The Year of the Ox (Lunar Year 4719) begins on February 12, 2021 and is the second animal in the Chinese Zodiac. Originating thousands of years ago to celebrate the reawakening of nature, Chinese New Year, also known as Lunar New Year or the Spring Festival, is a time of reunion and thanksgiving. Lunar New Year festivities begin with the new moon on the first day of the New Year and end on the full moon 15 days later.

In Chinese culture, the Ox is a valued animal because of its role in agriculture, positive characteristics, and highly regarded as extremely hardworking and focused. People born the year of the Ox are typically honest, sincere, reliable, and trustworthy. They are also known to be confident but set in their ways, and stern. It was the first contemporary studio picture in more than 25 years to feature an all-Asian cast, and it represents a new chapter in Chu's 10-year career.



Chu most recently served as an executive producer and director on "Home Before Dark," for Apple, which premiered April 3, 2020. The series was inspired by the true story of 11-year-old investigative reporter Hilde Lysiak and stars Jim Sturgess and Brooklyn Prince. Upcoming, Chu helmed his most ambitious project to date, the highly anticipated adaptation of Lin-Manuel Miranda's Tony Award-winning musical "In the Heights" for Warner Bros. Studios.

Chu's previous credits include "Step Up 2: The Streets," "GI. Joe: Retaliation," "Justin Bieber's Never Say Never" and many more representing over 1.3 billion dollars in the worldwide box office. Additionally, his unique storytelling ability has earned him the honor of being on the Hollywood Reporter's Power 100 list as well as Variety's New Hollywood Leaders.

"Growing up in Los Altos Hills, watching the Chinese New Year Parade in San Francisco was a family tradition. That is why I am truly honored to serve as this year's Grand Marshal. As our





community continues to heal in this difficult time, it is more important than ever before to unite in celebrating our culture and heritage, and to support our local businesses. I am looking forward to ringing in a prosperous and hopeful Year of the Ox, and to share our traditions with my own children."
