The latest survey of Church attendance in Scotland has been published. It shows some interesting trends:



Most church-goers attend on a weekly basis, almost half of them attending the same Church for over 20 years, and more people are attending services during the week.

The rate of decline in attendance has slowed significantly, partly due to immigrants and the growth of Pentecostal churches. Some denominations and areas have even seen encouraging signs of growth.

Almost twice the number of people attend church as go to the cinema.

In a secular and consumer culture, the Church has to compete for people's time and loyalty. Sundays offer so many other things to do, and getting continuity in attendance is not easy. However, the Church is also developing new initiatives:

Pioneer Ministries working in areas such as farming communities, the arts, student groups, the inner-city and new housing developments (the last of these initiatives is in East Lothian).

The 'Path of Renewal' initiative, with 40 congregations engaging with today's world in news ways.

This survey was published at Easter, a very timely reminder that the Church is not about statistics, but a person-risen, real, and alive. The future is bright, the future is Christ-shaped.

John's Story

Tim, one of the Bethany volunteers, was asked to spend some time talking with John Rodgers, former Director of Operations and now Director of Income Generation. He has been part of the Bethany story for 30 years. Extracts from his report follow

On the wall in John's office are the words from John 13 which speaks about Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. Washing the feet of those who society may deem less worthy is a theme that runs powerfully through Jon's life.

John still remembers sleeping rough in Princes Street Gardens in Edinburgh with just two bags of possessions. He says 'no-one should have to sleep rough.'

His journey began at Bethany Christian Centre in 1987 and he recalls the compassion shown to him as he fought addiction. He in turn, is now dedicated to helping others who have fallen on hard times. As he says 'Losing a job, relationship breakdown, defaulting on a mortgage—homelessness is now a six week away reality for too many.'

Giving hope to those who feel hopeless remains the fundamental commitment of Bethany Christian trust and John is a walking testimony to that commitment.

<u>Regal - Summer Outing</u>

To find the answer I have arranged for Regal's summer outing to be a private tour of Belhaven Brewery, Dunbar on Thursday, 8th June.

Belhaven – or "Beautiful harbour" – nestles among the rolling barley fields of the beautiful East Lothian coast. For nearly 300 years, they have brewed in the same location using only the finest local barley and hops.

The brewery was established in 1719. It is Scotland's oldest working brewery. With abundant local barley, fine water from the brewery well and access to markets up and down the coast, Belhaven was and, still is, the perfect place for a brewery. Now it also makes many craft beers.

We are being given a special concession rate of £5 per person and this includes sampling many of their beers at the end of the tour - so if you wish to sample some of the beers, please arrange a lift with someone who is TT.

A team of 6 goes up 4 ladies and 2 men. This year we had several new helpers which was nice so that was 30 people involved. Also others were willing but not required. We leave about 6.00pm and are not back until almost midnight. We cook from scratch for health and hygiene reasons, usually mince and potatoes, vegetables, vegetarian pasta, puddings, yoghurt, fresh fruit, tea/coffee, biscuits and sweeties. We also leave food for breakfast as everyone has to leave by 7.30am to go back out onto the streets.

Before Christmas we took up 60 gift bags with new socks, hats etc. toiletries and sweeties. Also warm clothing, sleeping bags and blankets in good condition. These are very much appreciated so many thanks to everyone for their generous donations. A big thank you also to those who quietly give money each time, everyone who volunteers and Anderson the butcher who generously donate the mince.

Please pray for the unfortunate people who would be sleeping rough if it was not for the Care Shelter and Bethany staff who do such a wonderful job.

Janet Anderson is the winner of this year's Community Award. The presentation was made at the Holy Week service at St Andrew Blackadder on Tuesday 11th April.



<u>Bethany</u>

This year Abbey, with help from Dirleton and other churches catered on 5 occasions for the Bethany Care Shelter in various church venues in Edinburgh. Sadly the numbers have increased again this year and we were asked to supply meals for 50. The average number was 47 (many from Eastern Europe) with meals also being taken to people outside. Usually a bus collects people
