What is Early Bird?

- Early Bird runs from April 1st to June 30th each year
- Early Bird is a renewal campaign focused on our current girl and adult members
- Unquie inventives for troops and members who commit to coming back for another year of Girl Scouting
- Allows Troops to begin planning for next year as soon as they are ready
- Allows Council to understand where we have the opporutnity to engage new Girls looking to join Girl Scouts



Early Bird Renewal Patch

- Elimination of \$15 Council
 Service Fee for all renewing Girl
 Members
 - Cost to renew for Girls will be \$25



Early Bird Incentives – Troops

- April 1 April 30
 - 80% Girl Members Renewed
 - \$5 per renewed Volunteer
 - \$50 ACH'd into Troop Account
- May 1 May 31
 - 80% Girl Members Renewed
 - \$5 per renewed Volunteer
 - \$25 ACH'd into Troop Account
- June 1 June 30
 - 80% Girl Members Renewed
 - \$5 per renewed Volunteer

Troop Renewal Best Practices

- It is often easier for the Troop Co Leader(s) to process renewals for the girls and volunteers in their Troop.
 - This limits the back and forth with parents as you ask them to renew their Girl Scouts
 - Allows you to ensure that you will reach the Early Bird Troop incentives
 - Allows you to ensure that all returning girls receive their patch and CSF discount.
- Renewal Payment
 - Product Program proceeds to renew the Girls in your Troop
 - Collect renewal payments directly from parents to process renewals

Bridging

What is Bridging?

Bridging is a beloved Girl Scout tradition that honors girls' achievements throughout the year and celebrates their "crossing the bridge" to the next Girl Scout level. It involves a special ceremony for the whole family to enjoy as you reflect on the past and prepare for all the amazing things to come.

How it works?

 Grade 1 Daisies bridge to Brownies Grade 3 Brownies bridge to Juniors Grade 5 Juniors bridge to Cadettes



Grade 8 Cadettes bridge to Seniors
 Grade 10 Seniors bridge to Ambassadors
 Grade 12 Ambassadors bridge to adults

• Girls from each grade level have one official uniform (sash, vest or tunic) to display badges, pins, insignias and awards. A girl must wear her uniform when she participates in ceremonies or officially represents Girl Scouts at events. Just like any other uniform, badges all have their own place on the uniform. Only GSUSA badges go on the front of the uniform. All others go on the back including fun patches, SWAPS etc.

Place your first Journey awards at the bottom of your vest. As you earn additional awards, work your way up.

If your awards and badges don't fit on the front of your vest or tunic, you can wear them on the back.







- As we discussed earlier, bridging is where a girl moves or bridges to the next level. The patch earned here is an arched shaped badge. It is worn on the new level vest underneath the membership stars. The only time more than one bridging patch is allowed, is on the tan uniform as this uniform is worn by the girl as a Cadette, Senior and Ambassador.
- Third Grade Brownies who bridge to Juniors can also earn their wings. Wings are given when a girl "Fly's Up" to Juniors. The wings are to be worn on the front of the Girl Scout Junior uniform right below the bridging arch and Junior Aide badge. The wings can be moved to other level uniforms moving forward.



• Adults can choose from several different uniform pieces. The insignia, flag, troop numbers etc. are placed in the same place they are on the girl uniform.
