Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts & Meal



On Wednesday, 18 March at 6:30 pm, Assembly 1162 have been invited to participate in the Pre-Sanctified Liturgy and Lenten Meal at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, <u>216 South Parliament Drive, Virginia Beach.</u>

During Lent, the Byzantine Catholic Church, has a special beautiful service: Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts on Wednesday evenings and Friday evenings. The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is the solemn Lenten Vespers with the administration of Holy Communion added to it. This service can be traced back to the Seventh Century AD.

Following the service, a simple Lenten meal, typically beans and rice will be served. There is no cost for the meal, but donations are welcome.

Six years ago, Council 10601 started serving this meal after learning about the terrible plight of Eastern Catholics in Iraq and Syria. This began a series of Lenten solidarity dinners, simple dinners essentially rice and beans, a dinner that refugees in the Middle East typically eat.

OFFICER POSITIONS

We will be forming a Nominating Committee in March to find Sir Knights that want to step up and become an officer in the 4th Degree. The following is a list of positions and what their responsibility is for the Assembly.

Faithful Navigator

The Navigator is responsible for the welfare of the Assembly. He presides over Assembly meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, <u>appoints</u> a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the State and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the Assembly's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Navigator is a member of the Advisory Board.

Faithful Admiral

The Admiral* has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Navigator and the Captain in the execution of their duties and oversees the Assembly in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in Assembly activities. The Admiral is <u>chairman of the admission committee.</u>

*This position is usually held by the Past Faithful Navigator

Faithful Friar

The Friar (*chaplain*) is the spiritual advisor of the Assembly. He is expected to make a report at Assembly meetings on religious matters. The Navigator <u>appoints</u> a priest in accordance with any rules established by the bishop of the diocese to serve as Assembly Friar (*chaplain*).

Faithful Captain

The Captain is second in command. He assists the Navigator with Assembly affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Navigator. Should the Navigator be absent from an Assembly meeting, the Captain will preside. He is <u>chairman of the Assembly's retention committee</u> and also a member of the Advisory Board.

Faithful Pilot

The Pilot is the 'watchdog' for all Assembly property and degree paraphernalia, <u>except</u> the property of the Comptroller, Purser and Scribe. He is also responsible for setting up the Assembly chambers for meetings.

Faithful Scribe

The Scribe is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the Assembly and its correspondence. A copy of the last meeting's minutes is reviewed by the executive at a meeting prior to the Business meeting.

Faithful Comptroller

The Comptroller is an <u>elected</u> position in the Fourth Degree. His main area of responsibility is maintaining all financial and membership records. <u>He alone</u> collects and receives <u>all</u> moneys from <u>all</u> sources, including annual dues from Assembly members. He also handles supply orders for the Assembly officers and members, filing the Report of Officers, and submitting all membership transactions to the Supreme Council.

Faithful Purser

The Purser is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining of records regarding all Assembly funds and accounts. The *Comptroller* turns over all monies collected to the *Purser* and receives a receipt for same. The *Purser* is responsible for depositing all money into the Assembly's accounts and provides the certificate of such monies to the Navigator. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses through a warrant signed by the F.N. and Comptroller.

Faithful Outer/Inner Sentinel

The Sentinels have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The outside Sentinel tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the inside Sentinel checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Faithful Trustees

The board of trustees consists of three members elected by the Assembly and the Navigator who serves as <u>chairman of the board</u>. They oversee the work of the Comptroller and Purser, and with the Captain, serve on the Assembly's retention committee. During Assembly elections, <u>only the three-year trustee is voted on</u>, with the others moving up to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.

Color Corps Commander

The Guard Commander is <u>appointed</u> by the Faithful Navigator to organize and lead the Color Corps for the Assembly and is responsible for the training and deployment of the guard. The F.N. may appoint one or more **Alternate Commander(s)** to assist the Guard Commander.

Equivalent Positions Between Council's and Assembly's

General Membership

The Fourth Degree ritual added patriotism to the three original principles of the Order: charity, unity and fraternity. Any Third Degree member in good standing, is eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree. The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies. Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third Degree members in the local council to remain in good standing.

Organizational Structure

The Fourth Degree was initially started at a National Council meeting in 1899, when it was determined that an additional ceremonial degree was needed that would represent patriotism. The initial Exemplification, as the degree is called, was held on February 22, 1900. It was scheduled to be in the Astor Hotel, however when the class reached in excess of 1,100 candidates, it was moved to the Lenox Lyceum, a temporary wooden structure. Members were originally part of local councils. In 1910 a restructuring of the order separated them and called the groups, Assemblies.

There are more than 1.9 million Knights of Columbus members in more than 14,000 councils. Fewer than 18% of Knights join the Fourth Degree, which is optional. Today there are more than 2,500 Assemblies.

Fourth Degree Structure

Starting at the Supreme level there is the Supreme Master and the Supreme Board of Directors. The next level of the structure is broken into provinces of which there are twenty. Each province is lead by a Vice-Supreme Master. There are currently 15 provinces in the United States, 4 in Canada, 1 in Mexico 1 in the Philippines, and 1 in Korea.

A Master is in charge of a District and is responsible for overseeing the Installation of 4th Degree Assembly Officers, The Renewal of Obligations in January, and holding at least one 4th Degree Exemplification each year.

Also a Master usually has a District Marshall to assist him. The Jewel for the 4th degree officers are suspended from a red, white, and blue ribbon. Each contains the 4th Degree Emblem and title of the Officer's position.

Assemblies are similar to the council, and many are named after patriots, war heroes.

The triad emblem of the Fourth Degree features the Dove, the Cross, and the Globe.



The Dove - classic symbol of the Holy Spirit and Peace - is shown hovering over the orb of the *earth* (*Globe*). Both are mounted on a variation of the *Crusader's Cross* - that which was found on the tunics and capes of the Crusading Knights who battled to regain the Holy Land from the pagans.

Our Honored Order cherishes as its patron Christopher Columbus.

Christopher - Christ Bearer

Columbus - Dove of Peace, symbolizing the Paraclete.

Those Knights currently holding or having held the office of Supreme Master, Vice Supreme Master, District Master or Faithful Navigator will wear a colored patch behind the beret pin in the colors below. Only the current serving Marshal or Color Corps Commander may wear the appropriate colored patch.

Eligibility:

Candidates must be a Third-Degree Knight in good standing. All applications (Form 4) for non-U.S. citizens, must be reviewed by the Master once they are approved by the Assembly. To facilitate the process, you may send an electronic copy, not the original application.

Candidates requiring special arrangements are to be identified when their application is submitted. Special needs include diabetics, candidates in wheel chairs, etc. We will make special arrangements for them to take the Degree, if necessary. The Assembly must escort those with special needs to the antechamber and stay with them until they are ready to be moved into the Exemplification Chamber.

Fees:

The candidate fee is \$70.00. This fee is set by Supreme. This fee includes the social baldric, Fourth Degree Pin, certificate, luncheon ticket, and processing fees. Candidates and SK's will pay their fees to the local Assembly. The Assembly will write a single check to the Master.

Priests:

The cost for Priests is \$60.00. We encourage Assemblies to assume the costs for their Priest candidates. Although Supreme does not charge a fee for Priests, the \$60.00 cost includes the Priest's luncheon ticket, social baldric, Fourth Degree Pin, and certificate.





Fourth Degree Dress Code:

Candidates for the 4th Degree will wear a dark black, grey, or blue suit with a plain white shirt and basic/conservative style tie (no bowties). Both jacket and pants must be dark in color. Brown, green, or other color suits are not authorized. Candidates should not wear any pins on their jacket lapels. The social baldric and PG-113 pin will be provided to candidates during the ceremony. Priests should be dressed in clerical attire. Deacons may wear clerical attire as allowed by diocesan guidelines. <u>Active Duty</u> Military may wear their Class A or dress uniform. Policemen and Firemen may wear their dress uniform. 4th Degree Sir Knights attending the Exemplification as observers should wear the Official Regalia Dress or they may also wear dark black, grey, or blue suit with a plain white shirt and basic/conservative style tie (no bowties). Both jacket and pants must be dark in color. Brown, green, or other color suits are not authorized. The social baldric should be worn under the jacket but in front of the tie. All Sir Knights, observers or color corps members, will wear the Fourth-Degree pin, the PG-113. No other pin will be worn. Policemen and Firemen may wear their dress uniform.

Candidates should be in possession of their 3rd Degree membership cards. All observers attending the Exemplification will need to present current 3rd and 4th Degree membership cards. Honorary and Honorary Life membership cards are not acceptable for admittance to the Exemplification.

Luncheon:

The luncheon will be served at the Church of Ascension 4853 Princess Anne Road, Virginia Beach Virginia 23462. Cost: \$20.00 per Guest ticket. The cost of additional exemplification luncheon tickets is also to be paid to the local Assembly for inclusion on the tally sheet. The luncheon will be buffet style. There will be a program during the luncheon to include the 4th Degree Necrology for the April 2019 to April 2020 year.

Ladies' Program:

Ladies may and are encouraged to attend the ladies' program and exemplification luncheon. Cost for the Ladies program is \$20.00 and the luncheon 20.00 for a total of \$40.00 if attending both program and luncheon.

<u>Ladies' program will be on a separate flyer.</u> The ladies' program has not been finalized and it is requested that any Lady attending the ladies' program and exemplification luncheon and wish to receive updated information on the program provide to the Master's wife her email. Note: The one Assembly check for the entire amount for all candidate fees and additional luncheon tickets, and ladies' program must be made payable to Stephen Paul Raschke Sr., Master, Fourth Degree.

Candidates will be accepted on a "first come, first served" basis. <u>All paperwork must be completed, and a check received from the Assembly before a candidate is added to the list</u>. Assemblies are strongly encouraged to make an early submission and then follow-up with a second submission if there are additional candidates.

<u>Waivers</u>

Picking up candidate packages and escorting candidates to the Degree

They may also wear dark black, grey, or blue suit with a plain white shirt and conservative style tie. Both jacket and pants must be dark in color. Brown, green, or other color suits are not authorized. The social baldric should be worn under the jacket but in front of the tie. All Sir Knights, observers or color corps members, will wear the Fourth-Degree pin, the PG-113. No other pin will be worn. Military, Policemen and Firemen may wear their dress uniform.
- Registering and picking up candidate and participant tickets upon arrival.
- Distributing candidate tickets and luncheon tickets before 11:15 AM on Saturday. Please advise
 your candidates where they can pick up their tickets. Suggest providing candidates with the FN or
 Rep. cell number prior to Exemplification.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS UNIFORM PROGRAM MANAGED BY THE SUPPLY ROOM

The Supply Room is a small Veteran owned business located in Oxford Alabama. We have been in business for over 37 years serving all beaches of our armed forces. Most of the Government agencies who started with us 37 years ago are still our largest customers today. The owner of the Company is a Former Army Officer and I am a Retired Navy E9/CWO, both the owner and I understand specifications, quality control and paying attention to the details. These qualities are what has kept the Supply Room at the top of a highly competitive industry and it will also serve us well as we work toward building a first class Knights of Columbus program.

We took possession of the existing uniforms during the first two or three days of December. Our first step was to measure each and every garment to be sure the size label was accurate before we placed it into stock. By doing this timely and costly evaluation and by asking the right questions when the customers place their orders, we have pretty much eliminated the rejects or returns.

We are now in the process of dyeing fabric and sewing our products and will have most every product on our shelves in the April/May timeframe. Here are the actions we have taken to improve each item:

Blazer We will have two models of the blazer, the traditional fit and what we are calling, our executive fit. Both models will be made from a tried and tested pattern which have been used to make hundreds of thousands of commercial blazers over the years. The fit and style has been battle tested. The Traditional cut is for those who still have a chest and waist in proportion. We will have sizes from 32 XX-Short to 72 X-Long, so we can fit most anyone.

The Executive cut, (Portly) is for those who need a little more coat around the stomach so it can be buttoned. This will allow us to fit you properly over the back and shoulders and still take care of the buttoning issue.

Trousers

We found the trousers to be this biggest problem from the past and we have taken the necessary action to correct this problem. We have also used a tried and tested pattern for the trousers to provide plenty of room in the thigh, seat and leg. We also have added a concealed stretch waistband to provide 2 to 3 inches of ease above and beyond the waist size. If you wear a 34, these pants will fit you even if you are actually a 35 or even 36 inch waist.

Beret

We heard a lot of stories about the beret and how it fit, or didn't fit. Many said it looked like a "beanie" and just sat on the top of the head. Our military experience kicked in and we took the style we make for the Special Forces which would fit properly and allow the drape to extend over the right ear. We removed the lining, trimmed it in a top quality leather and used a fine Australian wool. From the feedback we have received, this has solved the problems. We supplied the Color Guard at the Kellenberg Assembly up in New York State who refused to wear the old style and according to Rob Timmerman, the Color Guard members now love it.

Tie

Not a lot of complaints about the tie other than the Long was not long enough, so we have added an extra long which is 64 inches and should fit the tallest member.

OPTIONAL ITEMS

We were asked if we could offer, as an option, a white shirt, a black oxford and an overcoat. We can, and we have provided prototypes of each for approval.

White Shirt

We will be offering a 100% cotton, no-iron white shirt with exact sleeve lengths. We will stock sizes from a 13" neck and 28" sleeves to a 23" neck and 37" sleeve. This should fit most every need. Shirts are like the blazer's, some need more room in the stomach area and we have addressed this. We will have an executive cut/style for those who need this extra room. We will have these available around April and they will be favorably priced for this quality and features. Once approved, they will be available on our our website, <u>www.kofcuniform.com</u> or toll free number 833-562-4327.

Black Oxford

We will have these shoes ready for sale in late March early April. We have used a top grain cowhide and the inside of the shoe is lined with a soft leather. From the feedback we have received from test wears is, this is one comfortable shoe.

Overcoat

There are some areas in America where an overcoat is needed in the winter time. We have developed a 19 oz., 100% wool, mid-calf coat with a heavy satin lining. The coat will be water resistant as well. The coat will have epaulets on the shoulders for the Baldric to go under and the gold KOC buttons. This coat is currently being test worn and if it is accepted as it it, we will have these available before the winter ends, especially in the northern part of the country.

In summary, we at the Supply Room feel blessed to have been given the responsibility to provide the 4th Degree Knights with a complete uniform with the highest quality in materials and workmanship. We have accepted this challenge and we think we are well on our way to meet all of the objects set before us. Let me assure everyone, we take this seriously and we will work hard to earn the respect and trust of each and every member. You will receive professional and courteous service from the moment you call us. We have a team of skilled ladies accepting your calls and if they cannot answer your questions, they give the call to me. We are also receptive to you comments and/or suggestions as to how we can improve. We must always get any changes approved by the Supreme Headquarters, but trust me, Headquarters wants the best possible program and they are trusting us to get it right. I hope this answers most of your questions, if not, let me know and I will do my best to do so.


