Prepare – The Promise November 28, 2021



AS WE GATHER

Advent is a season for us to grow in hope. We gather amid a world that in many ways seems hopeless. And right in the middle of it all, there is hope. Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away" (Luke 21:33). By His Word and Sacraments, God establishes our hearts and prepares us for Jesus' coming final restoration. Until that day, we wait, we pray, we hope.






