






Administrators provision users separately for each application



On-Boarding Process

- 2. LEA submits MOU, LEA Participation Form, and WS-Federation Worksheet* (if applicable)
- 3. FLDOE SSO team provides SSO ID and secure file transfer account info to LEA
- 4. LEA prepares their Helpdesk staff and notifies end users to facilitate the transition
- LEA submits Certificate of Readiness and sends user provisioning information

FLDOE-Hosted

- One username and password issued by FLDOE
- Users authenticate with FLDOE to access FLDOE resources

WS-Federation

- One username and password issued by the LEA
- Users authenticate with LEA to access FLDOE resources
 - www.yournetwork.org

FLDOE-Hosted

Requirements

User provisioning information (Identity and Authorization)

Pros

- Access through <u>www.fldoe.org/sso</u>
- Additional software/hardware not required
- Initial end user communication handled by FLDOE SSO

Cons

 End users will have at least 2 sets of credentials (one for FLDOE resources and one for local district resources)









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

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WS-Federation

Requirements

- User provisioning information (Identity and Authorization)
- Maintain current SAML 2.0 compliant federation service, SSL Certificate, and Code Signing Certificate
- Email accounts must be listed in local Active Directory (AD)

Pros

End users will have same set of login credentials as local system

Cons

- AD accounts for all users, all sites
- Limited network access off-site or after hours (i.e. VPNs)
- Long-term commitment to technical resources

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Selecting Key Contacts

LEA Leads

LEA Functional Lead

 Serves as the primary point of contact for policy, process, or approval requirements related to participation in the FLDOE SSO.

LEA Technical Lead

 Serves as the key administrative account user, responsible for user provisioning and, if their LEA has established a trust with FLDOE, managing certificate information.

The same person may not serve both roles.

User Provisioning Planning

User Provisioning Information

- Identity and Authorization information is required regardless of the authentication method selected.
- Variety of submission methods available:
 - Files
 - SFTP, FTPS, or HTTPS
 - PGP encryption (optional)
 - CSV or XML
 - FIM Portal



Delegation Model




Key Points

- LEA Tech Lead can delegate authority to LEA Admins and Location Admins
- Location Admins can assign their users to groups for <u>all</u> apps
- Location Admins can use the FIM Portal to manage users but not send files; files must come from LEA Tech Lead
