

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This symposium will provide a multidisciplinary forum on the differential diagnosis, common etiologies, and state-of-the-art treatment options for facial pain. Attendees will receive information on how to face common presentations and disease entities but also more challenging cases.








COURSE LOCATION
