A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Every holiday has its traditions. Birthdays have cakes. Christmas has trees, poinsettias, and many types of decorations. Easter has baskets, eggs, chocolate, and ... lilies.

If never been a big fan of the Easter Lily. True, they are quite pretty but I find their aroma too strong, strong enough that they trigger my allergies! Give me a tulip over a lily any day of the week!

However, just as there are meanings behind all holiday symbols, so are there meanings behind the Easter Lily. Easter is upon us and so why not pause to learn the symbolism behind the Easter Lily?

There are several theories about Christian symbolism surrounding the Easter Lily. Sometimes the lily is referred to as "white-robed apostles of hope." Their color (white) is a reminder of the purity of Christ. There are many paintings, in which the angel Gabriel is depicted as handing Mary white lilies, which symbolizes her purity as well. The trumpet shape of the Easter lily represents a trumpet sounding the message that Jesus has risen.

The nature in which lilies grow is symbolic of the resurrection as well. From ugly bulbs that are underground for three years (Get it? Will rise on the third day?) or longer, they become beautiful flowers. This process is reminiscent of Jesus's brutal death and holy resurrection. Thus, lilies represent rebirth and hope, just as the resurrection does in the Christian faith.

Lilies are also mentioned several times in the Bible. Some think that it was white lilies that sprouted in the Garden of Eden as Eve's remorseful tears fell to the ground. There are also theories that Easter lilies grew where Jesus's tears and blood fell from the cross, and lilies were supposedly found in the Garden of Gethsemane after the crucifixion, tying them even closer to the Easter holiday.

In Matthew 6:25-29, Jesus says, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the airs; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all of his splendor was dressed like one of these."

And so as Easter Lilies are pretty if we ponder more than their appearance they remind us of something much deeper.

Maundy is the English form of the Latin word meaning commandment. Jesus' new commandment to "love one another even as I have loved you" is the focus of Maundy Thursday.




FOR THE KIDS! Drive –By Easter Egg Hunt Saturday, April 3rd 1-2 pm

- 2) Our Faith UCC reopening plan: The church will look different and we want to provide those details prior to worship. (See opening plan on next 3 pages.)
- 3) **Faith UCC Covid Screening form**: We will need to utilize an on -line screening/registration form for each church sevice attended. (Congregants may also call the church and leave a message to make a worship reservation by 4pm the Wednesday prior to the Sunday service they wish to attend.)

CHURCH REOPENING PLAN POLICY CONSIDERATION

Our congregants and visitors embrace worship as an essential part of life. Gathering for worship is at the heart of what it means to be a community of faith. We establish this plan in preparation to reconvene for in-person worship, while still working to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

SUNDAY WORSHIP PLANS

- 1. MAXIMUM CAPACITY— A maximum capacity for the sanctuary has been established using recommended calculation methods. Only 75 people, which will include church staff and worship leaders will be allowed into the narthex and sanctuary. Calculation for capacity is used to ensure proper social distancing.
- **2. RESERVATION SYSTEM**—-A reservation system will be utilized to cap maximum attendance at each worship service.
 - 1. An on-line reservation system will be used and sent out each Wednesday am. https://forms.gle/FXPwasE4sMxrcTcK7
 - 2. Congregants may also call the church and leave a message to make a worship reservation by 4pm the Wednesday prior to Sunday service they wish to attend.
 - 3. Once maximum capacity is reached, attendees have the following options to participate in worship.
 - -Through live streaming via youtube at home https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCoS4wr4xIyVDTvOakhPAEow
 - -Watching at a later date/time via facebook/youtube/church website
 - -Listen over the phone with live phone streaming 1-855-883-5992 (toll free)

- **3. PRIOR TO RE-OPENING**—All worship materials, hymnals, bibles, pew pads, pencils, envelopes, etc. must be removed from the pews
 - -All materials in the narthex, crayons, coloring books, etc., must be removed -Any bulletin board material must be in a plastic sleeve so it is able to be cleaned.
 - -Coffee Station must be cleared
 - -Only the center aisle will be used, outside aisle doors of narthex will remain closed.
 - -Sanctuary pews must be divided in a checkerboard pattern to create and maintain social distancing
- **4. UPON ARRIVAL FOR WORSHIP SERVICES**—Doors to the church will remain closed and locked until 15 minutes prior to each worship. Masks are required when entering the church, if you do not have one Faith UCC will provide a mask for you. Two hand sanitizing stations are available in the narthex.
 - 1. Gathering outside the church is discouraged.
 - 2. Anyone gathering outside the church is expected to wear masks and social distance.
 - 3. Side Entrance will be used.
 - 4. Congregants will be seated in the sanctuary by an Usher, once seated, Congregants are asked to remain in place throughout the service.
 - 5. There will be no gathering in the church narthex or aisles.
 - 6. Restrooms are available and are single use only.

5. DURING WORSHIP SERVICES

- 1. Masks are always required.
- 2. Congregants are asked to remain in place, and not move about the sanctuary.
- 3. Congregants are to refrain from engaging in handshakes, hugs, or other physical contact with others at the worship service.

- 4. There will be no shared worship materials.
 - i. Technology will replace paper for bulletins and other written material.
 - ii. Projection of prayers and texts on screens will be used.
- 5. Congregational singing will be suspended.
- 6. There will be no use of communal items, such as offering plates, elements plates, etc.
- 7. Stationary baskets will be placed at the entrance to the sanctuary for offerings.
- 8. The Pastor will not greet congregants at the door prior to or after the service.
- 9. Windows will be open for airflow so please dress accordingly.

6. POST WORSHIP SERVICES

- 1. Head usher will conduct the dismissal, controlling the number of people exiting at one time.
- 2. Every effort will be made to control the "cross flow of foot traffic" when leaving
- 3. Social distancing is expected during entering or exiting the building.
- 4. Exit will be the front doors.

7. SANITATION AND HYGIENE

- 1. Hand sanitizer stations will be readily available throughout the building.
- 2. Since we will not have multiple services the sanctuary and narthex will be closed and locked for 3 days to give the virus time to die. The regular cleaning from the Sexton will be sufficient.

This concludes the plan for Phase 1 -Worship Services.

Other phases of re-opening will be announced in the future as needed.



Believing in

Sometimes we get caught up in thinking we need to understand God in order to have faith. But faith is more about trust than knowledge; it's more about believing in someone than believing information. A child, for instance, doesn't have to know the precise roads to Grandma's house; he only needs to believe *in* his parents and their ability and desire to get him there safely. Similarly, we need not understand all the intricacies of how God works; we can take a cue from the disciples and let belief *in* the risen Christ transform and empower us.



In the words of Madeleine L'Engle (*The Rock That Is Higher*): "The disciples did not bother to try to understand the resurrection body. They doubted, and

then they believed. They believed something so wonderful that it changed this broken, fragmented, beaten -down little group of men and women in a moment from depression to enthusiasm, from despair to new life, vibrant and unafraid."



He Arose!



The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center just like Jesus' empty tomb!


