ECWGG Golf Team is looking for team members for this 2019 season. There are eight clubs competing in COWTG (Central Oregon Women's Team Golf). Those clubs include Eagle Crest, Juniper,

Crooked River Ranch, Bend Country Club, Prineville Country Club, Widgi, Sunriver and Awbrey Glen. The cost for the individual player, is the purchase of a team shirt, a payment of \$45-\$50 to the host club for a continental breakfast, golf, cart, lunch and birdie balls. There were 14 ladies on the 2018 roster. We would like to increase that number. To be eligible, one must be a member of ECWGG, listing Eagle Crest as their home course, have an index under 25 or be willing to play to an index of 25 and play with ECWGG on Days Play at least 30 days prior to the match. The six lowest handicap indexes of those who are eligible and available to play at the particular match will be selected. One or two alternates will be selected for each match in the event there is an emergency, illness or injury. Last year everyone who was available and eligible either played or was an alternate. The game is partner best ball match play, where the best gross and net score of the partners is recorded for each hole. Please take this opportunity into consideration by becoming an ECWGG team member. You will be able to meet ladies of like abilities plus play on the area courses at a reduced rate. Posting Golf Scores Accurately

Handicap Chair Linda Kelly



With Golf Genius, posting scores for Day's Play events is done for you. All you need to remember is not to post your score for these events. As your Handicap Chair, scores are checked for this error and will be corrected.

Golfing outside of day's play is where this will apply:

- 1 Post all scores that qualify to keep an accurate reflection of your ability.
- 2 Post within 3 days unless the 1st or the 15th of the month comes sooner as scores need to be posted before the revision date.
- 3 Remember to adjust scores to your course handicap, not your index. The ESC conversion table is in your handbook.
- 4 Play according to the rules of golf.
- Post a 9-hole score when at least 7 are played on either the front or back 9. Post an 18-hole score when at least 13 holes are played.
- 6 Post any score played during an active season for golf for the location of the golf course.

Please contact your handicap chair anytime a correction needs to be made to your posting of any score that is incorrect or posted twice. Also, contact your handicap chair if you have any questions!







RELIEF FROM A PENALTY AREA

Question: How do I take relief from a yellow or red penalty area?

Answer: When you take relief from a penalty area, you get **one** penalty stroke. For yellow penalty areas, you have two relief options. For red penalty areas, you have three relief options (the same two relief options as you do for yellow, plus one additional option.) For a yellow penalty area, you may take relief by dropping into a relief area using (1) the spot at which your last stroke was made under stroke and distance, Rule 17.1d(1) or (2) the back-on-the-line relief procedure, Rule 17.1d(2). For a red penalty area, you have the two above options, plus an additional option to take lateral relief. Lateral relief allows you to drop a ball into a relief area measured from where your ball last crossed the edge of the red penalty area. From that reference point, you are allowed to drop outside the penalty area and anywhere within **two** club-lengths of that spot, no nearer to the hole Rule 17.1d(3).

REMEMBERING SHARON LOBERG


