BOLD CHANGE: A SERMON SERIES ON THE BOOK OF ACTS

Beginning with Pentecost Sunday, June 9, I will be preaching about the Holy Spirit's gift of bold change (and bold speech, bold action, bold acceptance, bold love) to the early Church and to us. The gift of bold change is often dropped on us like a can of orange paint that leaves a gigantic splot on the roof of a house! It doesn't always look like good news at first, but if we cover it up too fast, we may miss what the Spirit is up to! If you've never had that happen to you, then come to worship in June and hear the story of Mr. Plumbean and how he deals with just such an orange splot (made when a seagull dropped a can of orange paint on his house; nobody knows why). The transformation of Mr. Plumbean's house and neighborhood mirrors the transformation of the Church in Acts and foreshadows what God has in mind for our individual lives AND our congregation! During worship in June and July, in addition to bold stories, bold singing, bold preaching, bold fellowship, and bold colors, we'll hear from representatives of various community organizations bringing bold change to those in need. The congregation will have opportunities to contribute to all the boldness, visually and prayerfully.

Dorcas Baskets Ministry in the Dominican Republic (Thank You, FMH Deacons!)

Whitewater Valley Presbytery started a partnership with the Iglesia Evangelica Dominicana (IED) Church six years ago in the southwest region of the Dominican Republic (DR). This also supports one of the PC(USA) mission sites as well as Jo Ella Holman, one of our PC(USA) missionaries. Throughout this partnership, we have had numerous people in our presbytery travel to meet and build relationships with the churches in this region.

During our time together, we have learned that one of their biggest needs is educational supplies and curriculum for their children, youth and adults. The southwest region is the poorest area in the country, and many of the churches do not have the financial means or resources to get supplies.

For many years our presbytery wrote Vacation Bible School curriculum in partnership with our brothers and sisters in Mexico (which is on the wwvp.org website). Since this material was already in Spanish, it was clear that we should share it with our new friends in the DR. The name "Dorcas Baskets" came from one of the IED churches who filled baskets with donated items from members and shared them with neighbors in need. We adopted the name and decided to invite churches in our presbytery to put together "Dorcas Baskets" containing craft materials and curriculum for 120 children throughout a week of VBS.

This is the fifth year that our presbytery has run this mission ministry. Every year, when groups travel to the DR to deliver 12 Dorcas Baskets, we hear repeatedly how important these are to the churches. Yes, children can attend VBS without making a craft, but these materials allow children to be creative; to have a hands-on experience with the Biblical story; and to take this craft home and retell the story to their parents.

The Deacons of First Meridian Heights again donated VBS supplies for 120 children. On behalf of the Hispanic Ministry Lead Team of the presbytery and the IED church, we thank you for your support of this ministry!

Our Mission and Outreach Committee has organized a mission trip to beautiful McCreary County, Kentucky, through Christian Appalachian Project. CAP's mission is "Building hope, transforming lives, and sharing Christ's love through service in Appalachia."

As a mission team working with CAP, we'll help fulfill their mission by working on home repair projects for low-income families and elderly persons who have no other means of repairing their homes. CAP provides tools, materials, and leadership at the worksites. You do not have to have any repair/construction experience or skills. Their leaders will train us and make sure we can all contribute to the projects.

We'll arrive Sunday evening, October 13 (dinner on the road). We'll head back home on Friday morning, October 18 (following breakfast). We will stay in one of their volunteer facilities where meals will be provided. We will provide our own transportation to Kentucky (carpooling is encouraged) and to the worksites each morning.

COST: The Mission and Outreach Committee has set the cost per person at \$125 (that includes housing and meals). The actual cost to the church per person is \$325. If you don't need the full \$200 discount provided by the Mission and Outreach budget, please consider paying more than \$125. If you need more than \$200 off per person, please contact Pastor Kim (kim@fmhpc.org) to make arrangements. **A \$25 deposit per person will hold your spot. The remaining \$100 is due on Sunday, August 18.** Please make checks payable to FMHPC and write "Appalachia Trip" in the memo line.
