Why Muslim Giving?

Muslim population globally exceeds 1.6 billion, or 23% of the world population, and represents major communities in over 100 countries around the world.

By 2030, the aggregate Awqaf assets worldwide could rise to \$ 5.3 trillion.

Islamic finance, including Zakat, was estimated at almost \$2tn in 2015 and is expected to surpass \$3tn by 2020. In addition, between \$200bn and \$1tn is spent in the form of charity across the Muslim world annually.

Ending poverty and inequality are some of today's greatest challenges that the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) aim to overcome. Muslim giving including Zakat, is one of the largest but most overlooked forms of wealth transfer to the poor and needy in existence.

Just a quarter of contributions are thought to be disbursed through certified channels. Hence, there is an opportunity to create incentives for organized philanthropy and innovate new giving vehicles and social investment models.

By 2018, it is estimated that Islamic banking assets could reach up to \$ 3.4 trillion.
