### Most Merciful Jesus Catholic Church Update




Mercy Parish began its journey on July 1, 2016 at Mill Creek Elementary School. The property at Segers Road was blessed on June 12, 2016 by Father Joy and the Parish Coordination Committee. ground breaking ceremony was subsequently held on August 21, 2016 with visiting Priests from St. John's, Queens, St. Paul's and St. Joseph's Parishes. Since then, the Multi-Purpose Building (MPB) that will serve as Church, Parish Life Center, and facilitate Religious Education for Mercy Parish has begun to rise on Segers Road, and is set for completion by July 2017. The building of the MPB marks the first phase of a four-phase campaign for bringing the Segers Road campus vision to a reality over the next few years. Mercy Parish was blessed to have the support of \$500,000 from St john the Baptist Catholic Church and \$120,000 from the Diocese of Birmingham. These gracious gifts enabled Mercy Parish to secure financing for the initial buildout of the MPB. Mercy Parish has also been blessed with a rapid growth of Parish members and their generous financial support. As of November I,


2016 we were just shy of 200 families and 500 members. And... as we will continue to grow, it is time for Mercy Parish to embark on a capital campaign to meet our current loan obligation of \$1,600,000 for the initial construction of the MPB. In addition, the capital campaign will begin to secure the necessary funds to resource and/or finance an additional \$1,400,000 to complete the buildout of the MPB as soon as possible.

"Mercy and Stewardship by All for the Good of All" is our Parish theme for this campaign. In that vein, all Parish members are called to contribute to the level they feel they can. All contributions will be graciously and sincerely appreciated, just as those who labored in the vineyard for only a short while versus those who labored all day, all will receive God's grace and mercy for whatever they can contribute to the capital campaign. Come; join us in the vineyard... In December, a campaign pamphlet with more information will follow this introduction.



From the moment of our founding in 1882, charity has been the first principle of the Knights of Columbus. We are men of faith and men of action.

In 2014, we set new records in charitable giving for the 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Our charitable contributions increased in 2014 by more than \$3.4 million over the previous year to a record \$173,550,680. In addition, we achieved our highest level of charitable service, volunteering more than 71.5 million hours. The number of service hours contributed by members rose in 2014 by more than a million hours over the 2013 total, with each member donating nearly a full workweek on average.

Our charitable activities encompass an almost infinite variety of local, national and international projects. From international charitable partnerships with Special Olympics, the Global Wheelchair Mission and Habitat for Humanity to our own Food for Families and Coats for Kids projects and other purely local charities, the opportunity to work together with fellow Knights and their families is virtually endless.

We undertake these acts of charity because we see those in need through the eyes of faith. Moreover, in the Knights of Columbus, we approach these acts of charity together. Pope Benedict XVI calls this the "practice of love...as a community."

### The Patriot Degree

On February 22, 1900, the first exemplification of this degree was held in New York City. The ritual added patriotism to the three original principles of the Order: charity, unity and fraternity. Any Third Degree member in good standing, one year after the anniversary of his First Degree, was eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree. Currently, any member of the Third Degree in good standing, regardless how long he has been a Knight, may join the



Fourth Degree. The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies. Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third Degree members in the local council to remain in good standing.
