# **ABOUT THIS MINISTRY**

Infant Crisis Services provides life-sustaining formula, food and diapers to babies and toddlers in times of crisis...Because no baby should go hungry.

Infant Crisis Services, uses a three-pronged approach: rescue, feed, and connect. Their primary goal is to



make sure that clients leave with a week's worth of diapers, food, and formula. Infant Crisis Service also provides clothing and other items such as toys, books, bottles, and wipes (depending on supply), but feeding and diapering babies is at the core of their mission.

#### **IMPACT**

Your contributions have a lasting effect on the babies and toddlers they serve. Not just today, but in the long term. You are helping to provide them with a healthy start and a better future. Studies show for every one dollar invested in the early years of a child's life, there is about a \$7 to \$17 return on that investment. Currently Infant Crisis Service assists more than 1,200 infants and toddlers per month.

## HISTORY OF INFANT CRISIS SERVICES

Infant Crisis Services began in 1984 as a Sunday school class at Westminister Presbyterian Church tried to discover how they could make a difference in their community. They decided to do something to assist parents that struggled to provide the necessary essentials to their little ones.

There are babies and toddlers who go to bed hungry; it happens every day in Oklahoma. Our state has the 8th highest



incidence of childhood poverty in the U.S. with 1 in 4 babies living in poverty. Infant Crisis Services is bridging the gap for families until they are back on their feet or until they become qualified for government programs such as WIC and DHS.

It's because of the generous community that babies and toddlers go to bed with dry diapers, full tummies, and hope for a brighter future.
