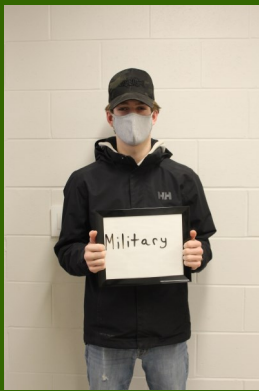

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## *Principal Message*

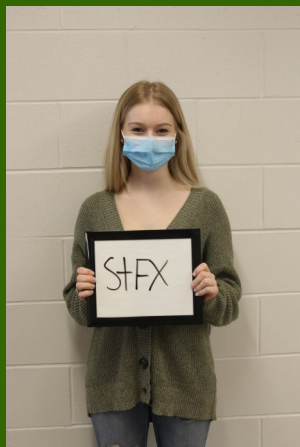
The most important thing a Senior High School student can do to ensure success is to have regular attendance in every one of his/her classes. There are activities and discussions which occur in classes that simply cannot be replicated, there is instruction on high level topics that is never the same as getting the notes from a friend and there are curriculum objectives that can only be achieved through participation. Missing 10% or more of school for any reason – excuse, unexcused, etc. is an indication that a student is academically at risk due to missing too much school. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career. Our attendance policy is that we require a phone call or e-mail from a parent/guardian to excuse a student for any reason, whether it be for an entire or partial school day or for one Period of class. Please help us by communicating a student's absence, or an excused late arrival to school.

### *COURSE CHANGES & DISCONTINUED COURSES*

Course change requests will be considered for legitimate reasons only when class sizes permit. After that, only exceptional cases will be considered. Requests must be made during the first week of classes and decisions are based on academic reasons. (i.e. changing courses to be with friends is not considered legitimate). Courses that are discontinued after the first month of a semester (semester 1: after the end of September and semester 2: after the end of February) will be listed as discontinued on student transcripts. Courses cannot be discontinued by students once the final assessment period has started at the end of the semester.

### *TRANSCRIPTS*

The school maintains a transcript of marks for all students. A copy of this transcript will be made available to each Grade 12 student in the fall and at the end of the year to confirm the accuracy of this record. Students who need copies of their transcripts are asked to contact the Student Services Office during the school year or go on the school website. If student's would like their transcripts forwarded automatically to a post-secondary institution they must sign up in Student Services. Postgraduates can request transcripts from Student Services. All transcripts requested *after* graduation require a fee.

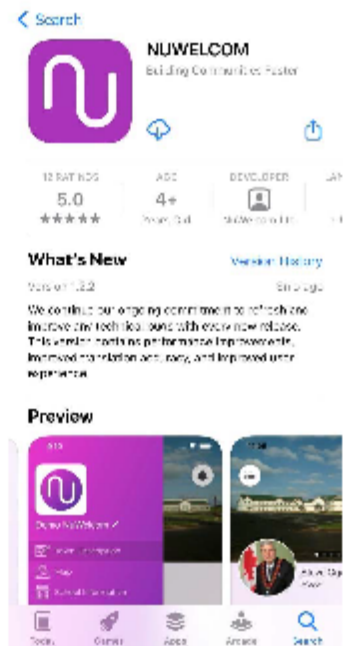
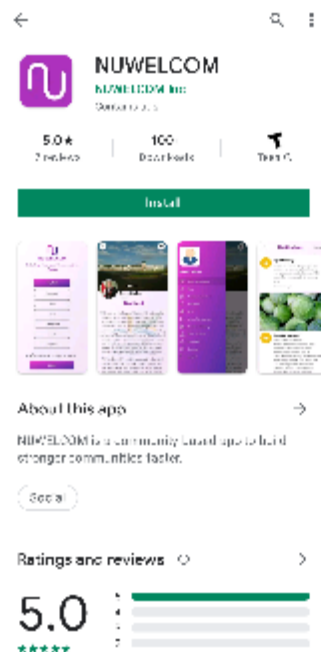
# Public Announcements Through Translations

## NUWELCOM App

We invite you to download the NUWELCOM app, found in the App Store and the Google Play Store for your smart phone or tablet. NUWELCOM is a free app developed in Prince Edward Island that translates local information in real time into 6 languages. Choose your target language to stay up to date on current information.

The NUWELCOM app delivers widely available personalized notifications from government and community sources including school information, waste management reminders, traffic alerts, walk in clinic schedules, police and fire department notices as well as community events, and meetings announcements. These notices are delivered along with interactive maps from the source.

The information provided is translated from English into **French, Arabic, Chinese, Farsi, Vietnamese and Spanish with other languages coming soon.**
