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(WOODLAWN MEMORIAL PARK, RUBEN SUAREZ and RUBEN SUAREZ) FIRST AMENDED ACCUSATION

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#### **PARTIES**

- 1. Gina Sanchez ("Complainant") brings this First Amended Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Bureau Chief of the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.
- 2. On or about September 5, 2012, the Bureau issued Certificate of Authority License No. COA 645 to Woodlawn Memorial Park ("Respondent Woodlawn"). The Certificate of Authority License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and expired on September 30, 2017, and has not been renewed.
- 3. On or about October 22, 2004, the Bureau issued Cemetery Manager License No. CEM 224 to Ruben Suarez ("Respondent Suarez"). The Cemetery Manager License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and expired on October 31, 2017, and has not been renewed.

## **JURISDICTION**

- 4. This First Amended Accusation is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs ("Director") for the Bureau, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise indicated.
- 5. Code section 118, subdivision (b), provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board, Registrar, or Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.
  - 6. Code section 7686 states that:
    - The bureau may suspend or revoke licenses, after proper notice and hearing to the licensee, if the licensee has been found guilty by the bureau of any of the acts or omissions constituting grounds for disciplinary action. The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, and the bureau shall have all the powers granted therein.

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#### STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Code section 7653.6 states, in pertinent part, that:

A cemetery licensed under this chapter shall at all times employ a licensed cemetery manager to manage, supervise, and direct its operations. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, licensed cemeteries within close geographical proximity of each other may request the bureau to allow a licensed cemetery manager to manage, supervise, and direct the business or profession of more than one facility.

(a) Every cemetery shall designate a licensed cemetery manager to manage the cemetery, and shall report the designation to the bureau within 10 days of the effective date. Any change in the designated manager shall be reported to the bureau within 10 days.

(b) The designated cemetery manager shall be responsible for exercising direct supervision and control over the operations, employees, and agents of the cemetery as is necessary to ensure full compliance with the applicable provisions of this code, the Health and Safety Code, and any regulations adopted thereto. Failure of the designated cemetery manager or the licensed cemetery to exercise that supervision or control shall constitute a ground for disciplinary action. . . .

8. Code section 7653.8, subdivision (a), states that, "[a] person shall not engage in or conduct, or hold himself or herself out as engaging in or conducting, the activities of a cemetery manager without holding a valid, unexpired cemetery manager license issued by the bureau."

9. Code section 7711.1 states, in pertinent part, that:

Unprofessional conduct by any licensee or registrant or by any agent or employee of a licensee or registrant constitutes grounds for disciplinary action. Unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

(a) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of this chapter and any regulation adopted thereunder, or of any federal or state law or regulation governing the disposition of human remains, operation of cemeteries or crematories, the sale of cemetery property, or the sale of crematory services or commodities. . . .

#### **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

- 10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333, states, in pertinent part, that:
  - (a) Every endowment care cemetery shall have cemetery maintenance standards to ensure the property is kept in a condition so as to prevent the cemetery's offensive deterioration. The cemetery maintenance standards shall be in accordance with either subdivision (b) or subdivision (c) of this Section.

(b) Each endowment care cemetery shall perform, at a minimum, the following maintenance on its cemetery property:

(1) Trim or mow grass and prune shrubs and trees in and around the cemetery. Grass shall be trimmed or mowed to a level where flat markers of individual graves can be seen.

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chief, within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notification of the bureau chief's decision in the matter, shall be cause for disciplinary action.

# COST RECOVERY

13. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

## FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct, Failure to Pay Citations)

## Against Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez

- 14. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1, subsection (a), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2385, subdivision (b), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct. The circumstances are as follows:
- 15. From approximately July 2013 through April 2018, Respondents were issued multiple citations, including, but not limited to, Citation Nos. IC 2014 259 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on November 24, 2014), IC 2015 244 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on November 24, 2015), IC 2016 66 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on July 19, 2016), IC 2016 206 (issued to Respondent Suarez on July 19, 2016), IC 2016 324 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on November 30, 2016), IC 2016 228 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on December 28, 2016), IC 2016 349 (issued to Respondent Suarez on December 28, 2016), IC 2017 49 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on May 16, 2017), IC 2017 118 (issued to Respondent Suarez on May 16, 2017), IC 2017 270 (issued to Respondent Woodlawn on January 9, 2018), IC 2017 366 (issued to Respondent Suarez on January 10, 2018). However, Respondents failed to pay Citation Nos. IC 2016 324, IC 2017 270, and IC 2017 366.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Unprofessional Conduct, Cemetery Maintenance Standards)

#### Against Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez

- 16. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1, subsection (a), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333, subsection (a) and (b), on the grounds that Respondents failed to have appropriate maintenance standards to ensure that the property is kept in a condition so as to prevent the cemetery's offensive deterioration and/or failed perform appropriate maintenance on cemetery property. The circumstances are as follows:
- 17. In or around April 2018, July 2018, and October 2018, an investigator from the Bureau visited Woodlawn Memorial Park and observed that the grounds were in a state of severe neglect and/or being kept in a condition that violated Respondents' written cemetery maintenance standards. For example, the grass was brown, much of the cemetery grounds were covered in weeds, many of the cemetery markers were unreadable due to vegetative overgrowth and dirt, and water spigots on the grounds were inoperable when tested. Also, when the investigator confronted Respondent Suarez about the poor condition of the cemetery grounds, Respondent Suarez admitted that the cemetery did not have running water as it had been turned off.
- 18. The Endowment Care Trust Fund that Respondents maintain for Woodlawn Memorial Park is insufficient to cover the current and future maintenance costs on a yearly basis required by California laws and regulations.

# THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct)

#### Against Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez

19. Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1 for unprofessional conduct in that, in or around June 2018, Respondents did not locate the burial records of an individual interred at the cemetery upon request by the individual's family, failed to assist or offer to assist the family to locate the individual's interment site upon

request, and failed to assist or offer to assist the family to determine what happened to the individual's missing headstone.

## FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct, Operating with an Expired License)

## Against Respondent Woodlawn

20. Respondent Woodlawn is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1 on the grounds of unprofessional conduct in that Respondent Woodlawn has been operating as a cemetery with a Certificate of Authority License that expired on September 30, 2017, and has not been renewed.

#### FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlicensed Cemetery Manager)

## Against Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez

- 21. Respondent Woodlawn is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7653.6 for failing to employ a licensed cemetery manager to manage, supervise, and direct its operations and, instead, employing Respondent Suarez as the cemetery manager, whose license has been delinquent since approximately October 31, 2017.
- 22. Respondent Suarez is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7653.8, subdivision (a), for engaging in, conducting, or holding himself out as engaging in or conducting the activities of a cemetery manager without holding a valid, unexpired cemetery manager license issued by the Bureau since approximately October 31, 2017.

#### SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Exercise Direct Supervision and Control)

## **Against Respondent Suarez**

23. Respondent Suarez is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7653.6, subdivision (b), for failing to exercise direct supervision and control over the operations, employees, and agents of the cemetery as is necessary to ensure full compliance with California law and regulations. Complainant refers to and hereby expressly incorporates the allegations within paragraphs 15 and 17 through 20, as though fully set forth herein.

#### SEVENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Unprofessional Conduct, Failure to File Annual Report)

#### Against Respondent Woodlawn

24. Respondent Woodlawn is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1, subsection (a), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2388, subdivision (a), for failing to pay a fine in the amount of \$2,000 that was issued in Citation Number IC 2016 324 on or about November 30, 2016, which resulted from its failure to file an annual report for the calendar year of 2015. Complainant refers to and hereby expressly incorporates the allegations within paragraph 15 as though fully set forth herein.

# **EIGHTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

# (Unprofessional Conduct, Failure to Come into Legal Compliance) Against Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez

25. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7711.1 on the grounds of unprofessional conduct in that, from approximately July 2013 to October 2018, Respondents ignored repeated warnings and requests from the Bureau to bring the cemetery grounds into good order, and failed to properly maintain the grounds in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Complainant refers to and hereby expressly incorporates the allegations within paragraphs 15 and 17 as though fully set forth herein.

# **DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS**

- 26. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondents Woodlawn and Suarez, Complainant alleges that:
- a. On or about November 24, 2014, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2014 259 to Respondent Woodlawn, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to file a report as provided in Code section 9650 and pay a fine in the amount of \$2,000 as provided in California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2388. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- b. On or about November 24, 2015, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2015 244 to Respondent Woodlawn, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to

file a report as provided in Code section 9650 and pay a fine in the amount of \$2,000 as provided in California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2388. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.

- c. On or about July 19, 2016, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2016 66 to Respondent Woodlawn under California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to immediately perform minimum maintenance of its property. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- d. On or about July 19, 2016, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2016 206 to Respondent Suarez under Code section 7653.6, and ordered Respondent Suarez to exercise appropriate supervision and control as necessary in order to ensure compliance with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- e. On or about November 30, 2016, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2016 324 to Respondent Woodlawn, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to file a report as provided in Code section 7612.10 and pay a fine in the amount of \$2,000 as provided in California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2388. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- f. On or about December 28, 2016, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2016 228 to Respondent Woodlawn under Code section 7711.1, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to stop performing dis-interments for relocation and leaving residual human remains on the surface of previous locations. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- g. On or about December 28, 2016, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2016 349 to Respondent Suarez under Code section 7653.6, subdivision (b), and ordered Respondent Suarez to stop performing dis-interments for relocation and leaving residual human remains on the surface of previous locations. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.

- h. On or about May 16, 2017, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2017 49 to Respondent Woodlawn under California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to immediately perform minimum maintenance of its property and pay a fine in the amount of \$1,000. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- i. On or about May 16, 2017, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2017 118 to Respondent Suarez under Code section 7653.6, subdivision (b), and ordered Respondent Suarez to exercise appropriate supervision and control as necessary in order to ensure compliance with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333. The Bureau also ordered Respondent Suarez to pay a fine in the amount of \$250. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
- j. On or about January 9, 2018, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2017 270 to Respondent Woodlawn under Code section 7711.1 and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2333, and ordered Respondent Woodlawn to offer gravesite location services and perform minimum maintenance on the cemetery grounds as required. The Bureau also ordered Respondent Suarez to pay a fine in the amount of \$1,000. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth. The fine has not been paid.
- k. On or about January 10, 2018, the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau issued Citation Number IC 2017 366 to Respondent Suarez under Code section 7653.6, and ordered Respondent Suarez to offer gravesite location services and perform minimum maintenance on the cemetery grounds as required. The Bureau also ordered Respondent Suarez to pay a fine in the amount of \$500. That Citation is now final, non-appealable, and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth. The fine has not been paid.

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## **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- Revoking Certificate of Authority License No. COA 645, issued to Woodlawn Memorial Park, Ruben Suarez;
  - 2. Revoking Cemetery Manager License No. CEM 224, issued to Ruben Suarez;
- 3. Ordering Woodlawn Memorial Park and Ruben Suarez to pay the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,
  - 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
