Arsenic and Old Lace Auditions Announced

FFP is pleased to announce auditions for the December production of Arsenic and Old Lace by Joseph Kesselring.

Arsenic and Old Lace opened on Broadway in 1941. It was an immediate hit and has continued to be one of the most popular American plays for over 70 years. The story revolves around the two charming old maid Brewster sisters. Abby and Martha pursue a mission of mercy by helping homeless and lonely men escape a life of sadness by poisoning them and burying the bodies in the cellar. Assisted by Teddy, a brother who believes he is Theodore Roosevelt, all goes well until nephew Mortimer discovers one of the bodies. To further complicate matters, an unexpected visit by brother Jonathan, a serial killer, and his intoxicated friend, Dr. Einstein, throws the family into even more turmoil.

Arsenic and Old Lace was the first production staged in our theatre at 300 W. Sandusky St. on October 17, 1968. It has presented four times at FFP: in 1968, 1986, 2000 & 2010.

"OCTA Rocks" was the theme for this year's Ohio Community Theatre Association annual conference. Thespians from Ohio and beyond gathered over the Labor Day weekend in Worthington, Ohio, at the Crowne Plaza North to celebrate OCTA's 65th anniversary.

There were 363 people registered for the weekend with 120 of those being first-time attendees. They could watch 14 excerpts invited to perform at state from the 41 presented at

the six regionals held over the course of the summer. After each excerpt, a panel of three adjudicators each gave three-minute critiques to the cast and crew. These critiques often include ways that could possibly improve the production. The excerpts can also give a look into plays and musicals that theaters might want to see performed in their local theater. This year, attendees were treated to comedies, dramas, and musicals.

When attendees were not watching the excerpts, there were also sixteen different workshops available. During the annual meeting on Saturday, board members and delegates voted to accept the redistricting plan to go to eight regions

instead of the current six. The two new regions will be East and North. The eight regions will be Northwest, North, Northeast, West, Central, East, Southwest, and Southeast. This was done to make each region more similar in size. This coming year will not change, as many things have to be set in place. The election for the board was also held. Northwest members of the board are Joe Barton (President), Millie Butts, Grant Perry, Jason Niemeyer, Jesse Bernal, and Michelle Johnson.

During the evening hours, there were games, parties, an MTI sing-a-long and, of course, time to catch up with OCTA friends. On Sunday evening there was a banquet, as well as a 50s dance, costume contest, and games.



At the Monday breakfast buffet, awards were presented for all areas of theater. FFP's season brochure, designed by Brad & Erica Bickhart, received a Merit in Brochure Design. The playhouse's website, created by J.R. Smith and maintained by J.R. Smith and George Rustemeyer, received awards for Merit in use of Graphics, Excellence in Use of OCTA Logo, and Outstanding in Digital Content. In my role as *Fortell* editor, I received awards for Excellence in OCTA News, Outstanding in Use of Graphics and Photography, Outstanding in Masthead Design and Layout, Outstanding in Writing and Overall Quality, and 1st Place Overall Newsletter Design.

In my role as OCTA Delegate, I received an award for Outstanding Delegate of the year for the NW Region. Several awards were received by other NW theaters and the NW


