RECIPE FOR THE MONTH

Leek & Fennel Soup

Please note: Our recipes are chosen by the season of the vegetables.

Ingredients

- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 3 large leeks, cleaned and thinly sliced
- 4 large stalks celery, thinly sliced
- 3large white onions, peeled and halved
- 1 large fennel bulb, thinly sliced
- 2 large baking potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2 in cubes
- 1 Tablespoon salt
- 1 1/2 Teaspoons ground black pepper
- 8 cups chicken broth
- 2 cubes vegetable bouillon

Directions

- In a large saucepan over medium-low heat, place the olive oil, leeks, celery, onions, fennel, potatoes, salt, and pepper, and cook and stir until the onions are translucent and the vegetables have begun to soften, about 10 minutes.
- Pour 8 cups of chicken broth over the vegetables, bring to a boil, reduce the heat, and drop in the vegetable bouillon cube. Simmer over low heat, stirring occasionally to dissolve the cubes, until the vegetables are tender and the potatoes have begun to thicken the soup, bout 30 minutes.

COMING OR GOING, THIS STUDEBAKER COLLECTS SMILES

With airplane styling, a 1950 Champion Starlight has powerful appeal, even if its engine is toned down By A.J. Baime

In every town, there's a community of people into old cars. Most people don't even know it's there, but if you plug into it, you meet the most interesting and helpful individuals. There's always something to do; pick any night of the week and there's an event somewhere. And everyone you meet has a story about their car.

Even at these gatherings, however, few people have seen anything like my Studebaker.

The car-a 1950 Champion Starlight-was originally designed with all kinds of aviation-inspired details. At the time, not long after World War II, Detroit's auto industry was enthralled by airplanes, specifically one called the P-38 Lightning. Cars came with airplane-like hood ornaments, and Cadillac's and Chryslers had huge aviation-inspired tail fins. Studebaker designers were keen on taking those design cues a step further.

They built a big chrome bullet-nose into the front of the car, clearly modeled after the nose of an airplane. The rear window looks like the cockpit of a fighter plane. People have often said: When you look at the window, you can't tell if the car's coming or going.

The owner before me turned this Studebaker into an art car, teasing out the car's aviation heritage. He painted it gleaming silver. Then he found a model kit that had all the correct markings of the P-38 Lightning and had the decals blown up in vinyl. He pasted those decals onto the car. He also had some 750 rivet decals created at a local graphics shop. (People often run their hands over the rivets because they think they're real, but they're not.)

Strangers come up and ask:"Does this car fly?!" I always say, "No, we had to get rid of the airplane engines because we couldn't afford the fuel."

Other than the paint and decals, the car is pretty much stock-original interior, original six-cylinder engine.

When driving, the Studebaker feels like a granny car. It's certainly not going to reach any take-off speed. But all around you, people stop and smile. You feel like you're cruising around, making people's day.

Notice that we do not say you must own a Studebaker auto or truck - even if you're just interested in Studebakers, come join us!


Our membership is widely distributed throughout Florida. In order that all members have some meetings near them, meetings are held in various locations in the Tampa area.

The first meeting was held on July 9, 1972, coinciding with the first Florida car meet held at the Seminole Plaza in Casselberry, Florida. In attendance were Mr. & Mrs. Robert Miles, Mr. & Mrs. Carl Beckett, Mr. & Mrs. Richard Simmons, Robert Kegebin, Kenneth Perry, Mr. & Mrs. Floyd Holland and their two daughters, Mr. Tony Roth, Mr. M.F. Noffsinger, Mr. McLaughlin, Mrs. Evelyn Schwannecke and Mr. & Mrs. Russell J. Thomas.

The second meeting was held on October 15, 1972. Mr. John Ernst was in attendance and presented Russell the new chapter charter.

The next meeting was the official first meeting of the newly chartered Central Florida Chapter of the Studebaker Drivers Club on January 24, 1973.

YOUR NEW DIMENSION IN MOTORING...

Harold Churchill was a Studebaker man from the old school. An engineer by profession, he had joined Studebaker in 1926 & worked his way up the ladder. He became President of the Studebaker-Packard Corporation in 1956 upon the departure of James Nance. During the early days of Churchill's tenure, Curtiss- Wright had a management contract & SP was in dire straits...and very nearly went out of business. It fell to Churchill in a series of cost-cutting moves to terminate the lease on Studebaker's Los Angeles factory & to phase out Packard as an automaker. The latter was probably an easy decision to make from a financial point of view, but no doubt a difficult one to make from an emotional perspective. At about the same time that Packard disappeared, SP concluded a distributorship agreement with Daimler-Benz, and a diversification plan was begun in earnest (a plan which would turn the company into a conglomerate and eventually save it from dissolution).

Production for 1957 & 1958 was a disaster, but sometimes it's darkest just before the dawn. In a crash program, Churchill got a jump on the Big Three and brought out the 1959 Lark in the fall of 1958. By offering a compact with the roominess of a larger car and at a great price, Studebaker-Packard, for maybe the only time in its brief corporate existence, was in the right place at the right time with the right product at the right price. And Harold Churchill the engineer saw to it that the production delays and quality control problems of previous years were avoided. All of this translated into a \$28 million profit for the 1959 model year. WOW!

The advertising theme was "Your New Dimension in Motoring", and the main introductory ad portrayed Mr. Churchill himself proudly introducing the new car along the same lines that Lee lacocca would push his K cars 20 years later. It was a great time for Studebaker & South Bend. It was like the home team down by 2 winning on a home run in the bottom of the 9th with 2 outs.

The compact Lark was offered in 4 body styles (a 2 door sedan, a 4 door sedan, a 2 door hardtop, and a 2 door station wagon). Production of the 1959 Lark exceeded 130,000 units. Although the company would never again reach this level of production, incredibly exciting things were still to come...and all of it made possible by the success of the Lark.
