Hydrogen Sulfide (H2S) \$595.00

Date/Times: TBA

This course provides comprehensive training on the hazards associated with H2S and their required protective measures. Participants will learn the properties and characteristics, respiratory protection requirements, gas detection, emergency response, and current H2S technology. Hands-on exercises and equipment demonstrations are included. The requirements in the ANSI Z390.1, Accepted Practices for Hydrogen Sulfide Training, American Petroleum Institute (API) Recommended Practices, and Federal H2S regulatory standards are also covered. This course is designed for personnel working in the petroleum industry, municipalities, utilities, research and development laboratories, transportation, paper/pulp/food processing, and chemical manufacturing companies.



Concurrent courses are <u>credit</u> courses that may be taken as <u>non</u>-credit or continuing education. Most credit courses, subject to approval and space availability, fit into this category. CEU's will be awarded for successful completion of classes. Concurrent courses are not applicable for CREDIT CERTIFICATION. ACCOUNTING

Introduction to Accounting

(ACNT 1403)

A study of analyzing, classifying and recording business transactions in a manual and computerized environment.

Emphasis on understanding the complete accounting cycle and preparing financial statements, bank reconciliation and payroll.

AIR CONDITIONING & HEATING

Basic Electricity

(HART 1401)

Principles of electricity as required by HVAC, including proper use of test equipment, electrical circuits, and component theory and operation. The class will begin with basic electricity and progress through the study of transformers, power distribution, electric motors, motor controls and circuitry. The student will be introduced to the proper operation of various electrical meters and test instruments. This course, and HART 1407, must be taken first as the perquisite to all HART classes.

Refrigeration Principles

(HART 1407)

An introduction to the refrigeration cycle, basic thermodynamics, heat transfer, temperature/pressure relationship, safety refrigeration containment metering devices, and refrigeration components. The student will learn proper soldering and brazing techniques using oxy-acetylene and air-acetylene. The student will also be introduced to the proper use of hand tools and test instruments required in both service and installation.

AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY COMPUTER GRAPHICS

Automotive Brake Systems

(AUMT 1310)

Operation and repair of drum/disc type brake systems. Emphasis on safe use of modern equipment. Topics include brake theory, diagnosis and repair of power, manual, anti-lock brake systems, and parking brakes.

May be taught manufacturer specific. Prerequisite: AUMT 1305 or instructor approval.

Automotive Electrical Systems

(AUMT 1307)

An overview of automotive electrical systems including topics in operational theory, testing, diagnosis, charging and starting systems and electrical accessories. Emphasis on electrical schematic diagrams and service manuals. May be taught manufacturer specific. Prerequisite: AUMT 1305 or instructor approval.

Concurrent Courses cont.

COMPUTER GRAPHICS

Basic Computer-Aided Drafting

(DFTG 1309)

An introduction to basic computer-aided drafting. Emphasis is placed on drawing setup; creating and modifying geometry; storing and retrieving predefined shapes; placing, rotating, and scaling objects, adding text and dimensions, using layers, coordinating systems; as well as input and output devices. Co-requisite: DFTG 1305. Software: AUTOCAD 2007.

Introduction To Tech Animation & Rendering

(ARTV 1302)

This course introduces the basic terminology and concepts associated with the development of computer modules used in technical computer animation. Topics include basic animation principles, model creation, light sources, camera positioning, rendering as well as importing and modification of external files. Course projects reflect current practices in the architectural, engineering, or construction disciplines. Prerequisite: ARTV 2340 Software: 30 Studio, MAX, AUTODESK, VIZ.

Technical Drafting

(DFTG 1305)

Introduction to the principles of drafting to include terminology and fundamentals, including size and shape descriptions, projection methods, geometric construction, sections, auxiliary views, and reproduction processes.

ENERGY TECHNOLOGY

Introduction to Petroleum Industry

(PTRT 1301)

This course is an introduction to the various aspects of the petroleum industry including equipment, systems, instrumentation, operations, and the various scientific principles. Students will identify the concepts of exploration, production, refining, marketing, and transportation.

Basic Mechanical Skills for Energy

(ENER 1330)

This course covers industrial tool use and maintenance, lubrication, measuring, threads and fasteners, bench works, basic mechanical drawings, and basic shop calculations (English and Metric).

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Business Computer Applications

(BCIS 1405)

Computer terminology, hardware, software, operating systems, and information systems relating to the business environment. The main focus of this course is on business applications of software, including word processing, spreadsheets, databases, presentation graphics, and business-oriented utilization of the Internet. This course is designed for business majors who plan to transfer to a four year school.

Integrated Software Applications

(ITSC 1409)

Integration of applications from popular business productivity software suites. Instruction in embedding data, linking and combining documents using word processing, spreadsheets, databases, and/or presentation media software. The student will use word processing, spreadsheet, database, and/or presentation media software; and demonstrate ability to apply integration techniques and produce combined documents.

WELDING

Introduction To Welding Fundamentals

(WLDG 1421)

An introduction to the fundamentals of equipment used in oxy-acetylene welding and shielded metal arc welding (SMAW), including welding and cutting safety, basic oxy-acetylene welding and cutting, basic arc welding processes and basic metallurgy. The student will demonstrate safety procedures associated with equipment; and identify errous and nonferrous metals.

Residential Wiring - Must complete 4,000 hours on-the-job training supervised by master electrician or residential wireman and pass the TDLR residential wireman exam.

Journeyman Electrician - Must complete 8,000 hours on-the-job training supervised by licensed master electrician and pass TDLR journeyman electrician exam.

Master Electrician - Must complete minimum of 12,000 hours on-the-job training supervised by master electrician, held journeyman license for at least two years and pass the TDLR master electrician exam.



Each Continuing Education class has a minimum student enrollment requirement that has to be met in order for the class to make. Paid students that are enrolled in a cancelled course will be issued a refund check from our accounting department. No cash refunds will be issued.

Students will receive a 100% refund (less a \$10 processing fee) if they drop prior to the first class day; they will receive an 80% refund (less \$10) if they drop before the second class. With the exception of extenuating circumstances, students will not receive a refund for a one-day class if they drop on the day of the class.

No refunds will be given after the second class day. It is the student's responsibility to cancel their registration. Please allow 30 days for refund processing.

TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees must be paid in full by 12:00 PM (noon) two business days prior to the first class day. Some departments may require payment earlier. Students need to verify, at time of registration, when their payment will be due. Students will only be contacted if a course is cancelled or if any changes are made to the course information originally published in the CE schedule. Tuition and fees are based on the number of course hours, instruction costs, equipment and building use.

ADDITIONAL FEES

Out-of-state fees may apply and will be noted in course information, An out-of-state resident is defined as any US citizens, 18 years of age or older, who have not been a resident of Texas 12 months prior to registration.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Please note: if you have a prior balance, a hold, which prevents registration, will be placed on your account. You must contact the cashier's office at 432-685-4531 and resolve the issue BEFORE being permitted to register for Continuing Education courses.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

A social security number is required to identify students' permanent records. The Midland College registration system automatically encrypts a student's SS# into a student identification number. The student ID # is used for all internal printed material and provides additional protection of a student's privacy. Students are urged to become familiar with their ID # and to use it when communicating with MC offices. Students are requested to provide their SS# to the College for maintenance of their student records; it also allows the College to meet federal and state reporting requirements.

CEUS

CE classes qualify eligible participants to receive CE Units (CEUs). The CEU is a nationally recognized standard of measurement earned for participation in qualified programs. One unit is awarded for every 10 hours of instruction. Upon successful completion of a qualified course, the participant will receive a Midland College certificate with awarded hours and CEUs. After eligible courses are graded, official transcripts will be available, All transcript requests must be submitted in writing or in person to the Continuing Education Department. In most cases, a certificate of completion will be provided for graded CE courses. With the exception of certain seminars, short courses, and customized contract courses, the cost of certificates is included in the course fee. There is a \$15 fee for each additional or replacement certificate requested.

TEXTBOOK/SUPPLIES

Unless otherwise noted, books and supplies are not included in the tuition costs. Some courses require the purchase of special books or equipment. Supply lists are provided at the time of registration or on the first class day. MC bookstore hours are Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. - 7:00p.m., and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. For more information call (432) 685-4546.

PARKING PERMITS
