

SAFE ENVIRONMENT


Here at St. Luke's, we follow the guidelines of the national charter for the Protection of Children and Young People approved by the US Bishops and the policies of the Worcester Diocese in screening those who work with children in our care and in helping victims of abuse find healing. For questions, information or help please contact Cathaleen Peloquin, Victim Assistance Coordinator for the Diocese of Worcester at 508-929-4361 (direct line and confidential voicemail is available).

Safe Environment Class is offered online. It is a one time class for every volunteer at St Luke's. Volunteer sends an email to Cathaleen Peloquin. Her email is: cpeloquin@worcesterdiocese.org

In the email the volunteer must state "I am a volunteer for St Luke's Church in Westboro" and I need safety training. Anyone 14 years and older needs a cori and safety class. Cathaleen will send an email back with a link for "learn upon". You have ten days to complete the training online. Once completed give a copy of certificate to Gloria.

Every five years all volunteers must fill out another cori form. So anyone who was coried in 2014 needs to fill out another form. Please stop by the rectory or the parish center for a cori form. We need a copy of your driver's license too.

If you are a brand new volunteer, please stop by the parish center to fill out cori, code of conduct, and proof of the one time safety training. A certificate is given to all those who complete it. Please give a copy to Gloria.

Since 2006 St. Luke has supported these children at the orphanage in Les Cayes, Haiti. Our contributions allow the students to go to school, have 3 meals a day and get a uniform to wear to school every day!

The orphanage in Les Cayes is run by the Sisters of St Anne and these Sisters, with Sister Judith as the overseer, teach the children. They send us report cards and photos of the children we sponsor. It is wonderful to see them thriving and maturing since we sponsor them until they graduate from the program. This program is life saving for the children and every penny goes to educate, feed and clothe these children who otherwise, would be on the streets! Thank you for your continued generous support of this program.
