

2019 High School Essay Contest Sponsored by U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit is seeking submissions for its 2019 essay contest.

Students are invited to consider and share their thoughts on the question: "How has the right to freedom of speech established for public school students in the Supreme Court case of Tinker v. Des Moinesevolved in the 50 years since it was decided?"

The contest is open to all students currently in grades 9 through 12 from Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Essays are limited to 1,000 words and must be submitted by April 15, 2019. Students have the opportunity to win one of three cash prizes: first place, \$2,000; second place, \$1,500; and third place, \$1,000.

Winners will be announced in July, and travel will be provided to the court's Constitution Day event in September 2019.



Does Sugar Really Make you Hyper?

Through various experiments over the years, scientists have discovered that no substantial evidence exists to support the claim that sugar causes hyperactivity. Nonetheless, other experiments show that sugar may at least influence behavior. Dr. Tamborlane, a scientist from Yale, reported that children given sugar had higher levels of adrenaline. A possible explanation for this effect is that since sugar is quickly absorbed into the bloodstream, blood sugar rises quickly, which can lead to higher adrenaline levels and thus symptoms similar to those associated with hyperactivity. -Yale Scientific





CFHS Prom 2019

Dear Juniors, Seniors, and Parents,

We are excited that your prom has finally arrived! We hope this will be an occasion that generates many happy memories for you. The event will be held on the 12th of April, 8pm until 12am at *Marina Inn Grande Dunes* in Myrtle Beach. Plan to eat at the prom; we will serve heavy hors d'oeuvres all evening. Please Read All Information Below

Tickets will not be sold to or for any student who owes fees to the school. You can check your fees and make payments online at www.MyPaymentsPlus.com . Payment plans cannot be started until fees are paid. Students are responsible for keeping a copy of their receipt(s) until they receive their prom ticket.

Seniors will be issued one ticket with no charge provided they purchased <u>two</u> tickets for last year's prom, <u>and</u> they were listed as the primary ticket purchaser. <u>If a senior did not attend last year, the senior must</u> <u>purchase a ticket at the weekly rate. In either situation, the senior must purchase a ticket at the weekly price for their guest.</u>

Juniors may purchase 2 tickets at the weekly rate. Per established guidelines, to qualify for a complimentary ticket as a senior, a junior must be the documented primary ticket purchaser of two tickets in their junior year. A junior or senior must meet the eligibility requirements (see back) in order to purchase their ticket(s), and the purchaser must be able to provide proof of eligibility for their guest -- <u>all attendees will be verified.</u> Any tickets purchased under fraudulent terms or conditions can and will be revoked at any time.

No tickets will be sold at the door on prom night.

Payment plans are available; make an early down payment and pay over time! A minimum of \$10 per ticket is required to start a payment plan. No payments less than \$10 will be accepted. We accept cash, checks, and debit/credit cards.

Prom contracts are due at the time of ticket purchase—no exceptions. No contract = no ticket.

Eligibility Requirements:

- ☆ You must submit the name of your guest when you turn in your completed contract. <u>Please note, no changes will be made once your contract has been submitted.</u>
- Tickets may be purchased until the end of lunch on Friday, April 5, 2019. No contracts or early dismissal notes will be accepted after this date.
- All guests must be under 21 years of age, and no students/guests younger than 9th grade will be permitted to attend.
- ☆ The ticket purchaser is responsible for their guest and all behavior thereof.
- Guests must be in good standing with the public school system. Students who have been expelled, are attending Alternative School, etc. are not eligible to attend.
- Homebound, Home-Based, and January Completer students are ineligible for prom ticket purchase; however, they may attend as a guest.
- A You and your guest must have a picture ID to enter the prom. No exceptions will be made.
- You must arrive and sign in with your guest. The guest you bring to prom <u>must</u> match the guest name on your contract. Admission to the prom will be denied to anyone who is not listed on the sales database, <u>there are no exceptions.</u>
- ☆ If you leave the prom, you may not re-enter and your guest <u>must</u> leave with you.
- No Refunds for any payments will be given. -- we must sign a contract based on occupancy.
- Tickets are not released until prom day contractually; you are not authorized to sell, trade, scalp for higher prices, or in any way exchange a ticket.

All prom issues must be handled with Mrs. Perry in C111 before Friday, April 5, 2019.

On prom day, you must attend **at least two blocks** of school for eligibility to attend the prom. 
