

Tommy started using drugs when he was only eight years old. "I got into crack, cocaine, heroin – anything I could get my hands on," he says. "When I was 10, I started using meth."

His mother sent him to live with his grandmother when he was 15, hoping it would help, but things only got worse. "From the time I was 16, I was in and out of foster homes, group homes, and jails. I quit school, lied, stole and hurt people, and I didn't care," Tommy says. "Then I started making and selling meth and coke, and the

Tommy served a 10-year prison sentence for manufacturing and selling drugs. After his release, he went on a drinking binge. It was then

more I made, the more I wanted it."

his parole officer suggested he come to Rescue Mission of Utica. Tommy decided it was worth a try.

He didn't believe in God when he arrived at our Parker House Aftercare Program, but when he saw the joy of the others in the program, he wanted what they had. "I

started praying for forgiveness and I got baptized," Tommy says. "Now, I pray every morning

and read my Bible, and God

has been showing me the right things to do."

Tommy has now earned his GED and plans to go into Phase 4 of our Aftercare Program, where he'll receive spiritual mentoring while training for work in asbestos removal. "Without the Mission, I'd probably be back on drugs, on the street, in prison or dead," he says. "They've shown me how to get close to God and given me the tools to stay clean."

"I knew if I didn't change my life, I was going to end up back in prison or dead."


In this issue's cover story, you'll hear Tommy's testimony of how our

BECAUSE OF COMPASSIONATE, CARING COMMUNITY FRIENDS, IN 2016 THE RESCUE MISSION OF UTICA:

- Served 147,930 meals to hungry people.
- Provided 3,840 food boxes, representing an additional 69,120 meals (a 32% increase over 2015).
- Provided 46,262 nights of care in all Mission programs.
- Provided 13,726 nights of care to homeless men in the Emergency Shelter which was at or beyond capacity 110% of the time.
- Helped 83% of homeless men in our Shelter find permanent/ transitional housing.
- Provided 18,852 nights of care to 64 unique men and women in our

- Enriched Living Center (mental health outreach).
- Helped 11 students graduate from our Skills for Success Job Training Program.
- Served 638 unique individuals through the Representative Payee Program (money management assistance).
- Provided academic and job skills training to 375 men and women at our Learning Center.
- Witnessed 11 individuals make faith decisions for Christ and 4 rededicate their lives to Christ.
- Witnessed 5 men get baptized.

- Held over 152 chapel services with 1,444 in attendance.
- Held Bible study, devotions and other spiritual enrichment opportunities for over 1,400 individuals.
- Received 8,231 hours of volunteer services, given by 903 individuals.
- Gave 9,621 articles of clothing to 1,733 needy men, women and children.
- Received in-kind donations valued at \$406,236 (not including food donations).
