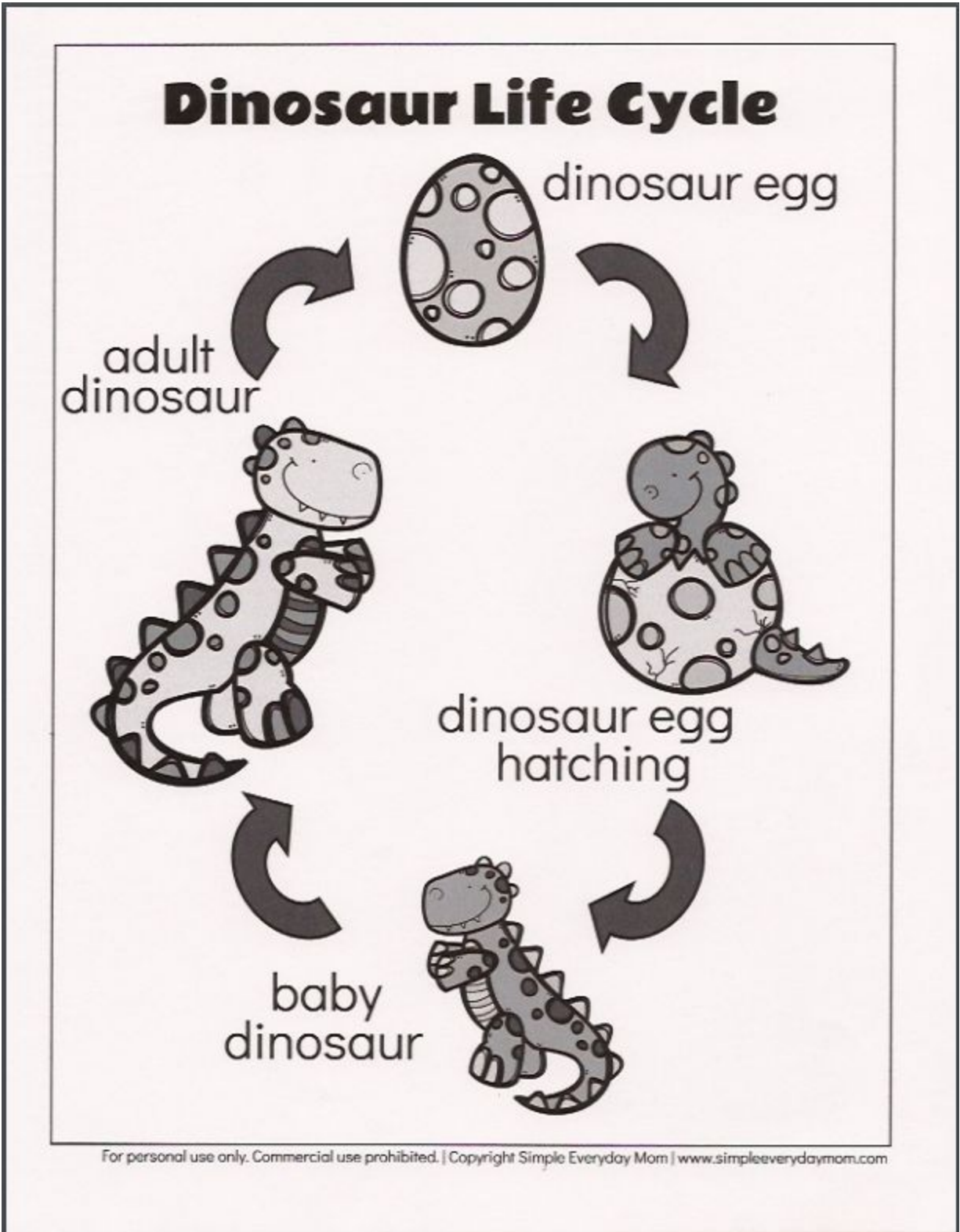
Materials:

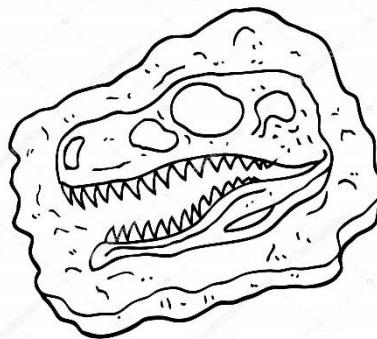
Dinosaur Word Chart

bone



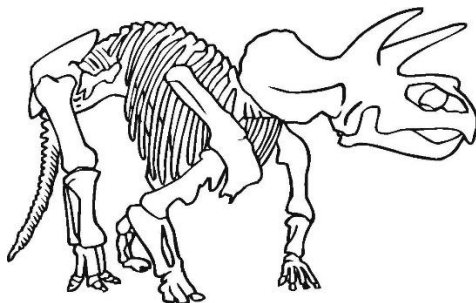
Bones protect other body parts.

Fossil



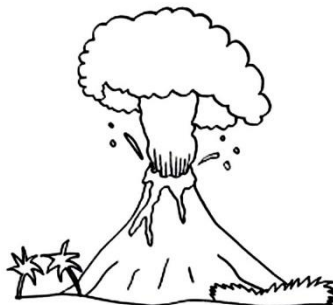
Fossils are traces of plants and animals that lived long ago.

skeleton



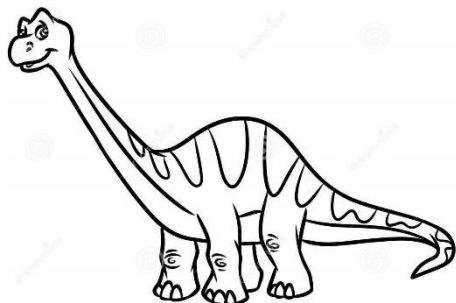
The **skeleton** protects important internal organs like the brain, heart and lungs.

volcano



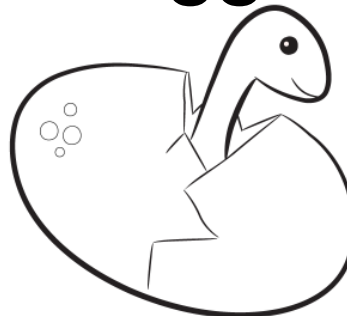
Volcano is a mountain with a large hole at the top through which lava is forced out.

herbivore



Herbivore is an animal or dinosaur that eats plants.

egg



An **egg** is an oval object, often with a hard shell and contains a baby animal.
