2018 Catholic Services Appeal Report #6

We have some more good news for you this week as we offer this, our sixth report, on our CSA parishioner participation so far. As of last Tuesday, May 29th, we have now received a total of \$102.050.00 in direct donations, credit cards and pledges. So far, we have received 491 positive responses from our parishioners from a parish registration of 3100 families. We have now reached approximately 85% of our goal with 17% of our parishioner participation. A special note of thanks to all of you who have offered your support; but we are still a little over \$18,000 short of our goal. We do need more financial support from more parishioners in order to accomplish this mission for the ongoing ministries of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Once again, in the name of Archbishop Vigneron, and in my own name as well, I want to thank all of you who are participating with us in our 2018 Catholic Services Appeal "Opening Doors to Grow With Christ^{*}"!



Saint of the Week: Saint Norbert

In the 12th century in the French region of Premontre, Saint Norbert founded a religious Order known as the Praemonstratensians or the Norbertines. His founding of the Order was a monumental task: combating rampant heresies—particularly regarding the Blessed Sacrament, revitalizing many of the faithful who had grown indifferent and dissolute, plus effecting peace and reconciliation among enemies.

Norbert entertained no pretensions about his own ability to accomplish this multiple task. Even with the aid of a goodly number of men who joined his Order, he realized that nothing

could be effectively done without God's power. Finding this help especially in devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, he and his Norbertines praised God for success in converting heretics, reconciling numerous enemies, and rebuilding faith in indifferent believers. Many of them lived in central houses during the week and served in parishes on weekends.

Reluctantly, Norbert became archbishop of Magdeburg in central Germany, a territory half pagan and half Christian. In this position he zealously and courageously continued his work for the Church until his death on June 6, 1134.

A different world cannot be built by indifferent people. The same is true in regard to the Church. The indifference of vast numbers of nominal faithful to ecclesiastical authority and essential doctrines of the faith weakens the Church's witness. Unswerving loyalty to the Church and fervent devotion to the Eucharist, as practiced by Norbert, will continue immeasurably toward maintaining the people of God in accord with the heart of Christ.

We Need Greeters


St. Patrick's is known for its welcoming atmosphere and hospitality. We need to extend that welcoming spirit as we enter the church for Mass every weekend.

Reading the Signs of the Times in Southeast Michigan

The Synod participants recognized the many challenges facing the Archdiocese of Detroit. For several decades the number of practicing Catholics has been in steady decline, a significant factor leading to many painful closings and mergings of parishes and schools, which has in turn caused more people to drift away in discouragement or frustration. The number of active priests has also dropped considerably. In the last half century our metro area has suffered from urban blight, economic decline, racial tensions, family breakdown, substance abuse, and crime. The Archdiocese covers a wide range of geographic and demographic settings—inner city, suburban and rural—each with its own unique characteristics and needs. These multiple challenges have contributed to a widespread pessimism regarding the possibility of authentic renewal.

Some might say that the Archdiocese of Detroit is a most unlikely setting for a large-scale revitalization of the Church. But is it not in the most unlikely settings that the Lord loves to show forth his divine power? Our acknowledgement of our own spiritual poverty is precisely what can lead us to rely wholly on God. Then it becomes clear that success belongs to him alone and not to any human ingenuity. If we have become spiritually dry, we need not fear. Dry wood is perfect for being set on fire!

PARISH NURSE MINISTRY KNOW YOUR NUMBERS

What do your blood pressure numbers mean? The only way to know (diagnose) if you have high blood pressure (HBP or hypertension) is to have your blood pressure tested. Understanding your blood pressure numbers is the key to controlling high blood pressure.

Healthy and unhealthy blood pressure ranges



Hypertensive Crisis (Consult your doctor imm	Higher Than 180 and/or nediately)	Higher then 120

Nurses will be taking blood pressures in the hall every month, the second Sunday of the month. There are nurses at the masses and you can ask them to take your blood pressure. There is a blood pressure cuff in the AED box outside the church doors going to the hall. If I can help you with any questions please call me.


