

Summer's winding down! Our warmest season ends on September 22 this year, so be sure

to get out with your Corvette and enjoy it while the season lasts.

Our big Spectacular Car Show (Sept 17) is less than 3 weeks away. It will essentially mark the end of Summer. Our members in key positions for this show have been working hard and intensely to make it a great event. It takes over 100 people to pull off a show of this magnitude, so it is easily SCC's biggest undertaking (and largest moneymaker) of the year. Please ask how you can help, if you haven't done so already.

The big Grand Prix – IMSA race weekend at Laguna Seca is also coming soon, with the Corvette Corral all weekend, the Corvette Racing Banquet (Sat, Sept 23), the Corvette parade laps and main race (Sun, Sept 24), and a Hooked-on-Corvettes track day (Mon, Sept 25). This is always a popular series of events for club members, so come on down and check it out.

As we're sneaking up on the last quarter of the year, it's time to be thinking about nominations for three important purposes:

1) Local charities to which you would like

SCC to contribute. Nominations must be written, 150 words max, and submitted to any Board member by Oct 1. Details are located in the 2015 CHARITY DONATION POLICY, available on our website. These nominations were supposed to be submitted by June 1, per the policy, but I am extending that deadline to October 1. Membership voting will occur at the November Business Meeting.

- **2)** Nominations for our 2017 Corvetter of the Year. These nominations must be written, 100 words max, and received by a Board member prior to November 1. Voting by the membership will occur at the December Business Meeting. Details are given in the SCC YEAR-END AWARDS AND POINT STRUCTURE, also on our website.
- **3)** Nominations for the 2018 Board of Directors. You may make nominations at the October or November Business Meetings. The election will occur at the December meeting. Details are contained in the SCC BYLAWS 2014, on our website.

New Race Car

Well, I broke down and bought a race car. I've been struggling for some time with how much "abuse" I'm willing to heap on my C7. It's the common dilemma of trying to do everything with one Corvette. You end up compromising all of the activities.

So eventually I concluded that I really needed a dedicated race car. Although I have never owned one before, this approach appealed to me. I can have a car that is set up specifically for competition, and I don't have to feel bad

about thrashing it. Also, this does give me an option to try out real wheel-to-wheel racing with SCCA or NASA, if I want.

So which race car do I get? I wanted to stay within the Corvette family. A little research revealed that the C5 Zo6 is hands-down the Corvette to base a race car on. But rather than finding a nice one and converting it, I decided to find one that had already been converted.

I eventually found a 2002 Zo6 down in LA that had been fully converted, and had a lot of success on the track. The owner is moving on to another Corvette race car, and put this one up for sale as a Corvette ready to race, "turn-key" as they call it.

Besides being a well-sorted-out car, this one appealed to me because it has a new LS6 engine and a newly rebuilt transmission. Mods and upgrades have been extensive, but some of the key ones include:

- Light-weighted down to ~ 2,900 lbs (even with full roll cage)
- Long-tube headers
- Coil-over suspension
- Big Brake kit
- Forgestar wheels
- Additional cooling (engine oil, transmission fluid, brake ducts)
- Rear wing, front splitter
- Carbon fiber wide-body fenders and bumper
- Fire suppression system
- Cool suit system

Being a bit on the tall side, the first thing I did to the car was to install a custom driver's seat. So I actually fit comfortably inside the cage.

After agreeing to buy it, I had to wait several weeks while the transmission was being rebuilt (long story). When I finally picked up


the car, its first outing was a track day at Buttonwillow. There, after one session, the transmission started making some ugly noises, ending my day.




So now I'm waiting for another transmission to be rebuilt (under warrantee), which I will pick up and install by mid-September. I'm hoping to debut the car down at Laguna Seca at the Corral and the track day in late September. (Meeting the 90 dB sound limit may be challenging.)

In six months, I'll give an update on how it's going.

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



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
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Collins Orton - Competition: Motorsports

Totally Eclipsed Adventure

The great eclipse trip had been a

mongrel science experiment since I first started planning it more than a year ago. Enthusiastic potential attendees appeared and disappeared from the list. Had there not been another of the marvelous Yojack adventures just a couple months earlier, surely there would have been a larger response to my frequent exhortations to see this once in a lifetime event (or twice for a lucky few.)


We ultimately ended up with 11 persons in 7 Corvettes as a diverse group with equally diverse attendance plans. Alphabetically by last name, the attendees were Bob and Donna Courtney, Jack Friedman (a former SCC member) & his friend Linda Munroe, Bruno & Elizabeth Motta of Diablo Valley Corvettes, Rick Riccardi, Greg Selzer, Lowell & Janice Vivian, and me, Steve "the instigator" Wells. Some arrived on the evening of the second day. Some departed early for other SCC events. And a few made the complete adventure, filled with amazing sights. Most impressive of all, for all of us, was the solar corona haloed moon covering the sun, leaving "our" field in Smiths Ferry, Idaho in deep twilight. The crowd of many happy hundreds of instant friends cheered. The planet Venus, visible only as a low sunrise or sunset object, hung impossibly visible near the zenith, looking like an errant Jupiter forsaking midnight for noon. The temperature dropped, warming again as the sun slowly reappeared like a shining diamond on a ring of light.

Along with the eclipse itself, we visited unusual and beautiful places, stayed in delightful accommodations, and had wonderful meals. Sights included beautiful waterfalls: Sahalie, White River, Multnomah, and Latourell Falls; geological wonders: Smith Rock State Park, John Day Fossil Beds, and Hells Canyon; man-made endeavors: Pendleton Woolen Mill, Timberline Lodge, and Tillamook Cheese; and stunning views: the Columbia Gorge Vista overlooks, Cannon Beach, and the lofty redwoods along the Avenue of the Giants.

Especially memorable accommodations included the charming Hartland Inn, The Dalles Inn, the rustic Park Motel, and the Bayview. Marvelous memorable meals appeared at Los Mariachis, the amazingly situated Taprock Northwest Grill, the Pine Tavern Restaurant, the energetic La Laguna Family Mexican Restaurant, and the historic Baldwin Saloon.

We did experience a few downsides. There were many large regional forest fires. Smelly smoke hid enormous Mt. Shasta from our stinging eyes. And the haze covering the Wallowa Mountains (Oregon's Little Switzerland) removed the Mt. Howard tram ride from consideration. But one downside produced an upside. A missed turn produced an hour of some of the most fun driving of the trip—a natural autocross along the scenic Snake River to and from the Hells Canyon Creek Visitor Center. Even the wrong road helped make the trip an unforgettable adventure.


Looking ahead to October, NCCA is hosting a Type V car show at Ledson Winery and Vineyards near Santa Rosa on October 7.


