Monday, March 14, 2022

Lecture: "Slave Era Quilts"

In March we welcome **Allyson Allen**. Allyson's quilt journals combine art, craft, research, original design, history, and culture in traditional and contemporary pieces to exemplify a cross-disciplinary approach to quilt making. She combines traditional textiles and fibers with paper, recycled materials, and other objects to create unique, dimensional mixed media pieces, quilts, dolls, and handmade books. The characteristics of her unique, original story quilts are considered information art. Allyson's work often references American history, social issues, African folklore, or Black history. Many of her quilts are created specifically for storytelling presentations. In conjunction with Community Arts Project, Allyson currently has an exhibition of her quilts at Neighborhood Congregational Church, Bridge Hall, 340 St. Ann's Drive, Laguna Beach, open Thursday through Saturday from noon to 3 p.m. until April 24^{th.} Two of her quilts are being displayed at the Laguna Art Museum as well.

Bring your favorite fabrics and scraps, whether it's contemporary, modern, traditional, hand dyes, tonal, batiks or thimbleberries – it looks best when you throw in everything.

We will make enough blocks for a pillow in the workshop, but you may continue to make it into a wall hanging or quilt.

Coming Attractions—Workshop and Program Update:

Spider Web Pillow Supply List

- Sewing Machine with zipper foot (to make a pillow)
- Basic Sewing tools and supplies
- Fabric for Pillow:
 - Use some of those you have been saving and highlight them in your spider web. A mix of Fat Quarters that you may want to use together. (Do not pre-cut into strips)
 - Pillow backing: 22" by width of fabric (with selvages) and a 22" zipper, nylon standard weight also known as a #3 nylon coil
 - Muslin.... for your foundation you will need 4 11" x 11" squares to make a (20x20) pillow.
- 20 x 20" square of batting for the pillow top
- Thread: Colored cotton (anything that you can see when sewn on muslin) used for piecing
- "Recommended: June Tailor's Shape Cut JT-796 Ruler
- **Recommended: June Tallor's Grid Marker (JT-717) for marking your muslin
- "Recommended: O'Lipfa Lip Edge Ruler-S"X24"
- **Recommended: Seams Perfect's "wacker" http://www.piecesbewithyou.com/ alternatively, a 1 Lb. Neon Orange Dead Blow Hammer from Harbor Freight <u>https://www.harborfreight.com/1-lb-neon-orange-dead-blow-</u> hammer- 68980.html
