**A FEW WORDS FROM CHURCH COUNCIL
PRESIDENT, JUD ALEXANDER...**

A friend once told me the way to get things done is to “plan the work, then work the plan.” Sounds simple, and it is really. The plan with regard to currently being without a senior pastor was defined in January. You may recall, but I will summarize. First, line up Pulpit Supply; second, find and contract with an Intentional Interim Pastor; third, form a call committee and call a new Senior Pastor. We are into our eighth week, and the first step of the plan is working well. We have been blessed with great pulpit supply pastors and that continues. We have enjoyed preaching from Pastors Renee Kowlessar, Curt Pedder, Bill Moberly, and Don Ofsdahl. Looking ahead, we will have Pastors Ron Walter on March 29th, Chuck DeHaven on April 5th, April 12th is TBD, Jan Campbell on April 19th, and Alvin Epperson on April 26th. These visiting pastors have and will continue to be a great blessing to Faith.

The second step in our plan has begun with the appointment of two new committees. The following members have agreed to serve on the committee to find and recommend an Intentional Interim Pastor: Ric Landvatter, Fran Braun, Gail Herbold, and Kelton Lange. The following members have agreed to serve on the committee to find and recommend a new Senior Pastor: Bill Ermel, Dianne Chambers, Fred Blumberg, Kim Kautzsch, Melvin Boelter, Vicki Bierstedt, George Mannel, Sara Edwards, and Cecil Schulze. These committees will begin their work as soon as they receive their instructions from council. Please keep these individuals in your prayers as they take on these important tasks for our congregation.

Ok, so that plan is moving along but that is only one initiative and there are more. The council has also considered and addressed some staffing needs. Job descriptions for Church Administrator and Financial Assistant have been created, approved, and filled. Danny Neumann has accepted the position of Interim Church Administrator, and John Hoff has accepted the position of Interim Financial Assistant. Please pray for them as they begin these jobs in service to our church. In service to God, our church staff and volunteers continue to make Faith Lutheran a place of worship, service, outreach, learning, and fellowship. No ministry of our church has gone lacking as we move forward through this time of transition.

All of our standing committees have been assigned and had first meetings with new members. For those who went off of committees, please remember the task force requested you to attend your committee meeting through April to consider recommendations from the consultant's report. Obviously if anyone wishes to continue in the process of discussion and study of recommendations, then by all means stay engaged with that.
