WORDS FROM PASTOR BAILEY

As I sit and write my article for the February Scroll, I do so while watching all the events for the presidential inauguration. In flipping from channel to channel, the news seems consistent as they echo words of challenge, hope, darkness, promise, uncertainty, and the unprecedented nature of these days. While this is 2021, and the world and our country has faced plenty of uncertainty, the words that are echoed by the news aren't any different than what we hear every four years as we go through the ritual and rites of the presidential inauguration.

Regardless of who is elected, or who recites the oath of office, they take on the challenges of the world. With every challenge, new ideas are brought to life, and those ideas bring hope of a brighter future. Granted the challenges we have faced might be quite different than previous years as we continue to battle Covid-19, we've witnessed an assault on our democracy, the distribution of vaccines seems slow and muddled, and the lack of respect for those of color or those who live in poverty seems to be growing. 


Holy Humor

December 17, 2020

This meeting was held by Zoom due to Covid-19.

Present: Pastor Bailey, Rick Greene, Jane Fruth, Anna Wildman, Janet Zirger, Bonnie Oberlander, Deb Nominee and Linda Ellinger. Absent: Kelly Reis-Kelly and Amy Mills, Kelly Cook

Rick called the meeting to order and declared a quorum.

Secretary's Report: Deb motioned, Jane seconded a motion to approve the secretary's report and the motion passed.

Financial Report: Jane reported that the preschool has had a rough year. Their Budget will come out in coming weeks. Responses to Giving Tuesday have been good.

Old Business:

Spectrum Update: Spectrum needs to run a cable under the driveway – this is to be completed by December 23rd.

Pre-School Phase I Project: Rick spoke with Jeff Homan – the main door has arrived, and the installation should be soon.
